#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Council President Connally at 2:03 p.m.

#### 2. ROLL CALL

Council President Connally asked Clerk Schmotzer to call the roll. Councilmembers Brady, Schron, Conwell, Rogers, Greenspan, Miller and Connally were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Councilmembers Germana and Jones entered the meeting shortly after the roll call was taken. Councilmember Gallagher was absent from the meeting. A motion was then made by Council President Connally, seconded by Mr. Schron and approved by unanimous vote to excuse Mr. Gallagher's absence.





# Most elder abuse cases not reported

Cleveland social worker working to help senior citizens avoid being victimized

A licensed social worker wants the public to know the facts about elder abuse.

"There's a lot of freedom and gain to growing older," said Carol Dayton, of Cleveland.

However, as she recently told members of the Cleveland Mensa chapter during their meeting at Corky and Lenny's in Woodmere, there are also numerous risks, such as the risk of being dependent upon others for care.

Dayton said only one in every 24 cases of elder abuse is reported. She said this can come from the seniors not getting out or being seen, and abuse can be caused by isolation or withholding care.

"It was an empowerment talk for those in the audience

and those with family members or friends who are older," Dayton said. "It's partly about the gain of growing older. People have the free-

dom to speak their minds, choose what to do and say things you always wanted to say, but haven't."

Dayton's career has been all about the field of aging. Before she retired, she was a part of the Cuyahoga County Department of Senior and Adult Services. As chief, she led elder abuse investigations from 1993-2005. Since, she has done some consulting and

training on the local, state and national level.

At the Cleveland Mensa meeting, Dayton gave tips to help prevent seniors from becoming victims of elder abuse in her presentation, "Being Smart and Safe in the Land of Old."

Dayton said there is a risk of a senior being harmed by the people caring for him or her and, she said, the most frequent perpetrators of elder abuse are family members.

Physical harm, such as latein-life domestic violence, can be caused by a partner or family member residing with the elder. Dayton said state law enforces criminal charges against those who show domestic violence or elder abuse toward an impaired senior over the age of 60. There's also the risk of emotional abuse and sexual abuse.

Other risks from caregivers that seniors should keep in mind include neglect by intent, to hasten death to receive an inheritance, financial exploitation, as well as the effects of exhaustion resulting from the caregiver's inability to conduct a sophisticated level of care.

#### Seniors can find help

The risks not only come from caregivers, but also in the way seniors treat them-

selves. Self-neglect can occur be the right person for the when an older person decides task." to become isolated.

Dayton suggests seniors try having two levels of conversation: with their caregivers and with themselves. Seniors should have the conversation with themselves acknowledging they could be at risk. Also, they should think through who will give them the care they need and how they will protect their assets from being compromised or harmed.

She said seniors should get people to give them feedback if they are at a point where they can no longer care for themselves.

"In your well years, recognize, if you live long enough, you are very likely to become dependent on someone. The younger person could initiate it by saying, 'I'm wondering what you want, mom," she said.

#### Additional risks

A real red flag is having the caregiver be the one person in the family who has never been financially independent and is frequently out of work or relationships.

"Being a caregiver is a heroic act and has financial needs that can be difficult," Dayton said. "If there is that kind of person available (fin-

Dayton suggests seniors have friends across an age range, simply to have someone to trust, and someone they won't likely outlive so they won't be alone.

"Isolation is one of the greatest risks of vulnerability," she said. "It can be physical isolation, where you don't get out anymore and you deteriorate alone, with no one to call upon. Other risks are if you are recently widowed, you may be very vulnerable as someone to court — be very self-aware that this could happen. If it's for the purpose of getting access to your funds, it could be bad."

Dayton also explained family members should not promise to always care for their loved one and say he or she will not go into a nursing home. The family member may need to break that promise, prompting Dayton to suggest saying instead, "you will always receive excellent care and I will see to it."

WHEREAS, this Council's Committee of the Whole has recommended that Council approve a Charter amendment for the November 2013 ballot that would resolve the ambiguities in language concerning the respective authority of the Prosecuting Attorney and the Director of Law; and

WHEREAS, representatives of the Prosecuting Attorney, the Executive, the Director of Law, and this Council have been meeting in good faith attempts to arrive at a resolution of these issues without resort to a Charter amendment; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive, the Director of Law and the Prosecuting Attorney have executed an agreement ("the Agreement") governing the duties, powers, and responsibilities of the Prosecutors' Office and the Department of Law; and

WHEREAS, concerns have arisen about the efficacy of the justice system reform efforts, such that the 2012-2013 Charter Review Commission recommended a Cuyahoga County Charter amendment calling for a comprehensive "justice system audit" conducted by an external reviewer every five years; and,

WHEREAS, Council is concerned about the wisdom of recommending that such a comprehensive audit be enshrined in the Charter, because of, among other things, the lack of a definition of "justice system," the potential costs of such an audit, and the constitutionality of some aspects of the proposed charter amendment; and

WHEREAS, Council affirms the validity of some of the questions raised about the efficacy of the justice system reform efforts, and desires to ensure that those responsible for providing a fair, transparent, and accountable criminal justice system in Cuyahoga County are doing so in a spirit of good faith and good government; and

WHEREAS, Council recognizes that the Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, General Division, Criminal Docket and the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court ("the Courts") are indispensable partners in the administration of criminal justice in Cuyahoga County and are directly responsible to the Ohio Supreme Court for carrying out their constitutional duties, including providing multiple reports and statistics pertaining to their duties; and

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County desires to promote continued justice system reform efforts, utilizing existing reports and analyses, including the Court's reports, and seeking other information from the courts and from other justice system partners in the context of the promotion a fair, transparent, and accountable system of criminal justice in Cuyahoga County, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the efficient and effective operation of the County Criminal Justice System.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** That the Department of Public Safety and Justice Affairs, the Sheriff's Department, the Office of the Clerk of Courts and the Office of the Prosecutor are hereby directed to work with the Department of Internal Auditing to develop a plan to review the Cuyahoga County "criminal justice system," such plan to be completed and reported out to Council within six months of the enactment of this Resolution.

#### **SECTION 2:** That the plan shall include, but not be limited to:

- a. Identification of all of the partners directly involved with the administration of criminal justice in Cuyahoga County;
- b. Determination of what information may be necessary to conduct a comprehensive review of the criminal justice system.
- c. Recommendations about whether the Department of Internal Audit has the capacity to conduct such a review; or whether the review should be completed by an outside reviewer.
- d. Preliminary estimates of the cost of such a review.
- e. Any other recommendations deemed necessary for Council's determination to proceed with the review.

**SECTION 3:** That the departments and offices charged with developing the plan to review the Cuyahoga County criminal justice system shall consult with existing bodies in Cuyahoga County, including the Courts and the "Justice System Reform Governing Board," and shall utilize existing data, statistics, and reports prepared by the partners involved with the administration of the criminal justice in Cuyahoga County to determine what additional information may be necessary to conduct the review.

**SECTION 4:** That the departments and offices charged with developing the plan and any other County office, department or agency created by or specifically recognized in the Charter of Cuyahoga County and directly involved with the

administration of criminal justice in Cuyahoga County are hereby directed to cooperate in the planning for such a review of the criminal justice system.

**SECTION 5**. It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County and the reasons set forth in the preamble. WHEREAS, Article XII, Section 12.09 of the Charter of Cuyahoga County provides that "The Charter Review Commission may propose to the Council such amendments to this Charter as it shall deem appropriate" and "Council shall vote within sixty days after the proposals are received on whether or not to submit the proposals to the electors at the next general election held more than sixty days after its vote on the proposed amendments"; and

WHEREAS, Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of Cuyahoga County provides that "Proposed amendments to this Charter shall be submitted to the electors of the County in the manner provided for by the Ohio Constitution"; and

WHEREAS, Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution provides that the "legislative authority" "of any county may by a two-thirds vote of its members" submit by resolution charter amendments to the electors of the county "to be voted upon at the first general election occurring not sooner than sixty days after their submission"; and

WHEREAS, this Council believes it is in the best interest of the citizens of the County of Cuyahoga to amend the County Charter to clarify the role of the Board of Revision.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF **CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:**

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XII, Sections 12.09 and 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby authorizes and directs that there shall be submitted to a vote of qualified electors of the County of Cuyahoga, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2013, the question of amending Article VI, Section 6.02 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, the respective text to be as set forth herein, with boldfaced text being added and crossed out text being deleted as follows:

#### SECTION 6.02 BOARD OF REVISION.

There shall be one or more Boards of Revision, each consisting of three electors of the County. Two members of each board, who shall not be of the same political party, shall be appointed by the Council, and one member shall be appointed by the County Executive, each for a term of three years. Each Board of Revision shall exercise all duties of a county board of revision as prescribed by general law. The Council may provide for compensation for members of a Board of Revision.

- (1) The County shall have a single Board of Revision, consisting of three members, which shall perform all powers and duties of county boards of revision under general law and such other powers and duties not inconsistent therewith as provided herein or by ordinance. As of the effective date of this provision, the Board shall consist of the County Executive, one appointee of the Council President, and, at the choice of the County Executive, either the Fiscal Officer or Treasurer.
  - (a) At the choice of the Council President, the Council President's appointee may either be a member of Council or any other elector of the County. The term of the Council President's first appointee shall be from the effective date of this provision until January 4, 2016. The term of subsequent appointees shall be for a period of two years commencing on the fifth day of January and every two years thereafter.
  - (b) If a vacancy occurs in the Council President's appointee position, the Council President shall appoint a new member to complete the unexpired term.
  - (c) The Council President's appointee shall not belong to the same political party as the County Executive at the time of the appointment.
- (2) The Board shall elect a chairperson, a secretary, and other officers as it deems appropriate at its organizational meetings.
- (3) The Board shall have the power to set the hearing schedule for matters before it, and to make and amend its own internal operating rules, procedures, and regulations.
- (4) The Board may employ administrative staff, including an administrator, as it deems necessary, to assist it in the performance of its powers and duties. All employees of the Board shall be unclassified employees.
- (5) The Board shall employ or otherwise engage individuals to serve on one or more three-member hearing panels to hear complaints as to the value of real property and to perform other duties assigned to them by the Board. The individuals serving on hearing panels shall be electors of the County; shall serve at the pleasure of the Board; and shall abide by the Board's hearing schedule, rules, procedures, and regulations in performing their duties.
- (6) The Board shall establish merit qualifications for the individuals serving on hearing panels as it deems necessary for them to perform their duties. In establishing the merit qualifications, the Board shall strive to employ or otherwise engage highly qualified individuals to elevate the citizens' trust in the system.

- (7) The Board may not itself hear complaints related to the valuation of real property, and no member of the Board may serve on any of the hearing panels. The decisions of the hearing panels relating to real property valuation complaints shall constitute the final decisions of the Board and shall not be subject to further review by the Board itself.
- (8) No member of the Board or any of the hearing panels may have any ex parte communications with any party, elected officials, county employees, or any other person regarding the merits of a pending matter before the panel. The Board shall enact and publish additional rules, procedures, or regulations to ensure that the system is administered fairly, including rules, procedures, or regulations governing conflicts of interest.
- (9) The Board may utilize any boards of revision or hearing panels in existence as of the effective date of this provision as hearing panels to avoid any interruption of services.
- **SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution, and Article XII, Sections 12.09 and 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby directs that the proposed amendment of Article VI, Section 6.02 shall be submitted to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be as follows:

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CHARTER

Shall Article VI, Section 6.02 Board of Revision of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga be amended to clarify the role of the Board of Revision?

- **SECTION 3.** If the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, the existing provisions of Article VI, Section 6.02 which are inconsistent herewith, shall be and the same are hereby repealed effective as of the date on which such amendment becomes effective.

No more than two of the three members of the Personnel Review Commission Human Resource Commission shall be members of the same political party. The Personnel Review Commission is authorized to employ persons in the service of the County. The Personnel Review Commission Human Resource Commission shall be responsible for administering, for and in cooperation with the officers, agencies, boards and commissions of the County, an efficient and economical system for the employment of persons in the public service of the County according to merit and fitness. The County's human resources policies and systems, including ethics policies for County employees, shall be established by ordinance and shall be administered in such manner as will eliminate unnecessary expense and duplication of effort, while ensuring that persons will be employed in the public service without discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, sexual orientation, disability, age or ancestry. The Personnel Review Commission shall submit a recommendation regarding any ordinance concerning County personnel policies prior to passage by County Council. In the event the Personnel Review Commission does not endorse an ordinance, the Personnel Review Commission may provide a Statement of Non-Endorsement to the County Council.

The term of office of each member of the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall be six years. The terms shall be staggered so that no term expires within less than two years of the expiration of any other term. The **County Executive** Council shall fill a vacancy occurring for an unexpired term in the same manner as a regular appointment.

Of the terms of office for the initial appointees, one shall be appointed for a term of six years, one shall be appointed for a term of four years and one shall be appointed for a term of two years. The County Executive shall nominate the initial appointees to the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission not later than March 1, 2011 and thereafter within thirty days after the occurrence of a vacancy. The members of the Personnel Review Commission serving as of the effective date of this provision may serve until their existing term expires and may be subject to reappointment by Council.

No member of the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall hold any other public office or public employment with the County. The Council shall

establish a per diem compensation for the members of the **Personnel Review** Commission Human Resource Commission.

The County Executive Council may remove any member of the Personnel Review Commission Human Resource Commission for inefficiency, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office after notice and public hearing before the Council, provided that eight two-thirds of the members of the Council concur.

# SECTION 9.02 AUTHORITY OF HUMAN RESOURCE COMMISSIONPERSONNEL REVIEW COMMISSION.

The **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall have:

- (1) Responsibility for the resolution or disposition of all personnel matters, with authority to appoint hearing officers to hear all employee appeals previously under the jurisdiction of the State Personnel Board of Review, including those of classified employees who work for the County Executive, Prosecuting Attorney, County Planning Commission, and the County Public Defender;
- (2) Responsibility for administration of countywide compliance with federal and state laws regarding personnel matters within the County Executive's organization and departments which the County is the reporting unit and for maintenance of records required by such laws;
- (3) For the County Executive's organization and departments, authority to ensure:
  - Pay equity for like positions;
  - Standardization of benefits;
  - Approval of qualifications;
  - Consistent discipline;
  - Training of management in personnel practices;
  - Training of employees in job functions;
  - Training for total quality management;
  - Consistent administration of performance management system;
  - Coordination of recruitment;
  - Compliance with ethics resolutions or ordinances as passed by the Council;
- (4) Responsibility for creation of rules and policies related to the Personnel Review Commission's authority set forth in this Charter in accordance with the human resources policies established by ordinance;
- (45) Such other functions as may be deemed necessary by the Council for the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission to carry out its mission and purpose.

#### SECTION 9.03 CLASSIFICATION.

The **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission shall administer a clear, countywide classification and salary administration system for technical, specialist, administrative and clerical functions with a limited number of broad pay ranges within each classification. The classification system shall include the employees of the offices listed in Article V of this Charter, as well as those of the County Executive and County Council except those employees in positions designated as unclassified by general law.

The classification system shall, to the extent permitted by the Ohio Constitution, include the employees of all offices, officers, agencies, departments, boards, commissions or other public bodies, other than separate political subdivisions, that are supported in whole or in part from taxes levied, or other financial assistance provided, by the County.

#### SECTION 9.04 APPOINTING AUTHORITIES.

The County Executive and the officers, offices, agencies, departments, boards and commissions and other public bodies, who under this Charter or under general law are authorized to employ persons in the service of the County, shall be appointing authorities. Persons interested in employment with the County shall make application to the Department of Human Resources. No appointing authority shall appoint a person to fill a vacancy in the classified service who does not meet the qualifications for that position approved by the **Personnel Review Commission** Human Resource Commission. All Appointing Authorities shall strive in making appointments in both the classified and the unclassified service to ensure that the diversity of the population of the County is reflected in the persons who are employed by the County.

#### SECTION 9.05 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES.

There shall be a Department of Human Resources, which shall, as part of its duties, serve under the direction of and perform such functions on behalf of the Personnel Review Commission Human Resource Commission as the Commission shall delegate prescribe. The Department of Human Resources shall provide regular reports to the Personnel Review Commission regarding the Department's performance of such delegated functions in accordance with timeframes established by the Personnel Review Commission.

# SECTION 9.06 DIRECTOR OF HUMAN RESOURCES: POWERS, DUTIES AND QUALIFICATIONS.

The Director of Human Resources shall be appointed by the Executive, subject to confirmation by Council, and shall serve at the pleasure of the County Executive. The Director of Human Resources shall manage County employment matters including hiring, firing, discipline, layoffs, training, benefits, time and attendance, HR compliance, and drafting policies and procedures. The Director shall be responsible for offering support to the law department on all labor and employment matters. The Director of Human Resources shall have a minimum of five years of experience advising or working in the public sector, experience in employment related matters, management experience or related relevant experience.

**SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution, and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby directs that the proposed amendment of Article II, Sections 2.03(12) and Article IX, Sections 9.01 through 9.05 and to add Section 9.06 shall be submitted to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be as follows:

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CHARTER

Shall Article II, Section 2.03(12) Powers and Duties, and Article IX of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga be amended to rename the "Human Resource Commission" the "Personnel Review Commission," to provide that the County Council shall have the authority to appoint and remove members of the Personnel Review Commission, to clarify the Personnel Review Commission's administrative powers and duties, and to formally establish an office of the Director of Human Resources?

**SECTION 3.** If the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, the existing provisions of Article II, Section 2.03(12) and Article IX, Sections 9.01 through 9.05 and the addition of 9.06 which are inconsistent herewith, shall be and the same are hereby repealed effective as of the date on which such amendment becomes effective.

#### SECTION 5.01 APPOINTMENT; CONFIRMATION BY COUNCIL.

Each of the officers provided for in this Article V shall be appointed by the County Executive subject to confirmation by Council, and shall serve at the pleasure of the County Executive **unless otherwise specified herein**.

#### SECTION 5.08 SHERIFF: POWERS, DUTIES AND QUALIFICATIONS.

(1) **Powers and Duties.** All powers and duties now or hereafter vested in or imposed upon county sheriffs by general law shall be carried out by the appointed Sheriff.

- (2) Qualifications. The Sheriff shall possess and continue to maintain the qualifications provided by general law for the office of county sheriff and in addition shall have had at least five years' experience in law enforcement or in correctional facilities management.
- (3) Term. The Sheriff shall be appointed for a term of four years. Each four-year term shall commence on the first day of January of the year following the beginning of the term of office of the County Executive.
- (4) Removal. The County Executive may remove the Sheriff from office subject to the approval of at least two-thirds of the Council.
- (5) Vacancy. In the case of a vacancy prior to the expiration of the four-year term, the County Executive shall appoint a Sheriff to complete the unexpired term, subject to confirmation by Council. In the case of a vacancy prior to but within two years of the expiration of the four-year term, the County Executive may appoint a Sheriff to complete the unexpired term and a subsequent four-year term, subject to confirmation by Council.
- **SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution, and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby directs that the proposed amendment of Article V, Sections 5.01 and 5.08 shall be submitted to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be as follows:

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CHARTER

Shall Article V, Section 5.01 Appointment; Confirmation by Council and Section 5.08 Sheriff: Powers, Duties and Qualifications of the Charter of Cuyahoga County be amended to establish a term of appointment and process of removal of the Sheriff?

- **SECTION 3.** If the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, the existing provisions of Article V, Sections 5.01 and 5.08 are inconsistent herewith, shall be and the same are hereby repealed effective as of the date on which such amendment becomes effective.
- **SECTION 4.** The Clerk of this Council is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections no earlier than one hundred twenty (120) days and not later than sixty (60) days before the November 5, 2013 election. The Clerk is further directed to take all other actions required by law relative to the submission of said amendment for said election, including, if required by law, mailing or otherwise distributing a copy of said proposed amendment to each of the electors of the County as far as may be reasonably possible prior to thirty (30) days before said election.
- **SECTION 5.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective to enable the Clerk of Council to perform her duties in time for the amendments to be properly placed on the November 5, 2013 election. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight (8) members of Council, it shall become immediately effective.

#### Dear Ms. Schmotzer:

A brief summary of the fiscal items that will be submitted for consideration for adoption on first reading at the regular Council meeting scheduled for August 27, 2013, are presented below.

<u>Additional Appropriation Summary</u> – Additional appropriations are needed when there is a new or increased revenue source, or a revision to the original appropriation level that is required to cover expenditures that exceed the original estimate. A budget review document is provided for General Fund and Health & Human Services Levy Fund impact items.

Area/community rates will be considered capital funds spent on unplanned projects to reimburse the area account and/or pay long-term capital dept (level two financing). Lastly, the Sanitary Engineering Division routinely evaluates the condition of the sanitary system and attempts to repair/replace systems where necessary, (planned capital projects) and within funds available for this (level three financing). It is the intent of the department to continue financing its operation at all three levels and to continue its program inaccordance with contractual obligatins and effective engineering practices.
- 3. The rates are in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code Chapter 6117.02 stating the County may levy an assessment to pay the cost and expense of the maintenance and operation of such sewerage improvements, including the disposal of sewage.



WHEREAS, Ohio House Bill 59 (Budget Bill) amended various Sections of the Ohio Revised Code Chapter 955, et seq. regarding the establishment of mandated options for dog registration for a 1 year dog license or 3 year dog license or permanent dog license effective December 1, 2013; and,

WHEREAS, Ohio House Bill 59 amended Section 955.14(C) of the Ohio Revised Code regarding the fee amounts payable to the Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine for each dog kennel registration; and,

WHEREAS, dog license fees were previously adopted in Cuyahoga County Resolution No. 082545 dated June 5, 2008; Resolution No. R2011-0344 dated February 14, 2012; and Resolution No. R2012-0200 dated October 9, 2012.

WHEREAS, the County is now required to annually administer a multi-option dog owner registration fee system effective December 1, 2013 beginning with the 2014 dog license renewal and purchase period.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the efficient and effective operation of the County.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 713 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

### **CHAPTER 713: Dog License Fees**

### Section 713.01 Dog License Fees Established

Effective December 1, 2013, Cuyahoga County shall collect a Dog License Fee pursuant to O.R.C. Chapter 955, et seq. and other applicable laws for registration for a 1 year dog license, 3 year dog license and permanent dog license. The dog license fees for spayed and neutered dogs shall be as follows:

A. 1 Year Dog License Fee is \$20 per dog.

- B. 3 Year Dog License Fee is \$60 per dog.
- C. Permanent Dog License Fee is \$200 per dog.
- D. Kennel Registration Fee is \$100.
- E. The Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine shall receive 10 cents for each 1 Year Dog License; 30 cents for each 3 Year Dog License; and \$1.00 for each Permanent Dog License.

**SECTION 2.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 3.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
