## A. Description of Supplies or Services.

a) LMM operates 2100 Lakeside Ave., the emergency shelter for homeless men. Over 400 men are provided shelter, food, and access to personal hygiene every night.

b) MHS, Inc. operates the 140 bed publicly funded emergency shelter for homeless women, located at 2227 Payne Avenue. Women are provided safe shelter, 24/7; meals and personal hygiene; families are linked with appropriate family shelter space in the community.

#### **B.** Estimated Dollar Value, Amendments:

- Lutheran Metropolitan Ministry Increase \$409,423.00 and extending the term by 3 months
- MHS, Inc. Increase \$468,455.00 and extending the term by 5 months.

## B. Rationale Supporting the Use of the Selected Procurement Method

An RFP process was initiated in the beginning of December. The process will not be completed before the end of the current contract period. LMM and MHS, Inc. will not be able to sustain their contract responsibilities without continued funding and operating authority.

#### D. What other available options and/or vendors were evaluated? If none, include the reasons why.

A competitive RFP process was completed in FY 2004 for shelter operations. The current vendors were chosen at that time. At this time we are requesting to amend the current contracts to extend the time and add sufficient funds to allow for time to complete the 2012 RFP process.

## E. What ultimately lead you to this product or service? Why was the recommended vendor selected?

Current vendors were selected through an RFP process in FY 2004. It is imperative that shelter services continue without interruption. The plan to extend the current contracts by amending them is the only way to assure that this critical community services is maintained, and that the providers are authorized to provide the services and be compensated for these services.

# F. Provide an explanation of unacceptable delays in fulfilling the County's need that would be incurred if award was made through a competitive bid.

Without the contract amendments for funds and time, the providers will not be authorized to continue providing the basic emergency shelter services for over 500 single adults/ night. The agencies will have to lay off staff and close the shelters.

# G. Describe what future plans, if any, the County can take to permit competition before any subsequent purchases of the required supplies or services.

The County is in the process of conducting an RFP process which will identify provider(s) to continue emergency shelter services for single homeless adults. The term of the RFP is 3 years. The RFP will not be required to be re-issued until FY 2014. At that time, we will begin the RFP process in June, in order to complete the award prior to the start of the new contract period.

Scope of Work Summary

1) is recommending an award RQ11216 to LiquiForce Services (USA), Inc. in the amount of \$360,460.00 for the Jefferson Drive Lateral Rehabilitation/Reconstruction in the City of Highland Heights. The bids were received on November 30, 2011 and the engineer's estimate was \$1,058,000.00.
