WHEREAS, Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of Cuyahoga County provides that "Proposed amendments to this Charter shall be submitted to the electors of the County in the manner provided for by the Ohio Constitution"; and

WHEREAS, Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution provides that the "legislative authority... of any county may by a two-thirds vote of its members" submit by resolution charter amendments to the electors of the county "to be voted upon at the first general election occurring not sooner than sixty days after their submission"; and

WHEREAS, this Council believes it is in the best interest of the citizens of the County of Cuyahoga to amend the County Charter to rename the "Human Resource Commission" the "Personnel Review Commission," to change the appointing authority, to clarify the Personnel Review Commission's administrative powers and duties, and to formally establish an office of the Director of Human Resources.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XII, Sections 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby authorizes and directs that there shall be submitted to a vote of qualified electors of the County of Cuyahoga, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the question of amending Article II, Sections 2.03(12) and Article IX, Sections 9.01 through 9.05 and to add Section 9.06 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, the respective text to be as set forth herein, with boldfaced text being added and crossed out text being deleted as follows:

#### SECTION 2.03 POWERS AND DUTIES.

(12) To conduct collective bargaining regarding wages and compensatory benefits—with any recognized employee bargaining unit—in conjunction with the Human Resource Commission, and, administer uniform personnel procedures for all County employees, and to provide quarterly reports to the Personnel Review Commission regarding the County's collective bargaining strategies and approved contracts.

### SECTION 9.01 HUMAN RESOURCE COMMISSIONPERSONNEL REVIEW COMMISSION.

There shall be a Personnel Review Commission. The County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Council, Council shall appoint the members of the Personnel Review Commissiona Human Resource Commission, consisting of three electors of the County having experience in personnel matters or personnel administration and who are supportive of equal opportunity considerations. No more than two of the three members of the Personnel Review CommissionHuman Resource Commission shall be members of the same political party. The Personnel Review Commission is authorized to employ persons in the service of the County. The **Personnel Review** CommissionHuman Resource Commission shall be responsible for administering, for and in cooperation with the officers, agencies, boards and commissions of the County, an efficient and economical system for the employment of persons in the public service of the County according to merit and fitness. The County's human resources policies and systems, including ethics policies for County employees, shall be established by ordinance and shall be administered in such manner as will eliminate unnecessary expense and duplication of effort, while ensuring that persons will be employed in the public service without discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, sexual orientation, disability, age or ancestry. The Personnel Review Commission shall submit a recommendation regarding any ordinance concerning County personnel policies prior to passage by County Council. In the event the Personnel Review Commission does not endorse an ordinance, the Personnel Review Commission may provide a Statement of Non-Endorsement to the County Council.

The term of office of each member of the **Personnel Review Commission**Human Resource Commission shall be six years. The terms shall be staggered so that no term expires within less than two years of the expiration of any other term. The **County Executive** Council shall fill a vacancy occurring for an unexpired term in the same manner as a regular appointment.

Of the terms of office for the initial appointees, one shall be appointed for a term of six years, one shall be appointed for a term of four years and one shall be appointed for a term of two years. The County Executive shall nominate the initial appointees to the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission not later than March 1, 2011 and thereafter within thirty days after the occurrence of a vacancy. The current members of the Personnel Review Commission at the time of the adoption of this charter amendment shall serve until their existing term expires and may be subject to be reappointed by Council.

No member of the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall hold any other public office or public employment with the County. The Council shall

establish a per diem compensation for the members of the **Personnel Review** CommissionHuman Resource Commission.

The County Executive Council may remove any member of the Personnel Review Commission Human Resource Commission for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office after notice and public hearing before the Council, provided that eight two-thirds of the members of the Council concur.

## SECTION 9.02 AUTHORITY OF HUMAN RESOURCE COMMISSIONPERSONNEL REVIEW COMMISSION.

The **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall have:

- (1) Responsibility for the resolution or disposition of all personnel matters, with authority to appoint hearing officers to hear all employee appeals previously under the jurisdiction of the State Personnel Board of Review, including those of classified employees who work for the County Executive, Prosecuting Attorney, County Planning Commission, and the County Public Defender;
- (2) Responsibility for administration of countywide-compliance with federal and state laws regarding personnel matters within the County Executive's organization and departments which the County is the reporting unit and for maintenance of records required by such laws;
- (3) For the County Executive's organization and departments, authority to ensure:
  - Pay equity for like positions;
  - Standardization of benefits;
  - Approval of qualifications;
  - Consistent discipline;
  - Training of management in personnel practices;
  - Training of employees in job functions;
  - Training for total quality management;
  - Consistent administration of performance management system;
  - Coordination of recruitment;
  - Compliance with ethics resolutions or ordinances as passed by the Council;
- (4) Responsibility for creation of rules and policies related to the Personnel Review Commission's authority set forth in this Charter;
- (45) Such other functions as may be deemed necessary by the Council for the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission to carry out its mission and purpose.

#### SECTION 9.03 CLASSIFICATION.

The **Personnel Review Commission**Human Resource Commission shall administer a clear, countywide classification and salary administration system for technical, specialist, administrative and clerical functions with a limited number of broad pay ranges within each classification. The classification system shall include the employees of the offices listed in Article V of this Charter, as well as those of the County Executive and County Council except those employees in positions designated as unclassified by general law. The classification system shall, to the extent permitted by the Ohio Constitution, include

the **classified** employees of all offices, officers, agencies, departments, boards, commissions or other public bodies, other than separate political subdivisions, that are supported in whole or in part from taxes levied, or other financial assistance provided, by the County.

#### SECTION 9.04 APPOINTING AUTHORITIES.

The County Executive and the officers, offices, agencies, departments, boards and commissions and other public bodies, who under this Charter or under general law are authorized to employ persons in the service of the County, shall be appointing authorities. Persons interested in employment with the County shall make application to the Department of Human Resources. No appointing authority shall appoint a person to fill a vacancy in the classified service who does not meet the qualifications for that position approved by the **Personnel Review Commission**Human Resource Commission. All Appointing Authorities shall strive in making appointments in both the classified and the unclassified service to ensure that the diversity of the population of the County is reflected in the persons who are employed by the County.

#### SECTION 9.05 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES.

There shall be a Department of Human Resources, which shall, as part of its duties, serve under the direction of andperform such functions on behalf of the Personnel Review CommissionHuman Resource Commission as the Commission shall delegate prescribe. The Department of Human Resources shall provide regular reports to the Personnel Review Commission regarding the Department's performance of such delegated functions in accordance with timeframes established by the Personnel Review Commission.

## SECTION 9.06 DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RESOURCES: POWERS, DUTIES AND QUALIFICATIONS.

The Director of Human Resources shall be appointed by the Executive, subject to confirmation by Council, and shall serve at the pleasure of the County Executive. The Director of Human Resources shall manage County employment matters including hiring, firing, discipline, layoffs, training, benefits, time and attendance, HR compliance, and drafting policies and procedures. The Director shall be responsible for offering support to the law department on all labor and employment matters. The Director of Human Resources shall have a minimum of five years of experience advising or working in the public sector, experience in employment related matters, management experience or related relevant experience.

**SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution, and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby directs that the proposed amendment of Article II, Sections 2.03(12) and Article IX, Sections 9.01 through 9.05 and to add Section 9.06 shall be submitted to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be as follows:

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CHARTER

Shall Article II, Section 2.03(12) Powers and Duties, and Article IX of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga be amended to rename the "Human Resource Commission" the "Personnel Review Commission," to provide that the County Council shall have the authority to appoint and remove members of the Personnel Review Commission, to clarify the Personnel Review Commission's administrative powers and duties, and to formally establish an office of the Director of Human Resources?

**SECTION 3.** If the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, the existing provisions of Article II, Section 2.03(12) and Article IX, Sections 9.01 through 9.05 and the addition of 9.06 which are inconsistent herewith, shall be and the same are hereby repealed effective as of the date on which such amendment becomes effective.

**SECTION 4.** The Clerk of this Council is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections no earlier than one hundred twenty (120) days and not later than sixty (60) days before the November 5, 2013 election. The Clerk is further directed to take all other actions required by law relative to the submission of said amendment for said election, including, if required by law, mailing or otherwise distributing a copy of said proposed amendment to each of the electors of the County as far as may be reasonably possible prior to thirty (30) days before said election.

**SECTION 5.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective to enable the Clerk of Council to perform her duties in time for the amendments to be properly placed on the November 5, 2013 election. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight (8) members of Council, it shall become immediately effective.

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby authorizes and directs that there shall be submitted to a vote of qualified electors of the County of Cuyahoga, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the question of amending Article II, Sections 2.03(2) of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, the respective text to be as set forth herein, with boldfaced text being added and crossed out text being deleted as follows:

#### SECTION 2.03 POWERS AND DUTIES.

(2) To appoint, subject to the confirmation by the Council, and remove County directors and officers and members of boards, agencies, commissions and authorities as are or may hereafter be created by or pursuant to this Charter, and such officers and members of boards, agencies, commissions and authorities as are provided by general law to be appointed by boards of county commissioners. If the Council shall fail to act on the question of such an appointment by the County Executive within thirty-sixty days of the date that the County Executive submits such appointment to the Council for its

### SECTION 6.02 BOARD OF REVISION.

There shall be one or more Boards of Revision, each consisting of three electors of the County. Two members of each board, who shall not be of the same political party, shall be appointed by the Council, and one member shall be appointed by the County

Executive, each for a term of three years. Each Board of Revision shall exercise all duties of a county board of revision as prescribed by general law. The Council may provide for compensation for members of a Board of Revision.

- (1) The County shall have a single Board of Revision, consisting of three members, which shall perform all powers and duties of county boards of revision under general law and such other powers and duties not inconsistent therewith as provided herein or by ordinance. As of the effective date of this provision, the Board shall consist of the County Executive, one appointee of the Council President, and, at the choice of the County Executive, either the Fiscal Officer or Treasurer.
  - (a) At the choice of the Council President, the Council President's appointee may either be a member of Council or any other elector of the County. The term of the Council President's first appointee shall be from the effective date of this provision until January 4, 2016. The term of subsequent appointees shall be for a period of two years commencing on the fifth day of January and every two years thereafter.
  - (b) If a vacancy occurs in the Council President's appointee position, the Council President shall appoint a new member to complete the unexpired term.
  - (c) The Council President's appointee shall not belong to the same political party as the County Executive at the time of the appointment.
- (2) The Board shall elect a chairperson, a secretary, and other officers as it deems appropriate at its organizational meetings.
- (3) The Board shall have the power to set the hearing schedule for matters before it, and to make and amend its own internal operating rules, procedures, and regulations.
- (4) The Board may employ administrative staff, including an administrator, as it deems necessary, to assist it in the performance of its powers and duties. All employees of the Board shall be unclassified employees.
- (5) The Board shall employ or otherwise engage individuals to serve on one or more three-member hearing panels to hear complaints as to the value of real property and to perform other duties assigned to them by the Board. The individuals serving on hearing panels shall be electors of the County; shall serve at the pleasure of the Board; and shall abide by the Board's hearing schedule, rules, procedures, and regulations in performing their duties.
- (6) The Board shall establish merit qualifications for the individuals serving on hearing panels as it deems necessary for them to perform their duties. In establishing the merit qualifications, the Board shall strive to employ or otherwise engage highly qualified individuals to elevate the citizens' trust in the system.

- (7) The Board may not itself hear complaints related to the valuation of real property, and no member of the Board may serve on any of the hearing panels. The decisions of the hearing panels relating to real property valuation complaints shall constitute the final decisions of the Board and shall not be subject to further review by the Board itself.
- (8) No member of the Board or any of the hearing panels may have any ex parte communications with any party, elected officials, county employees, or any other person regarding the merits of a pending matter before the panel. The Board shall enact and publish additional rules, procedures, or regulations to ensure that the system is administered fairly, including rules, procedures, or regulations governing conflicts of interest.
- (9) The Board may utilize any boards of revision or hearing panels in existence as of the effective date of this provision as hearing panels to avoid any interruption of services.

In the event no designee of the County Executive has been confirmed prior to the office of the County Executive becoming vacant, the President of Council shall succeed to the office of County Executive on an interim basis. If a vacancy occurs more than thirty (30) days prior to the filing deadline for the primary for the countywide general election held during the second year of a fouryear term, the interim succession shall be for a period until the end of the calendar year following that same countywide general election, at which election the position shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term. Otherwise, the interim succession shall extend for the remainder of the four-year term. in the first or second year of a four year term, the interim succession shall be for a period until the next countywide general election, at which time the position shall be filled for the remainder of the principal term. If a vacancy occurs in the third or fourth year of a four-year term, the interim succession shall extend until the next countywide general election, at which time the position shall be filled for the next four year term. The interim succession of the President of Council to the office of County Executive as provided herein shall create a vacancy in the membership of County Council and in the position of President of Council. Upon the occurrence of a vacancy in the position of President of Council, the Vice-President of Council shall assume the position of President, and the Council shall elect a member to serve as Vice-President. WHEREAS, Article XII, Section 12.09 of the Charter of Cuyahoga County provides that "The Charter Review Commission may propose to the Council such amendments to this Charter as it shall deem appropriate" and "Council shall vote within sixty days after the proposals are received on whether or not to submit the proposals to the electors at the next general election held more than sixty days after its vote on the proposed amendments"; and

WHEREAS, Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of Cuyahoga County provides that "Proposed amendments to this Charter shall be submitted to the electors of the County in the manner provided for by the Ohio Constitution"; and

WHEREAS, Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution provides that the "legislative authority" "of any county may by a two-thirds vote of its members" submit by resolution charter amendments to the electors of the county "to be voted upon at the first general election occurring not sooner than sixty days after their submission"; and

WHEREAS, this Council believes it is in the best interest of the citizens of the County of Cuyahoga to amend the County Charter to insure the continuation of the Inspector General's Office by establishing the Agency of the Inspector General in the Charter.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XII, Sections 12.09 and 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby authorizes and directs that there shall be submitted to a vote of qualified electors of the County of Cuyahoga, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the question of adding Article XIV, Section 14.01 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, the respective text to be as set forth herein, with boldfaced text being added and crossed out text being deleted as follows:

#### SECTION 14.01 AGENCY OF INSPECTOR GENERAL.

The County's Agency of Inspector General shall serve as the County's chief ethics officer and shall have all powers and duties to investigate fraud, corruption, waste, abuse, misfeasance, malfeasance, and nonfeasance, including the power and duties to investigate all county contracts, without interruption from any other public official or employee. The Inspector General shall have the independent power to issue subpoenas and to conduct sworn examinations and depositions as necessary for the Agency to conduct its functions. The Inspector General shall appoint a Deputy Inspector General who shall serve at the pleasure of the Inspector General.

- (1) Initial Term, Appointment, Term, and Removal of the Inspector General.
  - (a) The initial term of the incumbent Inspector General shall continue until June 30, 2016, and the incumbent Inspector General shall have the right to continue to serve as the County's first Inspector General without any further action needed until June 30, 2016. Effective July 1, 2016, the Inspector General shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by County Council. The term of the Inspector General shall be five years commencing on July 1, 2016, with subsequent terms commencing every five years on the first day of July.
  - (b) In the case of a vacancy in the position of Inspector General, the Executive shall appoint a successor Inspector General, subject to confirmation of Council, to fill the remaining term of the Inspector General. Notwithstanding any other provision in the Charter to the contrary, the Deputy Inspector General shall serve as the Acting Inspector General during any vacancy, and the Executive may not appoint an interim Inspector General.
  - (c) The Inspector General may be removed from office for inefficiency, neglect of duty, or malfeasance in office after notice and public hearing before the Council, provided that at least two-thirds of the Council and the County Executive concur. Either the County Executive or the Council may initiate the process to remove the Inspector General.
- (2) Contracting with other Entities. The County shall have the right to contract on behalf of the Agency of Inspector General to have the Agency of Inspector General provide similar services to any other governmental funded entities, county hospitals, agencies, authorities, municipalities, districts, or political subdivisions.
- (3) Confidential Investigatory Files. Without regard to how such documents are received by the Agency, all documents prepared or received by the Agency of the Inspector General, including, but not limited to, all complaints, tips, hotline messages, and any other filings and submittals received by the Agency shall be considered part of the Inspector General confidential investigatory files. Such records shall be exempt from disclosure until the matter is concluded and the investigation is closed by the Inspector General and any other investigatory agencies with jurisdiction over the matter. In the event such records are publicly

disclosed, the Inspector General shall take measures to protect the privacy of complainants and witnesses to the extent permitted by law.

- (4) Agency of Inspector General's Budget, Facilities, Furniture, Equipment, and Software.
  - (a) The County Council shall appropriate funds for the Agency of Inspector General sufficient for the Agency to exercise its powers and duties as established herein. The budget of the Agency of Inspector General shall be based on a fixed formula established by county ordinance in order to ensure that the Agency can function without political interference. If the County Council fails to appropriate the necessary funds for the Agency to carry out its functions as provided herein, the Agency shall have the right to institute legal action in court to compel the County to appropriate the necessary funds for its operations.
  - (b) The County shall provide the Agency of Inspector General with appropriately located office space and sufficient physical facilities, including office furniture, equipment, and software commensurate with other County departments of similar size and needs.
- (5) Limitations on the Agency of Inspector General.
  - (a) The Inspector General shall not interfere with any ongoing criminal, administrative, civil, or such other investigation or prosecution in the performance of his/her duties.
  - (b) The Inspector General shall manage the Agency and conduct all investigations in a manner that protects the constitutional and civil rights of any person who is the subject of an investigation as well as the constitutional and civil rights of any potential witnesses.
- **SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution, and Article XII, Sections 12.09 and 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby directs that the proposed amendment creating Article XIV, Section 14.01 shall be submitted to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be as follows:

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CHARTER

Shall Article XIV, Section 14.01 Agency of Inspector General of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga be added to establish the Agency of Inspector General in the Charter and provide for its funding, structure, operations, and authority?

**SECTION 3.** If the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, the existing provisions of Article XIV, Section 14.01 which are inconsistent herewith, shall be and the same are hereby repealed effective as of the date on which such amendment becomes effective.

**SECTION 4.** The Clerk of this Council is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections no earlier than one hundred twenty (120) days and not later than sixty (60) days before the November 5, 2013 election. The Clerk is further directed to take all other actions required by law relative to the submission of said amendment for said election, including, if required by law, mailing or otherwise distributing a copy of said proposed amendment to each of the electors of the County as far as may be reasonably possible prior to thirty (30) days before said election.

- (4) Perform any other duties assigned by the Council or County Executive.

The Director of Law shall be responsible for the employment of outside counsel in the performance of his or her duties.

WHEREAS, this Council believes it is in the best interest of the citizens of the County of Cuyahoga to amend the County Charter to rename the "Human Resource Commission" the "Personnel Review Commission," to clarify the Personnel Review Commission's administrative powers and duties, and to formally establish an office of the Director of Human Resources.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XII, Sections 12.09 and 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby authorizes and directs that there shall be submitted to a vote of qualified electors of the County of Cuyahoga, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the question of amending Article II, Sections 2.03(12) and Article IX, Sections 9.01 through 9.05 and to add Section 9.06 of the Charter of the County of

Cuyahoga, the respective text to be as set forth herein, with boldfaced text being added and crossed out text being deleted as follows:

#### SECTION 2.03 POWERS AND DUTIES.

(12) To conduct collective bargaining regarding wages and compensatory benefits with any recognized employee bargaining unit in conjunction with the Human Resource Commission, and, administer uniform personnel procedures for all County employees, and to provide quarterly reports to the Personnel Review Commission regarding the County's collective bargaining strategies and approved contracts.

## SECTION 9.01 HUMAN RESOURCE COMMISSIONPERSONNEL REVIEW COMMISSION.

There shall be a Personnel Review Commission. The County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Council, shall appoint the members of the Personnel Review Commission a Human Resource Commission, consisting of three electors of the County having experience in personnel matters or personnel administration and who are supportive of equal opportunity considerations. No more than two of the three members of the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall be members of the same political party. The Personnel Review Commission is authorized to employ persons in the service of the County. The Personnel Review Commission Human Resource Commission shall be responsible for administering, for and in cooperation with the officers, agencies, boards and commissions of the County, an efficient and economical system for the employment of persons in the public service of the County according to merit and fitness. The County's human resources policies and systems, including ethics policies for County employees, shall be established by ordinance and shall be administered in such manner as will eliminate unnecessary expense and duplication of effort, while ensuring that persons will be employed in the public service without discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, sexual orientation, disability, age or ancestry. The Personnel Review Commission shall submit a recommendation regarding any ordinance concerning County personnel policies prior to passage by County Council. In the event the Personnel Review Commission does not endorse an ordinance, the Personnel Review Commission may provide a Statement of Non-Endorsement to the County Council.

The term of office of each member of the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall be six years. The terms shall be staggered so that no term expires within less than two years of the expiration of any other term. The County Executive shall fill a vacancy occurring for an unexpired term in the same manner as a regular appointment.

Of the terms of office for the initial appointees, one shall be appointed for a term of six years, one shall be appointed for a term of four years and one shall be appointed for a term of two years. The County Executive shall nominate the initial appointees to the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission not later than March 1, 2011 and thereafter within thirty days after the occurrence of a vacancy.

No member of the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall hold any other public office or public employment with the County. The Council shall

establish a per diem compensation for the members of the **Personnel Review** Commission Human Resource Commission.

The County Executive may remove any member of the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office after notice and public hearing before the Council, provided that eight two-thirds of the members of the Council concur.

## SECTION 9.02 AUTHORITY OF HUMAN RESOURCE COMMISSIONPERSONNEL REVIEW COMMISSION.

The **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall have:

- (1) Responsibility for the resolution or disposition of all personnel matters, with authority to appoint hearing officers to hear all employee appeals previously under the jurisdiction of the State Personnel Board of Review, including those of classified employees who work for the County Executive, Prosecuting Attorney, County Planning Commission, and the County Public Defender;
- (2) Responsibility for administration of <del>countywide</del> compliance with federal and state laws regarding personnel matters within the County Executive's organization and departments which the County is the reporting unit and for maintenance of records required by such laws;
- (3) For the County Executive's organization and departments, authority to ensure:
  - Pay equity for like positions;
  - Standardization of benefits;
  - Approval of qualifications;
  - Consistent discipline;
  - Training of management in personnel practices;
  - Training of employees in job functions;
  - Training for total quality management;
  - Consistent administration of performance management system;
  - Coordination of recruitment;
  - Compliance with ethics resolutions or ordinances as passed by the Council;
- (4) Responsibility for creation of rules and policies related to the Personnel Review Commission's authority set forth in this Charter;
- (45) Such other functions as may be deemed necessary by the Council for the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission to carry out its mission and purpose.

#### SECTION 9.03 CLASSIFICATION.

The **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall administer a clear, countywide classification and salary administration system for technical, specialist, administrative and clerical functions with a limited number of broad pay ranges within each classification. The classification system shall include the employees of the offices listed in Article V of this Charter, as well as those of the County Executive and County Council except those employees in positions designated as unclassified by general law. The classification system shall, to the extent permitted by the Ohio Constitution, include

the **classified** employees of all offices, officers, agencies, departments, boards, commissions or other public bodies, other than separate political subdivisions, that are supported in whole or in part from taxes levied, or other financial assistance provided, by the County.

#### SECTION 9.04 APPOINTING AUTHORITIES.

The County Executive and the officers, offices, agencies, departments, boards and commissions and other public bodies, who under this Charter or under general law are authorized to employ persons in the service of the County, shall be appointing authorities. Persons interested in employment with the County shall make application to the Department of Human Resources. No appointing authority shall appoint a person to fill a vacancy in the classified service who does not meet the qualifications for that position approved by the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission. All Appointing Authorities shall strive in making appointments in both the classified and the unclassified service to ensure that the diversity of the population of the County is reflected in the persons who are employed by the County.

#### SECTION 9.05 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES.

There shall be a Department of Human Resources, which shall, as part of its duties, serve under the direction of and perform such functions on behalf of the Personnel Review Commission Human Resource Commission as the Commission shall delegate prescribe. The Department of Human Resources shall provide regular reports to the Personnel Review Commission regarding the Department's performance of such delegated functions in accordance with timeframes established by the Personnel Review Commission.

# SECTION 9.06 DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RESOURCES: POWERS, DUTIES AND QUALIFICATIONS.

The Director of Human Resources shall be appointed by the Executive to manage County employment matters including hiring, firing, discipline, layoffs, training, benefits, time and attendance, HR compliance, and drafting policies and procedures. The Director shall be responsible for offering support to the law department on all labor and employment matters. The Director of Human Resources shall have a minimum of five years of experience advising or working in the public sector, experience in employment related matters, management experience or related relevant experience.

**SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution, and Article XII, Sections 12.09 and 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby directs that the proposed amendment of Article II, Sections 2.03(12) and Article IX, Sections 9.01 through 9.05 and to add Section 9.06 shall be submitted to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be as follows:

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CHARTER

Shall Article II, Section 2.03(12) Powers and Duties, and Article IX of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga be amended to rename the "Human Resource Commission" the "Personnel Review Commission," to clarify the Personnel Review Commission's administrative powers and duties, and to formally establish an office of the Director of Human Resources?

**SECTION 3.** If the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, the existing provisions of Article II, Section 2.03(12) and Article IX, Sections 9.01 through 9.05 and the addition of 9.06 which are inconsistent herewith, shall be and the same are hereby repealed effective as of the date on which such amendment becomes effective.

**SECTION 4.** The Clerk of this Council is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections no earlier than one hundred twenty (120) days and not later than sixty (60) days before the November 5, 2013 election. The Clerk is further directed to take all other actions required by law relative to the submission of said amendment for said election, including, if required by law, mailing or otherwise distributing a copy of said proposed amendment to each of the electors of the County as far as may be reasonably possible prior to thirty (30) days before said election.

**SECTION 5.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective to enable the Clerk of Council to perform her duties in time for the amendments to be properly placed on the November 5, 2013 election. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight (8) members of Council, it shall become immediately effective.

WHEREAS, pursuant to division (B) of Section 321.261 of the Ohio Revised Code, this County Council may designate an additional five percent (5%) deduction from all collections of delinquent real property, personal property and manufactured and mobile home taxes and assessments (the "Additional DTAC Fee") to be deposited in the delinquent tax and assessment collection fund (the "DTAC Fund") and appropriated for the use of a county land reutilization corporation, including the Cuyahoga County Land Reutilization Corporation (the "Corporation"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to subdivision (B) of Section 321.261 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Corporation has requested that this Council consider designating the Additional DTAC Fee, commencing January 1, 2014, and continuing through December 31, 2018, subject to the limitation provided for in Section 1 of this Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds that designating the Additional DTAC Fee, subject to the limitation provided for in Section 1 of this Ordinance, to provide a portion of the Corporation's Annual Base Funding, is in the best interests of the County and is necessary for the Corporation to continue to achieve its mission and public purposes of, among others, alleviating the slum and blight of vacant, abandoned and foreclosed properties within the County and the negative consequences which certain national real estate practices and the prior recession have inflicted on the local real estate markets; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the efficient and effective operation of the County and the Corporation.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Sections 704.01 to 704.03 of the Cuyahoga County Code shall be amended and replaced to read as follows:

CHAPTER 704: Delinquent Tax Anticipation Notes (DTAN)/Delinquent Tax and Assessment Collection (DTAC)

#### Section 704.01: Additional DTAC Fee

Pursuant to and in accordance with Section 321.261(B) of the Ohio Revised Code and subject to the other provisions of this Chapter, this Council hereby designates the Additional DTAC Fee in the annual amount of five percent (5%) to be applied on all collections of delinquent real property, personal property and manufactured and mobile home taxes and assessments solely for the use of the Corporation as part of its annual base funding, commencing on January 1, 2014 and continuing through December 31, 2018.

#### Section 704.02: Maximum Base Funding

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 704.01 of the Cuyahoga County Code, the aggregate amount transferred to the Corporation from the DTAC Fund and the penalties and interest on current late and delinquent taxes and assessments deposited into the County Land Reutilization Fund in any single fiscal year of the Corporation shall not exceed \$7,000,000.00 (the "Maximum Annual Base Funding Amount").

#### Section 704.03: Deposit and Appropriation of Additional DTAC Fee

All amounts constituting the Additional DTAC Fee shall be deposited in the DTAC Fund, and such amounts upon their deposit in such fund, subject to the provisions of Section 704.02 of the Cuyahoga County Code, are hereby appropriated for the sole use of the Corporation and shall be disbursed to the Corporation upon warrant of the Fiscal Officer of the County (the "Fiscal Officer").

**SECTION 2.** The Clerk of Council is hereby instructed to transmit a copy of this Ordinance upon its execution by the County Council President, the County Executive and the Clerk of Council to the Fiscal Officer and the County Treasurer.

**SECTION 3**. It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Three staff will support the development and implementation of the program. One position is based in the Executive's office and another in Invest in Children. Only one position will be funded out of the College Savings Account Program fund. All other costs are programmatic and necessary to develop the infrastructure to monitor and report on the program as well as inform the community of the new program.

## **Summary of Request**

Request for additional appropriation totaling \$153,600 to support the implementation of the recommendations in the Archer Classification Study in the Public Defender's Office.

## **Background Information**

County Council requested a review of salaries paid in the Offices of the Public Defender and County Prosecutor relative to the approved classification plan for non-bargaining staff (in the Public Defender's Office). This review addressed inequities in pay between bargaining staff and the supervisors, who were earning less than subordinate staff, and sought to more accurately align salaries for support staff with the requirements of their positions. The resulting study indicated that nearly 85% of staff were earning below the minimums in the approved classification plan: the recommendations call for increasing salaries to the minimums (no steps for longevity).

## **OBM Recommendation and Impact Statement**

OBM recommends approving the request for additional appropriation to support the implementation of the Archer Study. This action addresses gross salary inequities and will contribute to improving morale in the Office of the Public Defender.

The recommendation is to adjust salaries retroactive to January 2013 with a total annual cost of \$153,600. It should be noted, however, that the General Fund impact is less after factoring out the portion covered under the contract with the City of Cleveland for representation in Cleveland Municipal Court (\$13,900) and when taking into consideration the 40% reimbursement from the State Public Defender's Office. **The annual impact to the General Fund of this request is \$83,820.**


SUBJECT: ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION METRO HEALTH SERVICES

Please process the attached request for additional appropriations.

The added appropriation is needed to fund an additional half year of Metro Health services. The Court's 2013 appropriation was approximately \$800,000 for the fiscal year. The new negotiated contract covers the period July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014, a 12 month period. It is also approximately \$400,000 more than the Court's 2013 appropriation for health services. The certification requires 12 months of funding. November 2012 through June 2013 was paid on board vouchers and totaled more than half of the 2013 appropriation which has been expended.

Any leftover funds from this request will be utilized for the ongoing job fair entry fees that the Recruitment and Retention Department continues to attend.

This request is being made because the annual \$30,000.00 training funds were not included in the 2013 budget. I have spoken with Sybil and Tim regarding this issue, and we will correct for this oversight in the coming biennial budget cycle.



WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary to adopt the regulations governing the County's Excise Tax on Lodging of Transient Guests; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to continue the usual and daily operations of the County.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** That Chapter 712 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted as follows:

### **CHAPTER 712: Cuyahoga County Lodging Excise Tax Code of Regulations**

#### Section 712.01: Title

The Code of Regulations established pursuant to Resolution No. 3327 dated September 12, 2000 is hereby amended by this Chapter. This Chapter shall be known and may be cited and referred to as the "Cuyahoga County Lodging Excise Tax Code of Regulations".

#### **Section 712.02: Incorporations**

Resolution No. 930524 dated February 2, 1993, Resolution No. 975206 dated December 23, 1997, Resolution No. 041710 dated May 4, 2004, Resolution No. 105085 dated November 18, 2010, and Resolution No. 105086 dated November 18, 2010 are incorporated as if fully rewritten herein.

#### Section 712.03: Definitions

As used in the following Sections of the Cuyahoga County Lodging Excise Tax Code of Regulations:

- A. "Fiscal Officer" means the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer and any of his/her assistants designated to assist in administering and enforcing the collection of the excise tax on lodging of transient guests herein levied and imposed, who are hereby assigned all of the duties and authority of Cuyahoga County to administer and enforce the collection of such tax.
- B. "Consumer" means the person who the sale is provided to pursuant to as defined in ORC 5739.01(D)(1).
- C. "Hotel" means every establishment kept, used, maintained, advertised, or held out to the public to be a place where sleeping accommodations are offered to guests, whether such rooms are in one or several structures. For purposes of this tax, Cuyahoga County resolved, effective July 1, 2004 (Resolution No. 41710), that the definition of "hotel" shall include establishments with fewer than five (5) rooms for the accommodation of guests. For purposes of this Code, "hotel" does not include any college or university owned housing that is primarily used to house students affiliated with the school during the school year.
- D. "Lodging" means one (1) or two (2) or more connecting rooms in which sleeping accommodations are provided for a transient guest(s).
- E. "Person" includes individuals, receivers, assignees, trustees in bankruptcy, estates, firms, partnerships, associations, joint-stock companies, joint ventures, clubs, societies, corporations, the state and its political subdivisions, and combinations of individuals of any form.
- F. "Premises" includes any real property or portion thereof upon which any person engages in selling tangible personal property at retail or making retail sales and also includes any real property or portion thereof designated for, or devoted to, used in conjunction with the business engaged by such person.
- G. "Rack Rate" means the rate for a hotel room before any discount is taken into account. The rack rate is posted on the wall or door of the hotel room itself as the maximum actual rate the hotel may charge for a room as required by ORC 3731.16.
- H. "Sale" and "selling" include all of the following transactions for consideration in any manner, whether absolutely or conditionally, whether for a price or rental, in money or by exchange, and by any means whatsoever, including, but not limited to all transactions by which lodging by a hotel is or is to be furnished to transient guests.

- I. "Rent" means the aggregate value in money or anything paid or delivered, or promised to be paid or delivered for hotel lodging, without any deduction for the cost of labor, service, property used, interest discount paid after the price is paid or agreed to be paid, or any other expense.
- J. "Tax" means, except where otherwise specified, the tax levied and imposed herein.
- K. "Transaction" means the amount paid, or to be paid, by or on behalf of, a transient guest to a hotel; or where no such consideration is paid by or on behalf of, such transient guest, the maximum actual rate for such lodging posted pursuant to ORC 3731.16.
- L. "Transient guest(s)" means person(s) occupying a room or rooms for sleeping accommodations for less than thirty (30) consecutive days.
- M. "Vendor" means a person who owns or operates a hotel that furnishes lodging to guests and includes the agents and employees of such person who performs the functions on behalf of the vendor. "Vendor" also includes the owner, lessee, mortgagor in possession of the real estate upon whose premises the vendor operates or has operated a hotel, when the vendor is or becomes a non-resident of Ohio or conceals his/her whereabouts or property. The vendor shall have an Ohio Retail Sales Tax Vendor License in order to operate a business pursuant to ORC 5739.17.
- M. "Provisions of Accommodations" means an act or process of providing a service or amenity to a guest, which is directly related to the lodging space.

# Section 712.04: Levy of Tax; When Collectable; Exemptions; Presumption; Taxable Transactions

- A. An excise tax is hereby levied and imposed upon each transaction in Cuyahoga County by which lodging is or is to be furnished by a vendor to a transient guest or guests at a hotel, at the rate of five and one-half percent (5 ½%) of the sale for each such sale and/or transaction.
- B. The tax applies and is collectable when the lodging is furnished, regardless of the time when the rent is paid or delivered or whether the sale is done at no charge.

- C. For the purpose of the proper administration, and to prevent evasion of the tax, it is presumed that all rents and sales for hotel rooms in the County are subject to the tax until the contrary is established.
- D. This tax is not a part of the rent and shall be separately stated as such on every rent invoice, bill, statement or other written charge therefore.
- E. The tax does not apply to transactions for lodging furnished to representatives of the United States government which are paid directly by the Federal government; the government of any state, excluding Ohio, or any of their political subdivisions. Such transactions will be considered for an exemption by filing a Cuyahoga County Certificate of Exemption together with the bill, statement, or invoice and copies of payment received. For every transaction which the vendor claims is exempt pursuant to this section, the vendor must be able to produce sufficient documentation of the exempt status, and for Federal Government exemptions, the portion of the government credit card number, as identified by the Federal Government and Ohio Department of Taxation as authorizing the exemption, used for each individual transaction. The vendor is required to retain such records in the same manner as other lodging tax records. A Cuyahoga County Hotel/Motel Tax Exemption Report must be submitted with each Monthly Return in order for the exemption to be considered.
- F. The tax does not apply to transactions for lodging furnished to representatives of the Office of Foreign Missions, U.S. Department of State. Such transactions will be considered for an exemption by filing a Cuyahoga County Certificate of Exemption together with the bill, statement, or invoice and copies of any checks or credit cards received in payment by a mission. For every transaction which the vendor claims is exempt pursuant to this section, the vendor must be able to produce sufficient documentation of the exempt status, and for Foreign Mission exemptions, the front and back of the Mission tax exemption card, as identified by the Office of Foreign Missions, U.S. Department of State as authorizing the exemption, used for each individual transaction. The vendor is required to retain such records in the same manner as other lodging tax records. A Cuyahoga County Hotel/Motel Tax Exemption Report must be submitted with each Monthly Return in order for the exemption to be considered.
- G. The tax does not apply to optional services which may include: room service; porter or bellboy service, valet services, pay-for-view movies; wake-up calls and charges for telephone services, or other miscellaneous charges not related to the provision of accommodation and which are stated separately from the charge for lodging.

- H. The tax does apply to Vendor charges for: additional bed(s), bedding, housekeeping, use of refrigerator/microwave, pet accommodations, safes or other similar services which are charged in addition to the room charge and are amenities to the room which relate to the provision of accommodations.
- I. The tax does apply to the room portion of any "package rate." Any vendor offering a package rate must separately identify on the guest receipt and/or other records of the vendor, at the time of furnishing of lodging, the room portion of the package rate, the transient occupancy tax applicable to the room portion of the package rate and the non-room portion of the package rate. The vendor shall bear the burden of proving that the allocation of taxes between the room portion and the non-room portion of the package rate was properly made and that the correct amount of taxes were collected and remitted to the appropriate agencies.
- J. The tax does apply to a receivable room charge, including non-refundable deposits or guaranteed no show revenue/fees paid by or on behalf of any person, whether or not the person actually exercises the right to occupancy by using or possessing any room or rooms, or portion thereof, whether it be termed "cancellation fee" or "attrition" or other term with similar meaning.

#### Section 712.05: Liabilities of Vendor and Consumer

- A. To the extent the vendor fails to collect the tax or elects not to collect the tax from the consumer upon each taxable transaction and/or sale, or having collected the tax, fails to return and remit the same when due, the tax is hereby imposed and levied upon the vendor.
- B. Within thirty (30) days after commencing business or changing business name, management company or ownership, each operator of any hotel or motel renting lodging to transient guests shall complete a registration form (the form is available at the Fiscal Office) for said hotel or motel with the Fiscal Officer by means of purchasing an Ohio Retail Sales Tax Vendor License and obtaining from the Fiscal Officer a Transient Occupancy Registration Certificate to be at all times posted in a conspicuous place on the premises.

# Section 712.06: Returns; Due Date; Remission of Penalties; Procedure Thereon; Failure to File; Form

A. Each vendor shall, on or before the 21<sup>st</sup> day of each month, complete and file a full return with the Fiscal Officer for the preceding calendar month on the form prescribed, showing all the information required

- thereon, including the amount of tax due the County from the Vendor and report all exempt transactions on the Hotel/Motel Tax Exemption Report. Failure to file these items will result in penalties.
- B. The monthly returns shall be submitted to the Fiscal Officer with payment of the amount of tax due thereon. Any and all taxes collected and not refunded to the consumer shall be remitted to the Fiscal Officer.
- C. Upon receiving the monthly returns with the proper payment, the Fiscal Officer shall promptly stamp or otherwise mark on all copies the date received and the amount of payment received.
- D. Upon application of the vendor, in writing and for good cause shown, the Fiscal Officer may extend the time for making and filing returns. Also, the Fiscal Officer may reduce or abate any and all interest and penalties that may be due hereunder.
- E. Any vendor who fails to file a complete return and exemption report, with payment, postmarked on or before the 21<sup>st</sup> day of each month, shall forfeit and pay into the County Treasurer interest at the rate at which interest accrues per annum as prescribed pursuant to ORC 5703.47 and a penalty of ten percent (10%) of the amount of the tax due.
- F. The form of the return shall be prescribed by the Fiscal Officer. Submission of any form other than what is prescribed by the Fiscal Officer may result in the automatic rejection of exempted status for the transaction. The exemption certificate is to be completed in its entirety. If a fully completed and executed certificate is not obtained by the property and made available for audit, the excise tax shall apply and the property will be held responsible for the payment of same.

#### Section 712.07: Amended Returns

Amended Returns: Whenever the amount of any tax, interest and penalty has been overpaid or paid more than once or has been erroneously or illegally collected or received by the County under this Code, it may be refunded if the vendor makes a legitimate claim in writing, stating under penalty of perjury the specific grounds upon which the claim is founded. The claim shall be on forms furnished by the Fiscal Officer and a refund of any claim shall be at the sole discretion of the Fiscal Officer. No refund shall be paid under the provisions of this section unless the claimant establishes his right thereto by written records showing entitlement thereof within four (4) years of the date of the claimed erroneous payment. This section is not a substitute for a petition for reassessment or any appeal following assessment.

### Section 712.08: Assessments; Liabilities of Vendor and Consumer

- A. If any vendor collects the tax and fails to remit the same to the County as provided herein, said vendor shall be personally liable for any amount collected, which was not remitted. If any vendor fails to collect the tax on any transaction subject thereto, such vendor shall be personally liable for the same. The Fiscal Officer may make an assessment against the vendor as the facts may require in the Fiscal Officer's sole discretion.
- B. No assessment against a vendor shall discharge the consumer's liability to the vendor for any unpaid tax, if the consumer owes the tax.
- C. No assessment issued against either the vendor or the consumer shall be considered an election of remedies or a bar to an assessment against the other for the tax, penalty, and interest applicable to the same transaction, provided, however, no assessment shall be issued against any person for the tax due on a particular transaction if the entire tax has been paid by another.

# Section 712.09: Maintenance and Inspection of Records; Assessments; Delinquencies

- A. The burden of proof rests upon each vendor to show what part, if any, of the gross room revenue receipts are not taxable from the hotel room sales and/or transactions; and for such purpose each vendor shall maintain and keep complete and accurate records of said room revenue together with a record of the tax collected thereon, which shall include:
  - 1. Primary records such as all guest or rent registers, sales, rent invoices, statements or bills, rent payments and/or refunds thereon; room rate sheets or cards of daily prices for each room, as required by ORC 3731.16; receipts of taxes collected; copies of appropriate schedules of Federal Income Tax Returns, Ohio Sales Tax Returns, and tax returns to local municipalities having a lodging excise tax identical or substantially similar to the tax imposed hereby; exemption certificates, tax payment receipts; cash register tapes and all other pertinent documents; and
  - 2. Secondary records such as bank deposit receipts and daily books, journals, or any other records in which the vendor accumulates data, which must be supported by complete detail in which such data was accumulated.

- B. Guest or rent invoices, statements or bills, and cash register tapes for taxable sale must state separately the total taxable sale and the tax charged and/or collected. The records must also show clearly the length of stay, in terms of consecutive days for each guest.
- C. All records relating to the collection and payment of the tax must be preserved by the vendor for five (5) years unless the Fiscal Officer requests that they be kept for a longer period.
- D. All such records and documents shall be open to the County Fiscal Officer for inspection during regular business hours. The Fiscal Officer shall from time to time, review, investigate, examine and audit any and all such records to determine if the proper tax has been returned and remitted. The Fiscal Officer also has the authority to remove such records as long as proper inventory of the documentation to be removed is provided to the vendor.
  - 1. The Fiscal Officer may interview the vendor or his/her employees and agents, and may take written statements under oath.
  - 2. If the Fiscal Officer's investigation of such records reveals that any tax or additional tax should properly have been returned and remitted by the Vendor, the Fiscal Officer shall make an assessment of such tax or additional tax.
- E. If any vendor fails to maintain complete primary sales records, accurately reflecting the total sales subject to the tax and of the tax due thereon, or which may be utilized in verifying the accuracy of the figures reflected in the vendor's secondary record and/or reported on the vendor's tax returns filed hereunder, the Fiscal Officer may use one of the following methods for such verification:
  - 1. Determine the total value of all rents, less rental refunds, when the full tax has also been refunded either in cash or by credit.
  - 2. Determine taxable and non-taxable sales, or the ratio of taxable sales to total sales, or both.
- F. The Fiscal Officer shall determine the proper amount of tax and/or make an assessment by any of the means set forth herein if any vendor:
  - 1. Fails to maintain complete records, as required hereby; or
  - 2. Fails or refuses to permit the Fiscal Officer to inspect any records; or

- 3. Refuses to permit the Fiscal Officer to sample or test check his business activity; or
- 4. Having filed a return or returns, misrepresents or fails to disclose, any material fact or figure thereon; or
- 5. Fails to collect the tax, or having collected the tax, fails to remit the same when due; or
- 6. Fails to remit the correct amount of tax or interest thereon when due; or
- 7. Fails to file a full and complete return when due
- G. No delinquent tax shall be assessed against a vendor more than four years after the return date for the period in which the taxable transaction occurred or after the return for such period was filed, whichever is later.

## **Section 712.10: Procedure Following Assessment**

- A. Each assessment shall be in writing stating clearly the reasons and basis therefor.
- B. In each case of an assessment, the Fiscal Officer shall give to the assessee written notice thereof to be served by any reliable means of delivery, along with a copy of the delinquent tax assessment.
- C. The assessment shall become final thirty (30) days after service thereof upon the assessee, unless, the assessee, within thirty (30) days of service of notice of assessment, files with the Fiscal Officer a Petition for Reassessment providing written objection to the assessment, together with reasons for such objection and documentation therefore. Filing of a Petition for Reassessment shall stay enforcement by the Fiscal Officer. The Fiscal Officer shall consider the Petition for Reassessment and provide a determination to the assessee as to the result of such consideration, along with a final assessment.
- D. Thirty (30) days after notice of assessment, or upon notice of the determination the Petition for Reassessment by the Fiscal Officer, whichever is later, the assessment shall become final and the amount thereof shall be deemed a debt due and payable to the County. The Fiscal Officer shall cause to be filed a judgment lien in the amount of

- the assessment, including penalties and interest added thereto under the provisions hereof.
- E. An appeal from the determination of a Petition for Reassessment may be made pursuant to the provisions of the Ohio Revised Code.
- F. All monies collected upon assessments including penalties and interest thereon shall, when received by the County, be considered as revenue arising from the tax.

## Section 712.11: Liability of Officers and Agents

- A. If any person required to file returns and to remit the tax, fails for any reason to make such filing or payment, vendor's officers, partners or managing agents, or employees having control or supervision of, or charged with the responsibility of, filing returns and making payments of tax, shall be personally liable for such failure. The dissolution of such entity shall not discharge its liability for a failure to file returns or remit tax due prior to such dissolution.
- B. No vendor shall fail to file returns and remit the full and exact tax as required by this Code.
- C. Any person(s) or entity(s) owing such a debt to the County under the provisions of this Code which debt has become delinquent, shall be liable to any action brought in the name of the County of Cuyahoga, for the recovery of such amount.

#### **Section 712.12: Sale of Entire Business**

If a vendor, liable for the tax sells the business or quits the business, the taxes, interest, and penalties imposed hereby on taxable rents and/or transactions made prior to that time shall become due and payable immediately, and such person shall make a Final Return on the form specified by the Fiscal Office, within fifteen (15) days after the date of selling or quitting business. The successor to the business shall withhold a sufficient amount of the purchase money to cover the amount of such taxes, interest, and penalties due and unpaid until the former owner produces a receipt from the Fiscal Officer showing that the taxes, interest, and penalties have been paid, or a certificate (available upon request) indicating that no taxes are due. If the purchaser of the business fails to withhold purchase money, the purchaser shall be personally liable for the payment of the taxes, interest, and penalties accrued and unpaid during the operation of the business by the former owner. Regardless of whether there was purchase money, the successor shall be personally liable for the tax, interest and penalties accrued and unpaid during the operation of the business by the former owner.

#### Section 712.13: Intent

It is the intent of these rules and regulations to provide for the administration of imposing, collecting and distributing the levy of an excise tax of five and one-half percent (5 ½%) on transactions and/or rent by which lodging by a hotel is or is to be furnished to transient guests as referred to and authorized by ORC 5739.09. Accordingly, these rules and regulations shall be construed to effectuate that purpose so as to be consistent with any requirement of law, compliance which is a prerequisite to the validity of the tax intended to be levied hereby.

#### Section 712.14: Severability

If any sentence, clause, section or part of these rules and regulations, or any tax imposed as specified herein, is found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutional, illegality or invalidity shall affect only such clause, sentence, section or part and shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or other parts of these rules and regulations. It is hereby declared to be the intention of Cuyahoga County that these rules and regulations would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

# Section 712.15: Capability of Vendor's Equipment; Vendor's Responsibility for Full Amount of Tax Levied

Notwithstanding any provision contained in this Code to the contrary, each vendor is hereby permitted to collect the tax from transient guests at the rate of five and one-half percent (5 ½%) of taxable rents; provided however, that the Cuyahoga County Hotel Lodging Excise Tax shall be stated on each rent invoice, bill statement, or other written change therefor, separately and apart from the Ohio sales tax and any similar tax imposed by a local sub-division; and provided further, that each vendor shall report monthly the total taxable rents collected during each month and pay the tax equal five and one-half percent (5 ½%) of such total taxable rents.

#### Section 712.16: Settlement of Tax Fund

- A. All receipts collected from the excise tax levied hereby shall be deposited in the Undivided Hotel Lodging Tax Fund.
- B. 27.27% of total receipts collected from the excise tax shall be appropriated to Cuyahoga County for the purpose of contributing revenues for the acquisition, construction, equipping and financing of an educational and cultural facility".

- C. After the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer deducts the real and actual costs of administering the tax, the County will deposit 25% of the remainder to the credit of the general fund to reimburse itself for moneys paid for the medical mart/convention center. After the general fund distribution, each municipal corporation or township that does not levy an excise tax on such transaction, shall receive a uniform percentage of the tax collected in the municipal corporation or in the unincorporated portion of the township for each such transaction not to exceed thirty-three and one-third percent.
- D. The balance remaining in the Hotel Lodging Tax Fund shall be forthwith paid as required by law to The Convention and Visitors Bureau of Greater Cleveland, Inc./Positively Cleveland.
- E. A claim for refund for taxes illegally or erroneously collected or paid, certified by the Fiscal Officer and for which a warrant is drawn on the County Treasurer, shall be paid from the Undivided Hotel Lodging Tax Fund.

## Section 712.17: Responsibilities of Convention Bureau and County

- A. The amounts allocated herein and hereby to The Convention and Visitors Bureau of Greater Cleveland, Inc. /Positively Cleveland are so appropriated thereto on condition that the said corporation recognizes that the County's hotel and motel industry which bears responsibility hereunder for the collection of the tax hereby levied, extends beyond the borders of the City of Cleveland and its downtown area, and, therefore, undertakes to promote the purposes and premises of the Code throughout the entire County so that the hotel and motel industry of the County generally may share as equitably as possible in the benefits to be derived from the promotion of such purposes and premises.
- B. The Convention and Visitors Bureau of Greater Cleveland, Inc. /Positively Cleveland shall present quarterly financial and performance reports as well as an annual operations report each showing its use of the funds hereby appropriated.

# Section 712.18: Recognition of Local Governments Who Have Additional 3% Bed Tax

The County recognizes that the Cities of Cleveland, Beachwood, Bedford Heights, Broadview Heights, Brooklyn, Brook Park, Euclid, Fairview Park, Independence, Maple Heights, Mayfield Heights, Middleburg Heights, North Olmsted, Rocky River, Solon, Strongsville, Warrensville Heights, and

Westlake; and the Villages of Mayfield, Oakwood, and Orange are presently levying a hotel lodging excise tax.

**SECTION 2.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

#### **SUMMARY OF REQUESTED ACTION:**

Requesting a Cuyahoga County Council Ordinance for Cuyahoga County's Excise Tax on Lodging and Transient Guests, Code of Regulations, and declaring the necessity that this Ordinance become effective October 1, 2013. "The Code of Regulations" established pursuant to Resolution No. 3327 dated September 12, 2000 will now be called "Cuyahoga County Lodging Excise Tax Code of Regulations."The excise tax to be imposed for each transaction in Cuyahoga County will be at the rate of five and one-half percent (5 1/2%). The tax applies and is collectable when the lodging is furnished, regardless of the time when the rent is paid or delivered or whether the sale is done at no charge. For the purpose of the proper administration, all rents and sales for hotel rooms in the County are subject to the tax until the contrary is established. The tax does not apply to transactions for lodging furnished to representatives of the United States government which are paid directly by the Federal government. The tax does not apply to transactions for lodging furnished to representatives of the Office of Foreign Missions, U.S. Department of State. The tax does not apply to optional services which may include: room service; porter or bellboy service, valet services, pay-for-view movies; wake-up calls and charges for telephone services, or other miscellaneous charges not related to the provision of accommodation and which are stated separately from the charge for lodging. The tax does apply to Vendor charges for: additional bed(s), bedding, house keeping, use of refrigerator/microwave, pet accommodations, safes or other similar services which are charged in addition to the room charge and are amenities to the room which relate to the provision of accommodations. The tax does apply to the room portion of any "package rate". The tax does apply to a receivable room charge, including non-refundable deposits or guaranteed no show revenue/fees paid by or on behalf of any person, whether or not the person actually exercises the right to occupancy by using or possessing any room or rooms, or portion thereof, whether it be termed "cancellation fee" or "attrition" or other term with similar

meaning.

WHEREAS, Ohio House Bill 59 (Budget Bill) amended various Sections of the Ohio Revised Code Chapter 955, et seq. regarding the establishment of mandated options for dog registration for a 1 year dog license or 3 year dog license or permanent dog license effective December 1, 2013; and,

WHEREAS, Ohio House Bill 59 amended Section 955.14(C) of the Ohio Revised Code regarding the fee amounts payable to the Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine for each dog kennel registration; and,

WHEREAS, dog license fees were previously adopted in Cuyahoga County Resolution No. 082545 dated June 5, 2008; Resolution No. R2011-0344 dated February 14, 2012; and Resolution No. R2012-0200 dated October 9, 2012.

WHEREAS, the County is now required to annually administer a multi-option dog owner registration fee system effective December 1, 2013 beginning with the 2014 dog license renewal and purchase period.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the efficient and effective operation of the County.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 713 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

#### **CHAPTER 713: Dog License Fees**

#### Section 713.01 Dog License Fees Established

Cuyahoga County shall collect a Dog License Fee pursuant to O.R.C. Chapter 955, et seq. and other applicable laws for registration for a 1 year dog license, 3 year dog license and permanent dog license. The dog license fees for spayed and neutered dogs shall be as follows:

A. 1 Year Dog License Fee is \$20 per dog.

- B. 3 Year Dog License Fee is \$60 per dog.
- C. Permanent Dog License Fee is \$200 per dog.
- D. Kennel Registration Fee is \$100.
- E. Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine shall receive .10 cents for each 1 Year Dog License; .30 cents for each 3 Year Dog License; and \$1.00 for each Permanent Dog License.

**SECTION 2.** The fees set forth herein shall be effective December 1, 2013.

**SECTION 3.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 4.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

#### **BULLETIN SUMMARY**

On December 1, 2013, new provisions of law dealing with dog registration fees included in the state budget bill, HB 59, will become effective. The new law will provide dog owners with the option of purchasing one-year, three-year, or permanent registrations for their animal beginning with the registration period beginning on December 1, 2013.

This County Advisory Bulletin (CAB) highlights changes in the law including the new three-year and permanent registration options, the establishment of registration fees, penalties for dog owners in non-compliance, and tips for implementing these changes.

Also included are two exhibits at the end of this CAB: 1), a list of the applicable Ohio Revised Code sections as amended (See Exhibit A); and 2), a sample resolution for

establishing registration fees that commissioners must pass by August 31<sup>st</sup> of this year (2013) and annually thereafter if the board seeks to change the fee from the prior year's amount (See Exhibit B).

## BACKGROUND

While CCAO, the County Auditors Association of Ohio (CAAO), and the Ohio County Dog Wardens Association (OCDWA) opposed the inclusion of these changes in the state budget for a number of reasons relating to implementation and potential adverse impacts on registration compliance rates, the changes were included in the final version of HB 59. CCAO, CAAO, and OCDWA were successful in delaying the effective date until December 1, 2013, rather than the normal effective date of September 29, 2013.

## OHIO'S DOG REGISTRATION LAW (PRIOR TO HB 59 EFFECTIVE DATE)

## Annual Dog Registration and Kennel Registration

Under current law, owners of dogs three months or older must annually register their dog between the preceding December 1<sup>st</sup> and January 31<sup>st</sup> of the current year with the county auditor or persons authorized by the county auditor to sell and accept registrations.<sup>1</sup>

Please note a board of commissioners may extend the period for the filing of annual dog registration applications by resolution.<sup>2</sup>

Similarly, every owner of a dog kennel must also annually register a kennel between the preceding December 1<sup>st</sup> and January 31<sup>st</sup> of the current year with the county auditor or persons authorized by the county auditor to sell and accept registrations.

# Establishing a Dog Registration Fee and a Kennel Registration Fee

Under current law, the base minimum statutory fee for an annual dog registration is \$2.<sup>3</sup> The base minimum statutory fee for an annual kennel registration is \$10.

However, if a board of county commissioners expects the cost of administering the dog laws in their respective county to exceed the total amount collected from such base fees, the commissioners may establish a higher annual dog and kennel registration fee by resolution, but must do so between February 1<sup>st</sup> and August 31<sup>st</sup>. Such increased

fees then will apply to the following registration period cycle of December 1<sup>st</sup> to January 31<sup>st</sup>.<sup>4</sup>

In practice, counties routinely adopt such rate increases as the base fee of \$2 and \$10 respectively, is woefully inadequate to fund the cost of administering Ohio's dog laws. Please note that if a board of county commissioners decides to increase such fees, the increase must be in the ratio of \$2 for an annual dog registration fee and \$10 for a kennel registration fee.

## **OSU College of Veterinary Medicine**

If a board of county commissioners has increased the annual dog and kennel registration fees above the base \$2 and \$10 base minimum statutory fees, then on or before the March 1<sup>st</sup> of the following year, the county auditor must pay ten cents of each dog and kennel registration fee to the OSU College of Veterinary Medicine.

## Penalties for Non-Compliance

If the application for an annual dog registration or an annual kennel registration is not filed and the registration fee not paid before January 31<sup>st</sup> of each year<sup>5</sup>, the county auditor assesses a penalty in an amount equal to the dog registration fee upon the dog owner which must be paid with the registration fee.

#### Records Retention

Under current law, a record of all certificates of registration issued and the applications for such registrations shall be kept by the auditor in a dog and kennel register for two years or until after an audit performed by the State Auditor.<sup>6</sup>

### Dog Tags

The form, character and lettering of dog tags are established by the county auditor. Each year the tag must be a color distinctive from the previous year.<sup>7</sup>

#### HB 59 CHANGES TO OHIO'S DOG REGISTRATION

#### **New Three Year and Permanent Registration Options**

As mentioned above, HB 59 now allows dog owners the option of purchasing registrations for one or three years or a permanent registration. The base fee for such registrations is \$2 for each year of registration for a one year or three year registration

and \$20 for a permanent registration. Just as under current law, these base fees are similarly woefully inadequate to pay the county auditor and dog warden to administer Ohio's dog laws. Fortunately, a board of commissioners has the authority to increase the fees for such registrations. However, commissioners <u>must</u> do so between February 1<sup>st</sup> and August 31<sup>st</sup>.

In addition, while the current law applies such increases only to the following registration period, HB 59 allows the resolution increasing fees to specify the registration period or periods to which such increased fees apply. Thus, a board of commissioners will not need to pass an annual resolution increasing such fees if the board does not wish to change the fees from the prior year's established amounts. However, since this change in law becomes effective on December 1, 2013, boards of commissioners still must pass a resolution to set the fees for the one year as well as the new three year and permanent options by August 31, 2013, for the following registration period, assuming those fees are to exceed the base minimum statutory fees.

## Establishing Dog Registration Fees and a Kennel Registration Fee

HB 59 also establishes ratios, similar to current law, for the cost of such multi-year registrations. Under the new law, an increase in fees must be in the ratio of \$2 for each year of a registration and \$20 for a permanent registration fee. Thus fees will be set based upon the county's annual registration fee and be a ratio of 3:1 for a three year registration and 10:1 for a permanent registration.

For example, if County A's current annual registration is \$12 and County A's Board of Commissioners decides not to increase or to stay with the \$12 per year fee, the Board would pass a resolution, prior to August 31<sup>st</sup> that establishes the following fees for one-year, three-year, and permanent dog registrations. (See calculations below)

	ORC Minimum Base Fee	Ratio (multiplier)	County A Fee (by resolution)
One year registration	\$2		\$12
Three year registration	\$6 (\$2 for each year of registration)	(\$12 x 3)	\$36
Permanent registration	\$20	(\$12 x 10)	\$120

Further, assume County B is also currently at \$12 for an annual registration fee, but County B's Board of Commissioners decides that, to administer the new multi-year options, the Board needs to increase the fee to \$14 per year of registration. The County B Board of Commissioners, prior to August 31<sup>st</sup>, must pass a resolution establishing the following fees for one-year, three-year, and permanent dog registrations. (See calculations below)

Please see *Exhibit B* for a sample resolution establishing such fees (using the sample of a \$14 one year registration).

## **OSU College of Veterinary Medicine**

If a board of county commissioners has increased the annual dog and kennel registration fees above the base \$2 and \$10 base minimum statutory fees, then on or before the March 1<sup>st</sup> of the following year, the county auditor must continue to pay the OSU College of Veterinary Medicine ten cents for each one-year dog registration and kennel registration, but will also pay thirty cents for each three-year dog registration, and \$1 for each permanent dog registration to the OSU College of Veterinary Medicine.

## **Penalties for Non-Compliance**

While the penalties for non-compliance have not changed, there is now some question as to what the actual penalty should be. Some have argued that if a dog was most recently registered for three years then the three year fee should be the amount of the penalty. Others contend that the county cannot assume an owner would register the dog for any longer than one year and thus the one-year fee should be the amount of the penalty. CCAO would advise counties to follow the latter approach and will be working with stakeholders to clarify this provision of law.

#### **Records Retention**

HB 59 now only requires a record of certificates issued and the applications for such registrations be kept by the county auditor in the dog and kennel register until after an audit by the State Auditor.

## Dog Tags

The new law now allows the color of dog tags to be prescribed by the county auditor without the requirement that the tags be of a different color than that during the previous year.

### **Purchasing Tips**

In addition, commissioners should expect county auditors and dog wardens to request the purchase of additional dog tags the next few years as they implement the new multi-year options. Wendy Oehlers, of **Online Dog Licensing**<sup>9</sup>, has offered various best practices going forward with the new multi-year options which include the following recommendations for the purchase of additional tags:

# 1-Year and 3-Year Metal Tags

1. There will be four active years of tags at any one time. All four tags should be different colors to maintain the visual check by the dog warden. Note: the four active tags will be the outgoing year's one-year and three-year and three-year and three-year.

## 2. Purchasing schedule

- a. In 2013, purchase one set of 2014 tags and one set of 2016 tags.
- b. In 2014, purchase one set of 2015 tags and one set of 2017 tags.
- c. In 2015, purchase one set of 2018 tags and use the 2016's you have on hand.
- d. In 2016, purchase one set of 2019 tags and use the 2017's you have on
- e. After the initial cost of purchasing an extra set of tags in 2014 and 2015, you will be back to purchasing one set of tags each year, the three-year tag.
- 3. Metal tags should continue to be stamped the same way you have in the past. For example: 2014 Ohio Dog 2016 Ohio Dog

Demo County Demo County

- 4. Tags purchased as three-year tags will eventually be sold as one-year tags, so purchase the same number you normally would for each set of tags purchased. Eventually the number of tags you need to purchase will decrease.
- 5. Duplicates should be issued in the appropriate year/color. Don't forget to order blanks for each year. Durability may be an issue for three-year tags.

## **Permanent Metal Tags**

1. Permanent tags should **not** include a year. For example:

Ohio Dog P00001 Demo County

- 2. Tags should use a "P" as a prefix, similar to the "DD" for dangerous and "K" for kennel.
- 3. Tags should be color &/or shape distinct from the annual tags. This could be accomplished by using a stainless silver color or setting aside a color not to be used for annual tags for the next 20+ years. You might also choose a distinct shape for your permanent tags. (Note: many counties already use stainless steel Ohio shaped tag for assistance<sup>10</sup> tags.)
- 4. Tags should be heavier gauge aluminum or stainless steel. If stainless steel is used, you may find that you need to assign a new tag number when issuing a duplicate instead of stamping out a duplicate.
- 5. Purchasing schedule
  - a. In 2013, purchase 1 set of permanent tags. Because the price of 10x annual fee will be a deterrent for many, **Online Dog Licensing** recommends purchasing 1/10th the number of annual tags. If you purchase 10,000 annual, you might purchase 1000 permanent to start. Note that these tags will be used over multiple years.
  - b. Going forward, purchase additional permanent tags annually as necessary. Remember to continue the existing sequence.

# OHIO REVISED CODE SECTIONS 955.01, 955.05, 055.06, 055.07, 055.08, 955.09 AND 955.14

# AS ENACTED BY AM. SUB. HB 59 OF THE 130TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

#### **EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 1, 2013**

Sec. 955.01. (A)(1) Except as otherwise provided in this section or in sections 955.011, 955.012, and 955.16 of the Revised Code, every person who owns, keeps, or harbors a dog more than three months of age, shall file, on or after the first day of the preceding applicable December, but before the thirty-first day of the applicable January of each year, in the office of the county auditor of the county in which the dog is kept or harbored, an application for registration for the following a period of one year, beginning the thirty-first day of January of that year or three years or an application for a permanent registration. The board of county commissioners, by resolution, may extend the period for filing the application. The application shall state the age, sex, color, character of hair, whether short or long, and breed, if known, of the dog and the name and address of the owner of the dog. A registration fee of two dollars for each year of registration for a one-year or three-year registration or twenty dollars for a permanent registration for each dog shall accompany the application, unless. However, the fee may exceed that amount if a greater fee has been established under division (A)(2) of this section or under section 955.14 of the Revised Code.

- (2) A board of county commissioners may establish a registration fee higher than the one provided for in division (A)(1) of this section for dogs more than nine months of age that have not been spayed or neutered, except that the higher registration fee permitted by this division shall not apply if a person registering a dog furnishes with the application either a certificate from a licensed veterinarian verifying that the dog should not be spayed or neutered because of its age or medical condition or because the dog is used or intended for use for show or breeding purposes or a certificate from the owner of the dog declaring that the owner holds a valid hunting license issued by the division of wildlife of the department of natural resources and that the dog is used or intended for use for hunting purposes. If the board establishes such a fee, the application for registration shall state whether the dog is spayed or neutered, and whether a licensed veterinarian has certified that the dog should not be spayed or neutered or the owner has stated that the dog is used or intended to be used for hunting purposes. The board may require a person who is registering a spayed or neutered dog to furnish with the application a certificate from a licensed veterinarian verifying that the dog is spayed or neutered. No person shall furnish a certificate under this division which that the person knows to be false.
- (B) If the application for registration is not filed and the registration fee paid, on or before the thirty-first day of the applicable January of each year or, if the board of county commissioners by resolution has extended the date to a date later than the

thirty-first day of January, the date established by the board, the auditor shall assess a penalty in an amount equal to the registration fee upon the owner, keeper, or harborer, which must shall be paid with the registration fee.

(C) An animal shelter that keeps or harbors a dog more than three months of age is exempt from paying any fees imposed under division (A) or (B) of this section if it is a nonprofit organization that is exempt from federal income taxation under subsection 501(a) and described in subsection 501(c)(3) of the "Internal Revenue Code of 1986," 100 Stat. 285 2085, 26 U.S.C. 1.

**Sec. 955.05.** After the thirty-first day of January of any year, except as otherwise provided in section 955.012 or 955.16 of the Revised Code, every person, immediately upon becoming the owner, keeper, or harborer of any dog more than three months of age or brought from outside the state during any year, shall file like applications, with fees, as required by section 955.01 of the Revised Code, for registration for the current year. If such the application is not filed and the fee paid, within thirty days after such the dog is acquired, becomes three months of age, or is brought from outside the state, the auditor shall assess a penalty in an amount equal to the registration fee upon such the owner, keeper, or harborer, which must shall be paid with the registration fee. Thereafter, the owner, keeper, or harborer shall register the dog for a period of one year or three years or register the dog permanently as provided in section 955.01 of the Revised Code.

Every person becoming the owner of a kennel of dogs after the thirty-first day of January of any year shall file like applications, with fees, as required by section 955.04 of the Revised Code, for the registration of such kennel for the current calendar year. If such application is not filed and the fee paid within thirty days after the person becomes the owner of such kennel, the auditor shall assess a penalty in an amount equal to the registration fee upon the owner of such kennel.

Sec. 955.06. The owner, keeper, or harborer of a dog becoming three months of age after the first day of July in a calendar year and the owner, keeper, or harborer of a dog purchased outside the state after the first day of July in a calendar year shall register the dog for one year. The registration fee for any such dog becoming three months of age after the first day of July of any year and the registration fee of any dog purchased from outside the state after the first day of July of any year shall be one-half of the original fee. Thereafter, the owner, keeper, or harborer shall register the dog for a period of one year or three years or register the dog permanently as provided in section 955.01 of the Revised Code.

Sec. 955.07. Upon the filing of the application for registration required by sections 955.01 and 955.04 of the Revised Code and upon the payment of the registration fee and the administrative fee, if applicable, the county auditor shall assign a distinctive number to every dog or dog kennel described in the application and shall deliver a certificate of registration bearing the number to the owner of the dog or dog kennel. A record of all certificates of registration issued, together with the applications

for registration, shall be kept by the auditor in a dog and kennel register for two years or until after an audit performed by the auditor of state, whichever is later. This record shall be open to the inspection of any person during reasonable business hours.

**Sec. 955.08.** In addition to the certificate of registration provided for by section 955.07 of the Revised Code, the county auditor shall issue to every person making application for the registration of a dog and paying the required fee therefor a metal tag for each dog so registered. The form, color, character, and lettering of the tag shall be prescribed by the county auditor. Each year the tag shall be a color distinctive from that of the previous year. If a tag is lost, a duplicate shall be furnished by the auditor upon proper proof of loss and the payment of five dollars for each duplicate tag issued.

**Sec. 955.09.** Certificates of registration and registration tags shall be valid only during the calendar year in <u>or years for</u> which they are issued, and during the first thirtyone days of the following calendar year.

- **Sec. 955.14.** (A) Notwithstanding section 955.01 of the Revised Code, a board of county commissioners by resolution may increase dog and kennel registration fees in the county. The amount of the fees shall not exceed an amount that the board, in its discretion, estimates is needed to pay all expenses for the administration of this chapter and to pay claims allowed for animals injured or destroyed by dogs. Such a resolution shall be adopted not earlier than the first day of February and not later than the thirty-first day of August of any year and shall apply to specify the registration period commencing on the first day of December of the current year and ending on the thirty-first day of January of the following year, unless the period is extended under section 955.01 of the Revised Code or periods to which the increased fees apply. Any An increase in fees adopted under this division shall be in the ratio of two dollars for each year of registration for a dog registration fee, twenty dollars for a permanent for a dog registration fee, and ten dollars for a kennel registration fee.
- (B) Not later than the fifteenth day of October of each year, the board of county commissioners shall determine if there is sufficient money in the dog and kennel fund, after paying the expenses of administration incurred or estimated to be incurred for the remainder of the year, to pay the claims allowed for animals injured or destroyed by dogs. If the board determines there is not sufficient money in the dog and kennel fund to pay the claims allowed, the board shall provide by resolution that all claims remaining unpaid shall be paid from the general fund of the county. All money paid out of the general fund for those purposes may be replaced by the board from the dog and kennel fund at any time during the following year notwithstanding section 5705.14 of the Revised Code.
- (C) Notwithstanding section 955.20 of the Revised Code, if dog and kennel registration fees in any county are increased above two dollars for each year of registration and twenty dollars for a permanent registration for a dog registration fee and ten dollars, respectively, for a kennel registration fee under authority of division (A) of this section, then on or before the first day of March following each year in which the

increased fees are in effect, the county auditor shall draw on the dog and kennel fund a warrant payable to the college of veterinary medicine of the Ohio state university in an amount equal to ten cents for each one-year dog and registration, thirty cents for each three-year dog registration, one dollar for each permanent dog registration, and ten cents for each kennel registration fee received during the preceding year. The money received by the college of veterinary medicine of the Ohio state university under this division shall be applied for research and study of the diseases of dogs, particularly those transmittable to humans, and for research of other diseases of dogs that by their nature will provide results applicable to the prevention and treatment of both human and canine illness.

- (D) The Ohio state university college of veterinary medicine shall be responsible to report annually to the general assembly the progress of the research and study authorized and funded by division (C) of this section. The report shall briefly describe the research projects undertaken and assess the value of each. The report shall account for funds received pursuant to division (C) of this section and for the funds expended attributable to each research project and for other necessary expenses in conjunction with the research authorized by division (C) of this section. The report shall be filed with the general assembly by the first day of May of each year.
- (E) The county auditor may authorize agents to receive applications for registration of dogs and kennels and to issue certificates of registration and tags. If authorized agents are employed in a county, each applicant for a dog or kennel registration shall pay to the agent an administrative fee of seventy-five cents in addition to the registration fee. The administrative fee shall be the compensation of the agent. The county auditor shall establish rules for reporting and accounting by the agents. No administrative or similar fee shall be charged in any county except as authorized by this division or division (F) of this section.
- (F) For any county that accepts the payment of dog and kennel registration fees by financial transaction devices in accordance with section 955.013 of the Revised Code, in addition to those registration fees, the county auditor shall collect for each registration paid by a financial transaction device one of the following:
- (1) An administrative fee of seventy-five cents or another amount necessary to cover actual costs designated by the county auditor;
- (2) If the board of county commissioners adopts a surcharge or convenience fee for making payments by a financial transaction device under division (E) of section 301.28 of the Revised Code, that surcharge or convenience fee;
- (3) If the county auditor contracts with a third party to provide services to enable registration via the internet as provided in section 955.013 of the Revised Code, a surcharge or convenience fee as agreed to between that third party and the county for those internet registration services. Any additional expenses incurred by the county auditor that result from a contract with a third party as provided in this section and

section 955.013 of the Revised Code and that are not covered by a surcharge or convenience fee shall be paid out of the allowance provided to the county auditor under section 955.20 of the Revised Code.

- (G) The county auditor shall post conspicuously the amount of the administrative fee, surcharge, or convenience fee that is permissible under this section on the web page where the auditor accepts payments for registrations made under division (B)(1) of section 955.013 of the Revised Code. If any person chooses to pay by financial transaction device, the administrative fee, surcharge, or convenience fee shall be considered voluntary and is not refundable.
- (H) As used in this section, "animal" has the same meaning as in section 955.51 of the Revised Code.
