Primary goal is to finalize the referenced project.

The additional funds as a result of the following (see attachments for further details):

Increases/Decreases - Various increases and decreases of plan items was required to complete the project per the plan intent.

New Items - Rock was encountered at a higher level than was anticipated. There were additional costs for rock excavation associated with the storm sewer installation and the drilled shaft installation. There were costs associated with working in the vicinity of the energized First Energy lines while installing the drilled shafts. Per the utility note in the contract, the lines were to be de-energized, however, during construction, First Energy informed us the lines could not be de-energized and the contractor had to work around the lines. Some of the other new items were required due to adjusting the road profile in order to minimize the impact to the adjacent properties.

<u>Detailed Explanation of various Increased Plan Items</u>

Ref. 2 – Pavement Removed: Driveways had to be cut back further to meet new grade of roadway and assure proper drainage.

- Ref. 3 Walk Removed: To meet the new grade of aprons walk between aprons needed to be at new grade.
- Ref. 80 6" Non-reinforced Concrete Pavement: All drive aprons were placed using non-reinforced concrete pavement. Asphalt concrete for driveways was non-performed.
- Ref. 87 Rock Excavation: Additional rock was encountered and needed to be removed to the place new water main.
- Ref. 124 Rock Excavation: Contractor was working on an accelerated schedule. Areas for footer placement were hammered wider and deeper in an effort to hasten job while at the same time provide an adequate foundation.
- Ref. 125 Epoxy Coated Reinforcing Steel: Additional bridge sidewalk rebar was placed to correct a design deficiency.
- Ref. 128 Class QC1 Concrete Footing: Due to extra width of excavation additional concrete was needed to fill voids.
- Ref. 133 Conc. Misc: Architectural Treatment, Superstructure: To hasten completion of the project concrete walls were placed in lieu of gabion baskets. As a result, additional architectural treatment became necessary.

<u>Detailed Explanation of New Items of Work</u>

- Ref. 176 Adjust Castings Under Traffic: During the final inspection the City of Olmsted Falls requested that castings in the Usher and Mapleway intersections be adjusted, work performed under traffic.
- Ref. 177 Install Modified Drilled Shafts Under Power Lines: Drilled shafts 1, 2, 14, 15 & 16 needed to be modified as they were installed under energized power lines. Hydraulic hammers removed existing rock, re-bar and cast in place concrete placed in holes.
- Ref. 178 Reset Sandstone Pavers @ 25751 Bagley Road: Sandstone paver stones at 25751 Bagley Rd. needed to be re-set due to changes in roadway grade.
- Ref. 179 8" Type 6 Curb: Height of 6" curb adjusted to a height of 8" to reduce any negative impact to surrounding tree lawns.
- Ref. 180 Additional Manhole Depth: Depth of manholes at Sta. 182+52(24.5 Lt.) and Sta. 182+62(32' Lt.) needed to be adjusted to assure proper drainage.
- Ref. 181 Sandstone Retaining Wall: Due to grade of land adjacent to driveway at 25660 Bagley Rd. a new sandstone retaining wall was constructed. Area excavated, 304 base placed, sandstone blocks placed, 457 stone placed behind the wall, split rail placed on top of wall. 76.7 CY of excavation was non-performed.
- Ref. 182 Rock Excavation for Storm Sewer Line: Additional rock encountered while excavating for the storm sewer line on the left side. This rock was not shown on the plans.

The renovation of the existing Snack Shop is being 100% funded by OOD/BSVI at zero \$0.00 dollar cost to Cuyahoga County
