• Reference number 44: Installation of Timber Fence

With the addition of a retaining wall, a permanent fence was to be installed at the top of the wall, due to the height of the wall. The property owner did not want the proposed chain link style fence that was in the plans. The line item for the chain link was non-performed and a timber fence was built in its place.

Reference number 45: Installation of New Galvanized Gate Posts

The entrance to the pump station driveway has a swing gate with two galvanized posts to restrict vehicle access. The fence and posts impacted the construction project and were removed and stored to

be reinstalled later. Both of the posts were bent before the construction project started. New gate post and the existing gate was reinstalled at the end of the project.

Office of the Medical Examiner

The ThermoFisher Scientific, Inc. Q Exactive Focus is a Liquid Chromatograph High Resolution Accurate Mass Spectrometer (LC-HRAM). Within the last three years, Cuyahoga County has experienced an unprecedented drug abuse epidemic including; heroin, fentanyl, cocaine and the extremely potent synthetic designer opioids (e.g., carfentanil), which has resulted in a record number of drug abuse deaths. Currently, the CCMEO/CCRFSL Toxicology Laboratory relies heavily on two LC/MS/MS instruments to analyze the increasing number of specimens for the presence of these drugs. The ThermoFisher Scientific, Inc. Q Exactive Focus HRAM can be used by the laboratory for dual purposes: as a targeted screening tool with a very low false positive output and as a confirmation tool for analytes that have very similar masses. A conventional LC-MS/MS (the existing ones in the laboratory) cannot distinguish between analytes that have very similar masses (e.g. furanyl fentanyl/cyclopentenyl fentanyl or midazolam/alpha-hydroxyalprazolam).

This instrument can replace a significant portion of the current ELISA screening. Having an HRAM would allow the addition of new analytes to the screening panel, unlike the existing ELISA technology, where new analytes can only be added if the supporting company (e.g. Immunalysis) has developed a kit for it. The instrument will allow for faster turnaround time and a wider scope of analysis for the emerging novel psychoactive substances (NPS) such as carfentanil, synthetic cannabinoids, and designer benzodiazepines, etc.

The various options have been explored, and the decision was made based on a comparison of a traditional time-of-flight (TOF) to the ion trap mass analyzer (Orbitrap). Based on experienced users' recommendation and peer-reviewed publications, it was determined to pursue purchasing the ion trap mass analyzer. Different vendors with competitive technology such as time-of-flight (TOF) were considered such as Agilent, AB Sciex and Shimadzu. This will be used in the Medical Examiner's Toxicology Laboratory.
