Jacqueline Fletcher, Armond Budish, David Merriman, a representative from the sheriff's office and Bill Mason made comments and took questions A Sheriff's Deputy is present at the Jane Edna Building 24/7, safety measures have been added, DCFS implemented protocols when children are present in the building, DCFS continues to engage children



Lakecia Wild and Gabriella Celeste will follow up on Child Protection Teams and Emergency Child Care	in activities outside the building, including Families First Village, the Children's Advocacy Center, and visits to the zoo, local beaches, etc DCFS is working with the state Rapid Response Team Currently there are 3 children in the building – 1 has a placement Wednesday; 2 arrived over the weekend & 1 early this morning There are approximately 72 contracted/emg providers currently Bill Mason has not yet scheduled another summit meeting Child Protection Teams – DCFS is looking into the next steps Emergency Shelter Care – The no eject/no reject policy is critical to the emergency shelter care proposal The Rapid Response Team from the state will tour Metzenbaum August 2, 2022 Jen Croessmann – update on Safe Sleep Training – the videos provided by Angela Newman from the Co. BOH were helpful. The following access points are under review: Video links will be posted for parents, foster parents and kinship parents to view on the Just In Time Training site Cuyahoga County Just in Time Training Home (jitcuyahoga.org) The link will be added to the safe sleep checklist as a requirement to view the videos for all infant caregivers. Staff doing kinship assessments will email a link to the videos to kin caregivers at the time of the assessment when considering approval to care for an infant DCFS will email links to the foster parent trainers and network providers DCFS will add the links to our public website
