The Division of Children and Family Services is seeking approval for an Alternative Procurement for Evidence-Based Services in an amount not to exceed \$165,000.00, to be awarded off of RFP29004. The time period is from March 1, 2014 to February 28, 2015.

DCFS issued an RFP for Evidence-Based Services. We received 7 proposals from different applicants; each was reviewed by a panel of three to five program staff. The RFP had a mistake in the standard set for the minimum evaluation score. It was inadvertently set at 75 out of 85 possible points; however, it should have been set at 63.75, which would have been 75% of the possible points. Our mistake would have invalidated three proposals submitted, one proposal – Domestic Violence – was invalid, as it did not even meet the minimum. Reviewing all scores, would wish to select the proposals meeting the intended 75% standard (63.75 points).

(3) proposals fell below the minimum score to receive a contract. These were The Cleveland Christian Home, Bellefaire JCB, and FrontLine Services.
