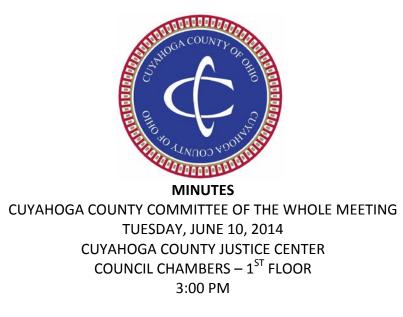

### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Council President Connally called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.

Mr. Edward Rybka, Director of the Department of Building and Housing for the City of Cleveland and on behalf of Mayor Frank Jackson, addressed Council in support of the establishment of a demolition fund.

Mr. Frank Ford, Chair of the Vacant and Abandoned Property Action Council and Senior Policy Advisory for the Thriving Communities Institute then gave a presentation to Council regarding housing and market conditions in Cuyahoga County, including background on the housing "landscape" in Cuyahoga County, foreclosures, vacancies and abandonments, home sale price trends, consequences of market decline and tools for market stabilization. Councilmembers asked questions of Mr. Ford, which he answered accordingly. Discussion ensued.

WHEREAS, Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of Cuyahoga County provides that "Proposed amendments to this Charter shall be submitted to the electors of the County in the manner provided for by the Ohio Constitution"; and

WHEREAS, Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution provides that the "legislative authority... of any county may by a two-thirds vote of its members" submit by resolution charter amendments to the electors of the county "to be voted upon at the first general election occurring not sooner than sixty days after their submission"; and

WHEREAS, this Council believes it is in the best interest of the citizens of the County of Cuyahoga to amend the County Charter to require the County Executive to have been an elector of the County for at least two years prior to filing a declaration of candidacy, and to prevent a Council member from being disqualified due to redistricting from serving the full term to which the member was elected.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby authorizes and directs that there shall be submitted to a vote of qualified electors of the County of Cuyahoga, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2014, the question of amending Article II, Section 2.01 and Article III, Section 3.03 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, the respective text to be as set forth herein, with boldfaced text being added and crossed out text being deleted as follows:

#### SECTION 2.01 COUNTY EXECUTIVE

The County Executive shall be the chief executive officer of the County. The County Executive shall first be elected at the 2010 general election and shall hold office for a term of four years commencing on the first day of January 2011. Any candidate for election as County Executive shall **have been an** elector of the County **for** at **least two** 

<u>years immediately prior to</u> the time of filing the declaration of candidacy, shall be nominated and elected in the manner provided for county officers by general law and this Charter and during the entire term of office shall remain an elector of the County. The County Executive shall not, except as authorized by the Council, hold or accept other employment or public office.

\*\*\*\*

### SECTION 3.03 RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT

A Council candidate shall have been an elector of the County for at least two years immediately prior to filing of a declaration of candidacy or appointment to fill a vacancy and shall also have been a resident of the district he or she wishes to serve for at least thirty days immediately prior to filing of candidacy or appointment to fill a vacancy. # NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby authorizes and directs that there shall be submitted to a vote of qualified electors of the County of Cuyahoga, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2014, the question of amending Article VI, Sections 6.01 and 6.02, and Article XI, Section 11.01 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, the respective text to be as set forth herein, with boldfaced text being added, crossed out text being deleted and subsequent sections renumbered as follows:

### ARTICLE VI - BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

### SECTION 6.01 BUDGET COMMISSION.

The Budget Commission shall consist of the County Executive, the Fiscal Officer the Council President and the Prosecuting Attorney. The Fiscal Officer shall serve as an ex officio, non-voting member. Members of the Budget Commission may appoint

deputies to serve on their behalf. The Budget Commission shall exercise all powers and perform all duties of a county budget commission as prescribed by general law.

### SECTION 6.02 BOARD OF REVISION

(1) The County shall have a single Board of Revision, consisting of three members, which shall perform all powers and duties of county boards of revision under general law and such other powers and duties not inconsistent therewith as provided herein or by ordinance. As of the effective date of this provision, the Board shall consist of the County Executive, one appointee of the Council President, and <u>one elector of the County appointed by the County Executive and confirmed by Council</u>, at the choice of the County Executive, either the Fiscal Officer or Treasurer.

(a) At the choice of the Council President, the Council President's appointee may either be a member of Council or any other elector of the County. The term of the Council President's first appointee shall be from the effective date of this provision until January 4, 2016. The term of subsequent appointees shall be for a period of two years commencing on the fifth day of January and every two years thereafter.

# (b) The term of the County Executive's first appointee shall be from the effective date of confirmation until January 4, 2017. The term of subsequent appointees shall be for a period of two years commencing on the fifth day of January and every two years thereafter.

(b)(c) If a vacancy occurs in the Council President's appointee position <u>either of</u> the appointed positions, the Council President proper appointing authority shall appoint a new member to complete the unexpired term.

(c)(d) The Council President's appointee shall not belong to the same political party as the County Executive.

- (2) The Board shall elect a chairperson, a secretary, and other officers as it deems appropriate at its organizational meetings.
- (3) The Board shall have the power to set the hearing schedule for matters before it, and to make and amend its own internal operating rules, procedures, and regulations.
- (4) The Board may employ administrative staff, including an administrator, as it deems necessary, to assist it in the performance of its powers and duties. All employees of the Board shall be unclassified employees.
- (5) The Board shall employ or otherwise engage individuals to serve on one or more three-member hearing panels to hear complaints as to the value of real property and to perform other duties assigned to them by the Board. The individuals serving on hearing panels shall be electors of the County; shall serve at the pleasure of the board; and shall abide by the Board's hearing schedule, rules, procedures, and regulations in performing their duties.

- (6) The Board shall establish merit qualifications for the individuals serving on hearing panels as it deems necessary for them to perform their duties. In establishing the merit qualifications, the Board shall strive to employ or otherwise engage highly qualified individuals to elevate the citizens' trust in the system.
- (7) The Board may not itself hear complaints related to the valuation of real property, and no member of the Board may serve on any of the hearing panels. The decisions of the hearing panels relating to real property valuation complaints shall constitute the final decisions of the Board and shall not be subject to further review by the Board itself.
- (8) No member of the Board or any of the hearing panels may have any ex parte communications with any party, elected officials, county employees, or any other person regarding the merits of a pending matter before the panel. The Board shall enact and publish additional rules, procedures, or regulations to ensure that the system is administered fairly, including rules, procedures, or regulations governing conflicts of interest.
- (9) The Board may utilize any boards of revision or hearing panels in existence as of the effective date of this provision as hearing panels to avoid any interruption of services.

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#### ARTICLE XI – INTERNAL AUDITING SECTION 11.01 COUNTY AUDIT COMMITTEE

The County Audit Committee shall provide internal auditing to assist the County Executive, Fiscal Officer, the Council, and other county officers and departments, institutions, boards, commissions, authorities, organizations, and agencies of the County government funded in whole or in part by County funds in providing taxpayers of the County with efficient and effective services. The County Audit Committee shall consist of the Fiscal Officer, who shall serve as chair of the committee, the County Executive, the President of Council and two three residents of the County appointed by the County Executive and confirmed by Council for terms ending one year, and two years, and three years, respectively, following the end of the term of the office of the then County Executive. The County Audit Committee shall elect a chairperson at the first regular meeting in each calendar year. Upon a vacancy of an appointed position on the County Audit Committee, the County Executive shall appoint a replacement to fill the incomplete term, subject to confirmation by Council. An appointed member of the County Audit Committee may be removed by a vote of a majority of the County Audit Committee, subject to the approval of County Council. The County Audit Committee shall meet at least quarterly and shall oversee internal and external audits.

**SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution, and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby directs that the proposed amendment amending Article VI, Sections 6.01 and 6.02, and Article XI, Section 11.01 shall be submitted to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be as follows:

#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CHARTER

# Shall Article VI, Sections 6.01 and 6.02 and Article XI, Section 11.01 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga be amended to change the composition of various County Boards and Commissions to ensure independence of judgment of all members?

**SECTION 3.** If the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, the existing provisions of Article VI, to the extent that they are inconsistent herewith, shall be and the same are hereby repealed effective as of the date on which such amendment becomes effective.

**SECTION 4.** The Clerk of this Council is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections no earlier than one hundred twenty (120) days and not later than sixty (60) days before the November 4, 2014 election. The Clerk is further directed to take all other actions required by law relative to the submission of said amendment for said election, including, if required by law, mailing or otherwise distributing a copy of said proposed amendment to each of the electors of the County as far as may be reasonably possible prior to thirty (30) days before said election.

**SECTION 5.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective to enable the Clerk of Council to perform her duties in time for the amendment to be properly placed on the November 4, 2014 election. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of eight (8) members of Council, it shall become immediately effective.

**SECTION 6.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**SECTION 1.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby authorizes and directs that there shall be submitted to a vote of qualified electors of the County of Cuyahoga, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2014, the question of amending Article III, Sections 3.05 & 3.06; and enacting Article XIV, Section 14.01 of the Charter of Cuyahoga County, the respective text to be as set forth herein, with boldfaced text being added and crossed out text being deleted as follows:

### SECTION 3.05 COUNCIL VACANCIES

When a vacancy occurs in a Council position, precinct committee members of the same political party and from the same district as the vacating member shall choose a replacement within thirty days of the occurrence of the vacancy. If the precinct committee members fail to make the appointment in the allotted time, the Council shall have thirty days to **appoint a replacement** make the appointment. If the Council fails to make the appointment, the Council fails to make the appointment.

SECTION 3.06 COUNCIL VACANCIES; NO PARTY AFFILIATION-[Repealed] When a vacancy occurs in a Council position and the person vacating the position was not a member of a political party with precinct committee members, the Council shall choose a replacement within thirty days of the occurrence of the vacancy. If Council fails to appoint a replacement within thirty days, the County Executive shall make the appointment.

### ARTICLE XIV: ELECTION OF COUNTY OFFICERS

### SECTION 14.01 NONPARTISAN ELECTION

<u>Candidates for the offices of County Executive, Prosecuting Attorney, and County</u> <u>Council shall be nominated at non-partisan primary elections to be held on the dates</u> <u>provided by general law for the holding of primary elections of county officers. The</u> <u>two candidates receiving the highest number of votes at each primary election shall</u> <u>have their names printed on the official ballot at the general election, and the names</u> <u>of no other candidates shall be printed thereon. A write-in space shall be provided</u> <u>on each ballot in the manner prescribed by general law.</u>

**SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Article X, Section 4 of the Ohio Constitution, and Article XII, Section 12.10 of the Charter of the County of Cuyahoga, this Council hereby directs that the proposed amendment to Article III, Sections 3.05 & 3.06 and enactment of Article XIV, Section 14.01 shall be submitted to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, and the question to be submitted on the ballot shall be as follows:

### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO COUNTY CHARTER

# Shall Article III, Sections 3.05 & 3.06 be amended; and Article XIV, Section 14.01 of the Charter of Cuyahoga County be enacted to remove party affiliation from elected County offices?

This provision shall not apply to any such adjustments and/or awards that have been specifically provided for in the biennial budget then in effect.

# Section 701.04: Requests for New Programs or Services Requiring an Additional Appropriation

Any requests for new programs or services that require an additional appropriation as a part of the biennial budget process or throughout the fiscal year shall include the following information and sections as part of the request for Council's consideration by the requesting department, board, agency, commission or other authority:

- (A) Program or service overview detailing the request for additional appropriation
- (B) Program or service budget itemize expenses related to personnel, other operating and capital outlays
- (C) Program or service Milestones/Timeline outline the program or service's goals and objectives as well as key performance measures in order to ensure these goals or objectives are met
- (D) Program or service Staffing Levels document the projected staffing levels required for the program or service including titles and salary and benefits

The requirements of this section shall also apply to existing programs or services only if there is a major expansion or shift in policy to existing programs or services but does not apply to additional appropriations that do not expand the goals or objectives of existing programs or services.

**SECTION 2.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- k) Towards Employment, Incorporated in the amount not-to-exceed \$100,000.00 for the Network 4 Success Fatherhood Program.
- The Children's Museum of Cleveland in the amount not-to-exceed \$30,000.00 for the Dad's Count Program.

WHEREAS, the goals of the Fatherhood Initiative are: (1) to promote public awareness of the importance of the role of a father, (2) to provide access to public services to young men and fathers in order to educate them about fatherhood and responsibilities of being a father, and (3) to fund fatherhood related programs at the county level; and

WHEREAS, this project is funded 100% by Health and Human Services Levy; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby makes awards on RQ29544 to various providers for various programs and services for the Cuyahoga County Fatherhood Initiative for the period 7/1/2014 - 6/30/2015 as follows:

- a) Career Development and Placement Strategies, Inc. in the amount not-toexceed \$100,000.00 for the Rising Above Program.
- b) The Centers for Families and Children in the amount not-to-exceed \$83,000.00 for the Families and Fathers Together Program.
- c) Cuyahoga County District Board of Health in the amount not-to-exceed \$70,000.00 for the Prevent Premature Fatherhood Program.
- d) Domestic Violence & Child Advocacy Center in the amount not-to-exceed \$83,000.00 for the Supervised Visitation Program.

- e) JDC Advertising in the amount not-to-exceed \$70,000.00 for a Public Awareness Campaign.
- f) The MetroHealth System in the amount not-to-exceed \$44,000.00 for the Boot Camp for New Dads Program.
- g) Passages Connecting Fathers and Sons, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$100,000.00 for the Jobs for Dads Program.
- h) University Settlement Courts, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$52,000.00 for the Healthy Fathering Program.

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section 8.01 of the Cuyahoga County Charter mandates that "There shall be a Department of Health and Human Services, which shall administer all programs and activities for which the County has or has assumed responsibility for the protection and enhancement of the health, education and well-being of County residents and that are not assigned by general law to other boards, agencies or officials, and shall coordinate its activities and cooperate with such other boards, agencies and officers in order to avoid duplication of services and activities"; and,

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Health and Human Services has proposed the establishment of a Social Impact Financing Fund for the purpose of funding contracts to improve outcomes and lower costs for contracted government services in Cuyahoga County, hereinafter referred to as "pay for success contracts"; and,

WHEREAS, the Social Impact Financing Fund shall fund health and human services to meet the principal goal of improving the welfare of county residents, including outcomes consistent with the implementation of evidence based interventions to address significant social problems and the coordination of social service systems to reduce their duplication of services and improve program effectiveness; and,

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Health and Human Services has proposed that the Social Impact Financing Fund should fund specific programs to substantially improve the lives of vulnerable residents of the county, including but not limited to children and families, senior citizens, victims of violence and trauma, the homeless, and those living with mental health and substance abuse problems; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1**. Chapter 715 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

### **Chapter 715: Social Impact Financing Fund**

### Section 715.01 Fund Established

There is hereby established the Cuyahoga County Social Impact Financing Fund for the purpose of leveraging private investment in Cuyahoga County's social service system. The Fund is to be subsidized through the County's Health and Human Services Levy proceeds.

### Section 715.02 Fund Uses

The Social Impact Financing Fund may only be used to match non-county funds invested in Cuyahoga County's social service system as follows:

- (A) Private investment funds will be used to fund social services that are expected to prevent clients' ongoing need for services, lead to County budget savings, and improved outcomes; and
- (B) Success payments will be made from the Social Impact Financing Fund to service providers or convening entities to repay the private investment. The pay-for-success contracts will provide the terms for the success payments.

### Section 715.03 Contracts funded through Social Impact Financing Fund

The Executive, through the appropriate county departments, may negotiate and enter into pay for success contracts as follows:

- (A) Each such contract shall generally comply with the following guidelines:
  - (1) Since pay-for-success contracts are a performance-based contracting strategy, they must include the requirement that a substantial portion of the government's payment is conditioned on the achievement of specific outcomes based on defined performance targets:
    - (a) Cuyahoga County will make success payments to service providers from the Social Impact Financing Fund following the service providers' successful provision of services and achievement of the proposed outcomes. The provision of services may be through direct work with the target population or subcontracts;

- (b) Service delivery will utilize evidence based and/or informed interventions that have been evaluated to achieve positive outcomes; and
- (c) The County will establish precise performance targets that the service providers must meet to receive any County success payment for services. County data will be used to validate the achievement of performance targets.
- (2) The contracts must include an objective process by which an independent evaluator will determine whether the performance targets have been achieved:
  - (a) The independent evaluator will be a college, university, or other objective entity that has the appropriate research and evaluation background, skills and capacity to analyze the identified county data;
  - (b) The independent evaluator will not have a stake in the achievement of the performance targets or outcomes; and
  - (c) The independent evaluator must not have conflicts of interest with the service providers or County.
  - (d) The contracts must include a calculation of the amount and timing of payments that would be earned by the service provider during each year of the agreement if performance targets are achieved as determined by the independent evaluator:
  - (e) The value of the payments will be based upon the cashable savings to the County and/or targeted outcomes achieved from the service delivery;
  - (f) For multi-year projects, the independent evaluator will evaluate change within the target population on an ongoing basis; and
  - (g) The evaluator will present ongoing findings to the County and services providers. The County and service providers will identify corrective actions to address under-performance of the project or an expedited wind-down of the services.
- (B) All contracts entered pursuant to this Chapter shall be subject to the approval of the appropriate contracting approval authority under Chapter

501 of the County Code. The request for approval from the appropriate contracting approval authority shall include the following:

- (1) The rate of the County's match of non-county funds; and
- (2) A determination by the Director of Health and Human Services and the Fiscal Officer that, in their reasonable judgment, the contract will result in significant performance improvements and budgetary savings across all impacted agencies if the performance targets are achieved.
- (C) All contracts entered pursuant to this Chapter shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Law or his or her designee before being executed by the County Executive.
- (D) Contracts entered pursuant to this Chapter whose duration extends beyond the County's budget cycle shall be subject to the County's annual appropriation process. For any contracts entered pursuant to this Chapter, the Fiscal Officer shall annually encumber the portion of the contract funds through the next year of the contract. The County's payment obligations shall be determined in the contracts themselves, as approved by the Director of Law and the appropriate contracting approval authority under Chapter 501, and nothing in this Chapter may be interpreted to automatically obligate the County to pay under the contract in the event that the performance targets are not achieved.

# Section 715.04 Administration of Social Impact Financing Fund and Reporting to County Council

- (A) The Fiscal Officer shall administer the Social Impact Financing Fund and ensure that all funds appropriated as described in this Chapter are deposited into the Fund and shall make payments from the Fund in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contracts.
- (B) The Social Impact Financing Fund shall not exceed \$5,000,000.
- (C) The Fiscal Officer shall provide an annual status report on all contracts entered pursuant to this Chapter to County Council no later than May 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.

**SECTION 2.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County and the reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its

passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Criminal Investigation ("BCI") and the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") assess fees for performing background check services to the Sheriff's Department.

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Department expends personnel hours and uses County equipment and material to perform background check services.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 716 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

#### **Chapter 716: Background Check Service Fees (General Public)**

#### Section 716.01: Establishment of Fees for Fingerprints and Web Checks

The Sheriff's Department shall collect and deposit fees for concealed handgun licenses in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code. For all other fingerprint and background check services, the Sheriff's Department shall establish the fees as follows:

(A) The fees shall take into account the costs assessed to the Sheriff's Department by the Bureau of Criminal Investigation and the Federal Bureau of Investigation to perform the checks; and (B) The fees shall also take into account the costs incurred by the Sheriff's Department in performing these services, including personnel and technology costs.

### Section 716.02 Posting of Fees on Web Site

The Sheriff's Department shall post the most up-to-date fees to conduct background check services on its web site.

**SECTION 2.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety of the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

## Ordinance No. O2014-0020

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the State of Ohio in Substitute Senate Bill No. 359, effective December 22, 1992, authorized counties to levy an additional excise tax not to exceed one and one-half percent on transactions by which lodging by a hotel is or is to be furnished to transient guests for the purpose of contributing revenues for the acquisition, construction, equipping of a port authority educational and cultural facility in the county (i.e., generally known as the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Museum); and

WHEREAS, in 1993, Cuyahoga County levied said tax pursuant to then R.C. 5739.024(D) for the purpose of providing contributions as provided for in R.C. 307.671(B)(1) under a cooperative agreement entered into with the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority, the City of Cleveland, and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Museum ("Rock Hall") to enable the acquisition, construction, and equipping of the Rock Hall and for the purposes of paying debt service on such bonds, or notes in anticipation thereof, issued by the County for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and equipping the Rock Hall; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 5739.09(D), said tax shall remain in effect at the rate in which it was imposed for the period of time described in division (C) of R.C. 307.671 for which revenue from the tax has been pledged by the County pursuant to that section, but, to the extent provided in the cooperative agreement, for no lesser period that the period of time required for payment of the debt service charges on bonds, or notes in anticipation of bonds described in R.C. 307.671(B)(1)(b); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 5739.09(H)(2) and R.C. 5739.09(H)(6)(a), said tax may be extended.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a county entity.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 717 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

#### **CHAPTER 717: Extension of Bed Tax for Capital Improvements**

**Section 717.01: Definitions:** The following definitions shall apply for purposes of Chapter 717 of the County Code only:

- (A) "Bed Tax Cooperative Agreements" shall refer to the cooperative agreements entered between and among Cuyahoga County, the Cleveland-Cuyahoga County Port Authority, the City of Cleveland, and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Museum pursuant to then R.C. 5739.024(D) for the purpose of providing contributions as provided for in R.C. 307.671(B)(1).
- (B) **"Capital Improvement Bed Tax"** shall refer to the bed taxes imposed by Cuyahoga County in 1993 pursuant to then R.C. 5739.024(D) for the purpose of providing contributions as provided for in R.C. 307.671(B)(1).
- (C) "County-City Agreement" shall refer to the Agreement between the County and the Mayor of the City of Cleveland regarding the use of the extended Capital Improvement Bed Tax proceeds, as approved by a majority of the mayors of the other municipal corporations in the County pursuant to R.C. 5739.09(H)(6)(a).
- (D) **"Commencement Date"** shall refer to the first day of the month following the execution of the County-City Agreement.

#### Section 717.02: Deposit of Capital Improvement Bed Tax into General Fund

When proceeds of the Capital Improvement Bed Tax are no longer needed for their original purpose outlined in the Bed Tax Cooperative Agreements, said proceeds shall be deposited into the general fund of Cuyahoga County beginning on the Commencement Date.

#### Section 717.03: Extension of the Capital Improvement Bed Tax

The Capital Improvement Bed Tax is hereby extended at a rate of one and onehalf percent on transactions by which lodging by a hotel is or is to be furnished to transient guests beginning on the Commencement Date and shall remain in effect for a period of twenty years therefrom.

#### Section 717.04: Use of Extended Capital Improvement Bed Tax Proceeds

The Capital Improvement Bed Tax proceeds shall be used in accordance with the County-City Agreement. The County-City Agreement shall provide that the extended Capital Improvement Bed Tax Proceeds shall be used for the direct and indirect costs of capital improvements, including the financing of capital improvements. Examples of such capital improvements include, but are not limited to, capital improvements through Positively Cleveland or other local organizations for the following: major political and/or other large conventions, Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Induction ceremonies and/or events, and/or the support of tourism and/or other events.

### Section 717.05: Implementation of Extension of Capital Improvement Bed Tax

The County Executive or his authorized designee may take all actions, deposit and distribute the tax proceeds, and execute all documents, contracts, amendments and agreements on behalf of Cuyahoga County as necessary to consummate the transactions and carry out the terms and conditions set forth in this Chapter.

**SECTION 2.** To the extent this Ordinance may be required to be a Resolution under the Ohio Revised Code, it shall be deemed as such.

**SECTION 3.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the operation of the County and the reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
