Advocacy</li> <li>Help them understand the scope of the work we do</li> <li>Developing relationships</li> <li>Councilwoman asked, "How do you balance the work with the numbers going up?"</li> <li>Around 50% of the Frontline workers have less than 3 years of experience we need to stabilize our workforce</li> <li>Christin Farmer asked; How do systems work with our system? What causes parents to abuse and neglect their children? Education/unemployment rates are all stressing families. May have a family history of abuse and neglect. Gives them opportunity to advance for more training and educational programs and resources for our community</li> </ul>
