II – REVIEW MINUTES – 12/2/2019

Michael Chambers motioned to approve the minutes from the December 2, 2019 meeting; Nan Baker seconded. The minutes were approved by unanimous vote as written.

B. - New Items for Review

BC2019-906

Department of Public Works, submitting an amendment (Subsidiary No. 2) to Contract No. CE1800324 with Cook Paving and Construction Co. for resurfacing of North Main Street from the Chagrin Falls Township South Corporation Line to Falls Road in Chagrin Falls Township in connection with the 2018 Operations Resurfacing Program for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$43,352.82; recommending to accept construction as complete and in accordance with plans and specifications; requesting authority for the County Treasurer to release the escrow account, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 153.63.

David Marquard, Department of Public Works, presented. There were no questions. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2019-906 was unanimously approved.

Department of Development, submitting an amendment to Agreement No. AG1900106 with Cleveland State University for economic research and advice services in connection with the 5-year Economic Development Plan for the period 2/25/2019 – 12/31/2019 to extend the time period to 6/30/2020 and for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$65,000.00.

Paul Herdeg, Department of Development and David Merriman, Department of Health and Human Services, presented. Kahlil Seren asked if this service, as it relates to the 5-year Economic Development Plan, will be ongoing after 6/30/2020 and asked if the department will be releasing a Request for Proposals in the future. Nan Baker asked for clarification on the funding source and asked if the \$40,000.00 paid from the Health and Human Services Administrative Fund Support is all for administrative support services and if this fund can be considered the Health and Human Services Levy Fund; and asked if current skill up services are paid from the Health and Human Services Levy Fund. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2019-907 was unanimously approved, as amended.

Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; Nan Baker seconded. Item BC2019-908 was unanimously approved.

Chris Alexander, Cuyahoga Job and Family Services, presented. Nan Baker thanked Ms. Alexander for her comprehensive presentation. Kahlil Seren asked if a Request for Proposals will be issued for this service in the future. Nan Baker asked if this provider could be considered sole source as the Children's Hospital Medical Center is the only hospital in the urban area of the County that provides poison control services. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; Nan Baker seconded. Item BC2019-912 was unanimously approved.

Alison Bilak, Sheriff's Department, presented. There were no questions. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2019-913 was unanimously approved.

Office of the Medical Examiner, recommending to amend Board Approval No. BC2019-95 dated 2/4/2019, which authorized an alternative procurement process, and resulted in award recommendations to Promega and Life Technologies in the total amount not to exceed \$276,257.00 to procure genetic testing kits and other consumable supplies for the period 1/1/2019 - 12/31/2020, to extend the time period to 12/31/2022 and for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$577,848.00.

Hugh Shannon, Office of the Medical Examiner, presented. Kahlil Seren asked if the parent company of the primary providers undercut the distributors for these purchases and if the distributors only exist in areas where there are location requirements. Lenora Lockett asked for confirmation that this extension of time is for a 2-year period and if the requested amount is due to increased services. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2019-914 was unanimously approved.

D. – Consent Agenda

James Boyle referred to Item No. BC2019-916, Proposed Purchases, Direct Open Market Purchases, on Requisition No. SH-19-47461 for a legal notice for Delinquent Land Sale #125 for the Sheriff's Department in the amount of \$18,009.75. Mr. Boyle acknowledged the legal posting requirements for the notice of the Delinquent Land Sale and stated that publishing in the Daily Legal News or the Plain Dealer may not provide adequate circulation and asked if the Courts have weighed in on this issue. Jonathan McGory, Department of Law, stated that he is not aware of any recent changes to the law and agreed that there may be a better way to publish and said that he will research and provide a response to the Board members. Michael Chambers said that a print publication may be required by the Ohio Revised Code. Nan Baker said that her recollection was that the State requires multiple publications, with a full description for the first notice, a condensed notice that follows and an on-line option. There were no further questions or comments on the consent items. Michael Chambers motioned to approve BC2019-915 through -916; James Boyle seconded, the consent items were unanimously approved.
