II – REVIEW MINUTES – 11/14/16

Armond Budish motioned to approve the minutes from the November 14, 2016 meeting, as written; Dale Miller seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

III - PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public comment related to the agenda.

IV – CONTRACTS AND AWARDS

A – Tabled Items

BC2016-844

Department of Development, submitting an RFP exemption on RQ38489, which will result in an award recommendation to Bookman Associates, Inc., in the amount not-to-exceed \$33,500.00 for consultant services to assist the cities of Maple Heights and Garfield Heights in revitalizing the Broadway Avenue commercial corridor for the period 11/8/2016 - 5/31/2017. Funding Source: Community Development Block Grant

Mike Chambers, Public Works, presented. Joe Nanni asked if the Department still employs painters. Dale Miller asked if the work would be provided on an as-needed basis, and if so - why the County would not

keep the contract open for longer than a 1-year period. Councilman Miller also inquired whether the contract was a small-business set-aside. Dale Miller motioned to approve; Michael Dever seconded. Item BC2016-871 was unanimously approved.

BC2016-872

Department Of Public Works, recommending an award on RQ36192 and enter into a contract with Aramark Uniform & Career Apparel Group, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$200,000.00 for Employment Uniform Rental services for County Employees in various County Buildings for the period 06/01/2016 - 05/31/2019.
