II - REVIEW MINUTES - 8/31/2020

Michael Chambers motioned to approve the minutes from the August 31, 2020 meeting; Nichole English seconded. The minutes were approved by unanimous vote, as written.

BC2020-508

Nichole English, Department of Public Works, presented. There were no questions. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; Dale Miller seconded. Item BC2020-508 was approved by unanimous vote.

Jeanelle Greene, Department of Information Technology, presented. Dale Miller asked how it is determined and by whom that the Health and Human Services funding allocation be split with 46% to Health and Human Services Levy Fund and 54% Federal Fund; and asked for a follow up response to the Board members on this question. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; Dale Miller seconded. Item BC2020-509 was approved by unanimous vote.

### BC2020-510

Department of Information Technology, submitting an amendment to Contract No. CE1800132 with Main Sail, LLC for staff augmentation services for the Enterprise Resource Planning Project for the period 9/17/2018 – 8/31/2020 for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$68,000.00.

Funding Source: General Fund – ERP

Jeanelle Greene, Department of Information Technology, presented. Nan Baker asked for confirmation if these services are covered under the original Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) Project budget or is this an additional expense; asked if this expense is being paid from the Contingency Fund; asked if the department anticipates a financial shortfall for any additional services that may be necessary; and asked for clarification on the backup materials related to the ERP budget.

Dale Miller asked what additional services are included in this amendment that were not part of the original project budget; and asked for confirmation that the implementation required additional hours of contract services but not additional staff.

James Boyle asked who were the two employees covered under this amendment, where are they working now and are either still involved with the project; asked for confirmation that one of the two employees identified is now a County employee and asked if the position had been posted and candidates interviewed.

Dale Miller commented that it has been difficult to fill technical positions in the Department of Information Technology with County employees and believes the Main Sail consultants provide a positive opportunity to fill vacancies, due to their project knowledge and experience. Mr. Boyle concurred with Mr. Miller's comment.

Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2020-510 was approved by unanimous vote.

### BC2020-511

Paul Porter, Division of Senior and Adult Services, on behalf of Cuyahoga Job and Family Services, presented. There were no questions. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; Nan Baker seconded. Item BC2020-511 was approved by unanimous vote.

Greg Huth, Department of Law, presented. Nan Baker asked if there is a better alternative to process the payment for services given the dates of services; and asked why the request is being submitted as it does not exceed the \$5,000.00 threshold requiring Board of Control approval. Lenora Lockett stated that the services have already been authorized, therefore, the Board of Control must approve, even though the amount is below the \$5,000.00 threshold. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; James Boyle seconded. Item BC2020-512 was approved by unanimous vote.

James Boyle asked if the decision to relocate is due to the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force having outgrown the existing lease space or if they are trying to reduce the costs. Michael Chambers motioned to approve the item; Nan Baker seconded. Item BC2020-513 was approved by unanimous vote.
