# CUYAHOGA COUNTY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, JULY 22, 2014 CUYAHOGA COUNTY JUSTICE CENTER COUNCIL CHAMBERS – 1<sup>ST</sup> FLOOR 5:00 PM

## 1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Council President Connally at 5:00 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Council President Connally asked Clerk Schmotzer to call the roll. Councilmembers Greenspan, Miller, Brady, Germana, Gallagher, Schron, Conwell, Jones, Hairston, Simon and Connally were in attendance and a quorum was determined.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Council President Connally requested a moment of silent meditation be dedicated to the memory of the Malaysia Flight 17 victims and to the turmoil in the Middle East.

  - 1) <u>O2014-0018:</u> An Ordinance enacting Chapter 715 of the Cuyahoga County Code to establish a Social Impact Financing

Fund for the purpose of funding contracts to improve outcomes and lower costs for contracted government services in Cuyahoga County, and declaring the necessity that this Ordinance become immediately effective.
