### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Council President Brady called the meeting to order at 2:33 p.m.

### 2. ROLL CALL

Council President Brady asked Clerk Schmotzer to call the roll. Councilmembers Gallagher, Schron, Jones, Brown, Hairston, Simon, Greenspan, Miller and Brady were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Councilmembers Germana and Conwell entered the meeting shortly after the roll call was taken.

WHEREAS, O.R.C. 4117.10 (B) requires that a public employer submit a request for funds necessary to implement an agreement, and for approval of any other matter requiring the approval of the appropriate legislative body to the legislative body within fourteen days of the date on which the parties finalize the agreement, unless otherwise specified, but if the appropriate legislative body is not in session at the time, then within fourteen days after it convenes; and

WHEREAS, O.R.C. 4117.10(B) further states that the legislative body must approve or reject the submission as a whole, and the submission is deemed approved if the legislative body fails to act within thirty days after the public employer submits the agreement; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become effective immediately to ensure the efficient operation of the Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

WHEREAS, the County Executive, members of County Council, and various other county officers and employees have been called to serve on public bodies to represent the county, or otherwise serve in their capacity as a county official or employee; and,

WHEREAS, Section 2.03(6) of the Charter provides that the County Executive shall "...serve, in person or by his or her delegate, as a member of the County Budget Commission and of the County Board of Revision"; and,

WHEREAS, various public bodies have established statutory or procedural rules governing the designation of alternates, including but not limited to, the Board of Control, the Contracts and Purchasing Board, the Debarment Review Board, and the Administrative Rules Board; and,

WHEREAS, Council now seeks to establish a general process by which alternates may be designated to serve in lieu of any member, except where otherwise provided by law or by regulation of the public body on which the county officer or employee serves; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of the County.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** The existing language in Section 112.01 is hereby enacted as Section 114.02(B) and Chapter 112 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby repealed in its entirety. All references to Chapter 112 throughout the Code are hereby amended to refer to Chapter 114 as of the date of enactment of this ordinance.

**SECTION 2.** Chapter 112 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted as follows:

### **Chapter 112: Designation of Alternates**

### Section 112.01 Alternates serving in lieu of County Officers and Employees

A. Any county officer or employee who serves on a public body as a representative of Cuyahoga County, or otherwise serves in his or her official capacity as a county officer or employee, may designate an alternate to serve in his or her stead with full voting rights, on a temporary or recurring basis. Alternates shall hold any residency, professional background, license, or county employment requirements that the principal officer or employee is required to hold. This Section shall not apply where the designation of alternates is otherwise provided by law or by the regulations adopted by the public body on which the county officer or employee serves.

**SECTION 3.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Planning Commission was originally established pursuant to Section 713.22 of the Ohio Revised Code by the board of county commissioners; and,

WHEREAS, Section 713.22 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that the County Planning Commission shall consist of the board of county commissioners and eight other members appointed by the board; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2.03 of the Charter, the County Executive holds one seat on the County Planning Commission previously held by the board of county commissioners; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.62 (A) of the Ohio Revised Code provides that "[i]f any section of the Revised Code requires county representation on a board, commission, or authority by more than one county officer, and the charter vests the powers, duties, or functions of each county officer representing the county on the board, commission, or authority in fewer officers or in only a single county officer, the county officers or officer shall succeed to the representation of only one of the county officers on the board commission or authority. If any vacancy in the representation of the county on the board, commission or authority remains, the taxing authority of the county shall adopt a resolution to fill the vacancy;" and,

WHEREAS, Section 3.01 of the County Charter provides that "the Council shall be the legislative and taxing authority of the County...;" and,

WHEREAS, Council now seeks to specify the County's representation on the County Planning Commission; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of the County.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Section 206.12 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

### Section 206.12 Cuyahoga County Planning Commission

- A. The Cuyahoga County Planning Commission, established pursuant to section 713.22 of the Revised Code, shall be composed of the following members:
  - 1. Eight members appointed by the County Executive and confirmed by Council in accordance with section 713.22 of the Revised Code and the County Charter;
  - 2. The County Executive; and
  - 3. Two members of the County Council appointed by the President of Council.
- B. Alternates to the County Planning Commission appointed to serve on behalf of the County Executive or members of County Council shall be residents of the county and shall be designated in the same manner as the designation of alternates by members of boards of county commissioners, as provided in section 713.22 of the Revised Code.
- C. Paragraphs (A) and (B) shall not terminate or otherwise affect the term of those members serving on the County Planning Commission as of the effective date of this section.

**SECTION 2.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 3**. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, Sections 205.01 & 205.02 of the Cuyahoga County Code establish the Board of Control and Contracts and Purchasing Board for the purpose of reviewing, approving, or denying county contracts in accordance with the Contracts and Purchasing Procedures established in Chapter 501 of the County Code; and,

WHEREAS, the County Council, the Board of Control and the Contracts and Purchasing Board are each responsible for approving various exemptions and contracts up to and between various dollar thresholds; and,

WHEREAS, County Council is responsible, generally, for approving contracts exceeding \$500,000.00 in value; and,

WHEREAS, items before the Board of Control or the Contracts and Purchasing Board may be referred for Council approval by the respective board, the County Executive, the Council President, or by a resolution of County Council; and,

WHEREAS, in the interest effective and efficient operations, the Council now intends to consolidate the Board of Control and Contracts and Purchasing Board into a single Board of Control to approve all contracts above \$500.00 that do not otherwise require approval of County Council; and,

WHEREAS, the newly consolidated Board of Control will be responsible for reviewing, approving, or denying any contract or exemption that would have previously come before either the Contracts and Purchasing Board or the Board of Control; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of the County.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Section 205.01 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended as follows (additions are marked in bold and underline, deletions are struck-through):

### Section 205.01: Board of Control

- A. Board of Control Established
  - 1. Establishment: There is hereby created the Cuyahoga County Board of Control, consisting of seven members identified as follows:
    - a. The Cuyahoga County Executive;
    - b. The Fiscal Officer
    - c. The Director of Public Works
    - d. The Director of the Office of Procurement and Diversity
    - e. Three members of Cuyahoga County Council, appointed by the President of Council within seven (7) days after the enactment of this Section of the County Code and immediately following each Organizational Meeting of Cuyahoga County Council, who shall serve until their successors are appointed.
  - 2. Jurisdiction: The Board of Control shall have jurisdiction to review, approve, or deny all of the following:
    - a. Any contract, contract amendment, change order, purchase, sale, lease, grant, loan, exemption, procedure, or any other action that requires approval by the Board of Control pursuant to Chapter 501 of Cuyahoga County Code or any other County Code provisions.
    - b. Any other contract, contract amendment, change order, purchase, sale, lease, grant, loan, exemption, procedure, or other action that does not otherwise require approval by the County Council, or Board of Control, or the Contracts and Purchasing Board, but the County Executive determines to submit to the Board of Control for its consideration, review, and approval or denial.
    - c. Any other contract, purchase, sale, lease, grant made by the County, loan made by the County, or any procedure within the process of completing any such contract, purchase, sale, lease, grant, or loan for which the County Council, by Motion <u>Resolution or Ordinance</u> of Council, requires approval of the Board of Control.
- B. County Council Vacancies: Whenever any of the three positions on the Board of Control held by members of County Council becomes vacant, the President of County Council shall appoint another member of County Council to fill the position for the remainder of the term.

- C. Executive Branch Alternates: For each of the four executive branch members of the Board of Control, the County Executive shall appoint two alternates, one of whom shall attend meetings of the Board of Control whenever that member is unable to do so. Only employees of Cuyahoga County may be appointed as alternates on the Board of Control. Each alternate appointed shall, according to the County Executive's best judgment, have the greatest responsibility and most knowledge in the area(s) of primary responsibility of the person that the alternate replaces. Alternates shall serve at the pleasure of the County Executive, and the County Executive shall appoint a new alternate in the same way as the original designation whenever an alternate position becomes vacant. Appointments of alternates by the County Executive shall not be subject to confirmation by County Council.
- D. Council Alternates: At the same time that the President of Council appoints members to the Board of Control, the President of Council shall appoint at least three alternates who shall serve as a pool of alternates if any of the Council members are unavailable. Alternates shall be members <u>or employees</u> of County Council and shall serve until their successors are designated. The President of Council shall in the same way appoint an alternate for the remainder of the term whenever an alternate position becomes vacant.
- E. Alternate Have Full Rights: Any properly appointed alternate shall have all the rights and responsibilities of a member of the Board of Control when attending a meeting on behalf of a member.
- F. Officers: The County Executive shall serve as Chairperson of the Board of Control, and the Fiscal Officer shall serve as Vice Chairperson. If both the Executive and the Fiscal Officer are absent from any meeting, the Board of Control shall choose one of its members to chair that meeting. For the purposes of this section, County Executive and Fiscal Office shall include their alternates.
- G. No Additional Compensation, Collective Action, and Conflicts of Interest:
  - 1. No compensation in addition to a person's regular compensation as an employee of Cuyahoga County shall be provided for service on the Board of Control.
  - 2. The Board of Control is a board created by law, and its members act collectively, and in their official capacities, in the award of contracts and in taking any other action. It shall not be a conflict of interest for a Board member, including the County Executive or a director of a department or an office, to advocate before the Board, deliberate on, and or vote for or against a contract or any other item involving his or her department or office. It also shall not be a conflict of interest for a Council Board member to advocate before the Board, deliberate or against a contract or involving a purchase by County Council.

- H. Clerk of the Board of Control: The County Executive shall designate one staff person, who shall be the Clerk of the Board of Control, who shall publish agendas and meeting notices and record and publish minutes.
- I. Weekly Meetings: The Board of Control shall meet weekly, at a regular time determined by the Board of Control.
- J. Quorum: A quorum for the Board of Control shall consist of four (4) members attending personally or through their alternates.
- K. Vote Required for Board of Control Actions: Except as provided in Section <u>501.04(A)(g)</u> of the County Code, a motion to approve or disapprove any item before the Board of Control shall require the affirmative vote of any four (4) or more members. Amendments to items before the Board of Control and parliamentary motions may be adopted by a majority of those present, provided that a quorum is present.
- L. Rules of Procedure:
  - 1. The Board of Control shall, consistent with the provisions of this Section 205.01, adopt its own rules of procedure.
  - 2. Should any conflict arise between the rules of procedure of the Board of Control and Section 205.01 of the County Code, the requirements of County Code shall prevail.
  - 3. <u>The rules of the Board of Control may include procedures for the</u> <u>approval or preapproval of time sensitive, mission critical purchases not</u> <u>to exceed \$25,000.00 for any one time sensitive, mission critical purchase</u> <u>item.</u>
  - 4. <u>Nothing in this Section shall be interpreted to prohibit the Board of</u> <u>Control from utilizing consent agendas.</u>
- M. Public Participation: All meetings of the Board of Control shall be open to the public and shall begin by providing time for public comment on matters that are on the agenda for that day. The Board of Control shall also provide time for public comment, either at that time or later in the meeting, on matters that may come before the Board of Control in the future. The Board of Control may also require presenters to register with the Board of Control before speaking and may set a time limit on presentations, which may be extended at the discretion of the Chairperson.
- N. Agendas: The Clerk of the Board of Control shall publish the notice and agenda for each meeting on the county's website, post them at its office, and send them by electronic mail to each member of County Council no later than 6:00 p.m. on the second business day before the meeting. For each proposed contract to be considered, the agenda shall list the type of contract, a summary of the scope of

work, the anticipated costs, the expected schedule of payments by fiscal year, the source(s) of funding, the anticipated start date, and the vendor's name. For agenda items other than contracts, the Board of Control shall specify in its rules what documentation shall be submitted with the request.

- O. Special Meetings: The Board of Control may conduct a special meeting at a time other than its regularly scheduled time. In the event of an emergency, as determined by the County Executive in his or her discretion, or when the County Executive determines that it is advantageous to the County to have a special meeting, the Board of Control may conduct a meeting with less notice than that required by Section 205.01(N) of the County Code. For any special or emergency meeting, in addition to the notice requirements of Section 205.01(N), the Board of Control shall also send notice to all news media organizations that request to be notified of such meetings. A meeting may be conducted with less than 24 hours notice only to respond to an emergency concerning which immediate official action is required, and the notice and agenda shall state the nature of the emergency requiring such action.
- P. Minutes: The Clerk of the Board of Control shall promptly prepare and publish the minutes of each meeting of the Board of Control on the county's website, which shall in no case occur later than one week after each meeting.
- Q. Executive Session: Notwithstanding the requirement in Section 205.01(M) for open meetings, the Board of Control may go into Executive Session, only to discuss one or more of the topics permitted to be discussed in Executive Session pursuant to the Ohio Open Meetings Act or any other general law permitting such Executive Session. The published agenda for any meeting at which the Board of Control goes into Executive Session must include notice of the intent to go into Executive Session and a general description of the subject matter to be discussed. Prior to going into Executive Session. That motion must be approved by a majority of members present by roll call vote, with a quorum being present, and the motion shall state the topic(s) to be discussed in Executive Session and that no other topics may be discussed.
- R. Journal: The Clerk of the Board of Control shall maintain a Journal of the Board of Control, which shall be posted on the county's website and maintained as a permanent file, which may be in an electronic format. The Journal shall include the notice, agenda, and minutes of all Board of Control meetings.
- S. Public Meetings and Public Records: The Board of Control shall be subject to all state and county laws concerning public meetings and public records.
- T. Deadline for Agenda Items: The Clerk of the Board of Control, in consultation with the Fiscal Officer, the Director of Public Works, and the Director of the Office of Procurement and Diversity, may set a deadline for the submission of items for the agenda by county departments for each meeting.

U. Consideration of Items Not on the Agenda: The Board of Control may, by 2/3 vote of members present, with a quorum being present, allow consideration of items not on the agenda or items submitted after the deadline for submission of items established by the Clerk of the Board of Control.

SECTION 2. Section 205.02 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby repealed.

**SECTION 3.** Chapter 501 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended as follows (additions are marked in bold and underline, deletions are struck-through):

### Section 501.03: County Executive's Authority

- A. The County Executive, through the appropriate departments of county government acting under his/her direction or other county entities, may solicit bids, proposals, qualification statements, or any other contractual solicitation; enter into all contracts; manage contracts through their conclusion and execute all necessary documents for the administration and conclusion of contracts; accept completeness of projects; terminate contracts; release escrow funds; apply for, accept, or make grants; purchase, sell, and lease any real estate or real estate interests; accept or grant access, easements, licenses, and other rights of entry on real estate; and provide or enter into loans, provided that all requirements of Chapter 501 of the County Code applicable to that action are met. For actions requiring approval of the County Council, or the Board of Control, or the Contracts and Purchasing Board, such approvals shall be obtained prior to execution of the action, except as provided for under the County Executive Emergency Authority and Time Sensitive, Mission Critical Purchases. Actions not requiring approval of the County Council, or the Board of Control, or the Contracts and Purchasing Board may be executed by the County Executive in accordance with procedures established by Chapter 501 of the County Code and the County Executive.
- B. The County Executive may perform any of the functions that he or she may perform under Chapter 501 of the County Code through his or her duly authorized designees.
- C. Chapter 501 of the County Code is intended to fulfill any state, federal, or other requirement for a Resolution or Ordinance granting the County Executive the authority to apply for or accept grants on behalf of the County.
- D. Chapter 501 of the County Code is intended to fulfill any state, federal, or other requirement for a Resolution or Ordinance granting the County Executive the authority to enter into a contract or perform any other act allowed by Chapter 501 of the County Code unless approval for such action is specifically required under Section 501.04 of the Code.
- E. Chapter 501 is intended to fulfill any state, federal, or other requirement for a Resolution or Ordinance of Support to apply or accept grants on behalf of the

County or to enter into a contract or perform any other act allowed by this Chapter.

F. Chapter 501 shall not be construed to limit or restrict the powers, duties, and responsibilities of the County Executive as provided by the Charter or State law and the listing of any specific powers, duties, or responsibilities of the County Executive in this Chapter shall not be construed to exclude any other power, duty, or responsibility provided for the Charter or by the general law of the State of Ohio.

# Section 501.04: Required Approvals

- A. Items Requiring County Council Approval.
  - 1. The following transactions and other actions shall require approval by the County Council:
    - a. All contracts, purchases, sales, grants provided by the county, or loans provided by the county resulting in the County's expenditure of more than \$500,000.00;
    - b. All revenue generating agreements with anticipated revenue above \$500,000.00 during the term of the agreement. If the revenue generating agreement does not have an end date, the County shall calculate the anticipated revenue for purposes of determination of the appropriate approval authority based on a five-year term;
    - c. Any loan in which the County, or any entity thereof, is the borrower;
    - d. All contracts, purchases, loans, leases, or other transactions which create an obligation that would require the appropriation of additional funds not previously authorized;
    - e. All purchases or sales of real estate or real estate interests for any purpose other than making or repairing roads, including bridges, for more than \$50,000.00 and all leases of real estate or real estate interests as lessor or lessee in which the value of the purchase, sale, or lease is more than \$50,000.00;
    - f. All purchases, sales, or leases of real estate in excess of six months other than at fair market value;
    - g. All transfers of cash or appropriation authority between accounts within the County budget and all appropriation changes that result in an increase or decrease in authorized appropriations;
    - h. Any change order or amendment to a contract that is submitted to the Board of Control and does not receive an affirmative vote of one County Council member on the Board of Control;

- i. Any other specific contract, purchase, sale, lease, grant made by the County, or loan made by the County, or any exemption, procedure, or other action within the process of completing any such contract, purchase, sale, lease, grant made by the County, or loan made by the County for which the County Council, by <u>**Resolution**</u> Motion of Council, requires approval of the County Council; Any other contract, contract amendment, change order, purchase, sale, lease, grant made by the County, loan made by the County, exemption, procedure, or other action that requires approval by the County Council pursuant to any other provision of Chapter 501 or any other provision of the County Code;
- j. Any other contract, purchase, sale, lease, grant made by the County, loan made by the County, or any exemption, procedure, or other action within the process of completing any such contract, purchase, sale, lease, grant, exemption, or loan that does not otherwise require Council approval, but the County Executive, <u>or</u> Board of Control, or Contracts and Purchasing Board determines to submit to Council for its consideration, review, and approval or denial; and
- k. Any other contract, purchase, sale, lease, grant made by the County, loan made by the County, or any exemption, procedure, or other action within the process of completing any such contract, purchase, sale, lease, grant, exemption, or loan that the Council President requests its transfer or review to the County Council by written communication to the County Executive and his or her designee prior to approval.
- 2. Sections 501.04(A)(1)(e) and (f) are not intended to interfere with the Executive and Director of Public Works' ability to manage the County's property, including, without limitation, granting access, easements, licenses, rights of way, or other rights of entry on the County's property and establishing the terms for such entry without seeking Council approval for such action.
- B. Items Requiring Board of Control Approval. The following transactions and other actions shall require approval by the Board of Control:
  - 1. All contracts, purchases, sales, grants provided or by the County, or loans provided by the County resulting in the County's expenditure of more than **\$500.00 \$100,000.00** but not more than **\$500,000.00**;
  - All revenue generating agreements with anticipated revenue more than \$100,000 \$500.00 but not more than \$500,000.00 during the term of the agreement. If the revenue generating agreement does not have an end date, the County shall calculate the anticipated revenue for purposes of determination of the appropriate approval authority based on a five-year term;

- 3. All purchases or sales of real estate or real estate interests for more than \$10,000.00 \$500.00 but not more than \$50,000.00 and all leases of real estate or real estate interests as lessor or lessee in which the total value of the transaction is more than \$10,000.00 \$500.00 but not more than \$50,000.00;
- 4. Any change order or amendment resulting in the County's expenditure of <u>more than</u> \$25,000.00 \$500.00 that do not otherwise require Council approval using the definition provided in Section 501.02(D) of the County Code for contracts with a value of less than five million dollars or \$50,000.00 or more for contracts with a value of five million dollars or more; and
- 5. All purchases, including, the acquisition through settlement of eminentdomain litigation, of any real estate interests for the purpose of making or repairing roads, including bridges, in excess of \$50,000.00.
- C. Items Requiring Contracts and Purchasing Board Approval. All contracts, revenue generating agreements, purchases, sales, grants provided by the County and loans provided by the County for \$500.00 or more that do not otherwise require County Council or Board of Control approval shall require approval by the Contracts and Purchasing Board.

# Section 501.05 Approval Procedures

- A. Single Approval Generally Required; Exceptions
  - Except as provided for in Sections 501.04(A)(1)(h) and (i), Section 501.04(B)(4), and Sections 501.04(A) and (B) of the County Code, the approvals provided for in Section 501.04 of the County Code shall be required to enter into a contract, lease, purchase, sale, loans made by the County, and grants made by the County, and not at other stages of the process of completing these transactions.
  - Purchases made under a requirements, supplies, or other contract under which multiple purchases are to be made, such as an office supply contract or a county printing contract, shall not require additional individualized approvals by the County Council, <u>or</u> Board of Control, or the Contracts and Purchasing Board so long as the contract under which the purchases are to be made is properly approved under Chapter 501 of the County Code.
- B. Thresholds for Exercise of Options. Exercise of an option on a contract shall require approval of the County Council, <u>or</u> the Board of Control, or the Contracts and Purchasing Board if the thresholds provided for in Section 501.04(A), <u>or (B)</u>, or (C), respectively, for approval of contracts are met.
- C. Contracts with Multiple Vendors
  - Unless an exemption is approved under Section 501.05(C)(2) herein, the values of proposed contracts to be entered pursuant to a single Request for Bids (RFB), Request for Proposals (RFP), Request for Qualifications (RFQ),

or any other contractual solicitation shall be aggregated and treated as a single contract for purposes of applying the monetary thresholds under Section 501.04 of the County Code.

- 2. Requests for exemption from the requirements of Section 501.05(C)(1) shall be submitted to the Board of Control, which is hereby authorized to review such requests and to approve or disapprove them.
- D. Approval Thresholds for Change Orders or Amendments For the purposes of Chapter 501 of the County Code, a change order or amendment to a contract shall not be considered a separate contract and shall be subject to the requirements of Sections 501.04(A)(1)(h) and 501.04(B)(4).
- E. Monthly Reports on Contract Changes.During any construction or renovation project, the director of the department responsible for the project in conjunction with the project manager, or other person responsible for the project shall provide the following information monthly to the Board of Control:
  - 1. A description of all changes made in the project since the previous report and the cost or savings associated with each change; and
  - 2. The percentage of contingency funds used in the project up to that point and how that percentage compares with the projected use of contingency funds at that point in the project.
- F. Identification of Funding Sources.

Any item submitted to the County Council, <u>or</u> the Board of Control, or the Contracts and Purchasing Board which includes a request for approval for the expenditure of money shall specify the funding source(s) to be used.

# Section 501.07 Referral to Council

**<u>A.</u>** The County Executive may refer any item to the County Council for approval that otherwise would require approval from the Board of Control-or the Contracts and Purchasing Board.

# Section 501.08 Emergency Contracting Authority

<u>A.</u> In an emergency which threatens the life, health, or property in the County, as declared and determined by the County Executive, and in which official action is needed prior to when a meeting of the County Council, <u>or</u> the Board of Control, or the Contracts and Purchasing Board could take place, the County Executive may enter into contracts or leases or make purchases not to exceed \$500,000.00 for any one emergency event, without obtaining the approval of the County Council, <u>or</u> the Board of Control, or the Contracts and Purchasing Board. Whenever this power is exercised, the County Executive shall immediately send a report to County Council and post the report on the county's website, describing

the nature of the emergency, the actions taken, and the estimated cost and sources of funding for the actions taken.

### Section 501.09 Application for and Acceptance of Grants

- A. The County Executive may apply for and accept grants on behalf of the County, and execute all agreements and any other documents in connection with same, without specific approval from the Contracts and Purchasing Board, the Board of Control, or the County Council, provided that any expenditures of grant funds shall be made from funds properly appropriated and any purchases, grants, leases, or loans made using grant funds shall be done in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 501 of the Cuyahoga County Code.
- B. As an exception to Section 501.09(A), specific approval shall be required by the Board of Control for the County's acceptance of grants of more than \$100,000.00 or the Contracts and Purchasing Board for the County's acceptance of grants of \$500.00 that do not otherwise require the Board of Control approval, when either of the following applies:
  - 1. The County has the discretion to select from multiple potential grant subrecipients, and the County voluntarily designates a specific sub-recipient as part of the application process; or
  - 2. Acceptance of the grant requires a local match for which a specific appropriation has not been provided in the applicable operating budget.

# Section 501.12 Competitive Bidding Requirements and Exceptions

- A. Except as otherwise provided in Chapter 501 of the County Code, including, but not limited to, Sections 501.12, 501.14, and 501.01, all contracts, purchases, or leases shall be done in accordance with the competitive bidding procedures provided for in Sections 307.86 through 307.921 of the Ohio Revised Code. If any conflict arises between the procedures, requirements, or any other terms of the Ohio Revised Code, Ohio Administrative Code, or any other law or regulation, and Chapter 501 of the County Code, the procedures, requirements, and terms of this Chapter shall prevail.
- B. Competitive bidding is not required when any of the following apply:
  - 1. The estimated cost is less than \$25,000.00;
  - 2. The purchase is for professional services, such as architectural, legal, medical, veterinary, financial, insurance, information technology, engineering, consulting, surveying, appraisal, brokerage, or construction management services;
  - 3. The purchase is made in response to an emergency as provided for in Section 501.08 of the County Code or the purchase is approved by the County

Council, <u>or</u> the Board of Control, <del>or the Contracts and Purchasing Board,</del> as applicable, to be made without competitive bidding in response to an emergency;

- 4. The transaction is for the purchase, sale, lease (as lessor or lessee), conveyance, transfer, exchange, easement, right of way, license, or any other disposition or acquisition of real property or real-estate interests;
- 5. The purchase is for used personal property, material, or supplies which are to be sold by the submission of written bids or at an auction open to the public;
- 6. The purchase is for services, supplies, replacements or supplemental parts, for a product or equipment owned or leased by the county, and the only source of the services, supplies, replacements or parts is limited to a single supplier;
- 7. The purchase is for services related to information technology, such as programming services, that are proprietary or limited to a single source;
- 8. The transaction is with the federal government, a state or a political subdivision thereof, a county or contracting authority thereof, a board of education, a township, a municipal corporation or a contracting authority thereof, a court, or any other one or more political subdivisions or other governmental entities, including, but not limited to, a county hospital, a regional transportation authority, a board of developmental disabilities, an alcohol, drug addiction and mental health services board, a veterans service commission, a county land reutilization corporation (land bank), a sewer district, or a port authority;
- 9. The purchase is made by a county department performing the duties provided for in Section 329.04 of the Ohio Revised Code and consists of family services duties or workforce development activities;
- 10. The purchase is made by a public children services agency performing the duties provided for in Section 5153.16 of the Ohio Revised Code and consists of family services, programs, or ancillary services that provide case management, prevention, or treatment services for children at risk of being or alleged to be abused, neglected, or dependent children;
- 11. The purchase consists of criminal justice services, social services programs, family services, or workforce development activities from nonprofit corporations or associations under programs funded by the federal government or by state grants;
- 12. The purchase is for an insurance policy, health care plan, or child care services for provision to county employees;

- 13. The purchase is for goods and services provided by persons with severe disabilities and provided for in Sections 4115.31 through 4115.35 of the Ohio Revised Code;
- 14. The Contracts and Purchasing Board Board of Control determines, upon its review of a request for an exemption from the requirements of competitive bidding, that the use of competitive sealed proposals would be advantageous to the county and the contracting authority complies with Section 307.862 of the Ohio Revised Code, as modified by Section 501.01 of this Chapter;
- 15. The Board of Control determines, upon its review of a request for an exemption from the requirements of competitive bidding, that an alternative procurement process would be advantageous to the County. The request to the Board must specify the details of the proposed alternative procurement process, and the Board may approve the request as presented or may impose any other changes or additional requirements as it deems appropriate.
- 16. The program, contract, or agreement is funded through a federal, state, or other grant or program and is awarded by the County to the recipient(s) pursuant to the criteria or requirements of the grant or program, such as contracts entered pursuant to the Community Development Block Grant Program, the Store Front Renovation Rebate Program, the McKinney Vento Homeless Assistance Renewal Grant, or other similar grants or programs. To be eligible for this exemption, the program's criteria and requirements for the selection of the recipients must first be approved by the **Board of** <u>Control Contracts and Purchasing Board</u>. This approval can be done singularly for the entire program without the need for individualized consideration.
- 17. The purchase is for any other purpose that may be done without competitive bidding pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code;
- 18. The purchase is made through a joint purchasing program authorized by the Ohio Revised Code, including, but not limited to, Ohio Revised Code Section 9.48; and,
- 19. The purchase is made through a state contract authorized by the Ohio Revised Code, including, but not limited to, Ohio Revised Code Section 125.04 and Ohio Revised Code Section 5513.01; and,
- C. Any purchase of professional design services provided by architects, engineers, or surveyors shall be done as provided for in Sections 153.65 through 153.71 of the Ohio Revised Code. The contracting authority, however, may deviate from the requirements of Ohio Revised Code Section 153.691 if the County Executive, with the approval of the Board of Control, determines that doing so would be advantageous to the County.
- D. Except in the case of contracts and purchases made under Sections 501.12(B)(8), (15), and (16) of the County Code, unless a request for an exemption is granted by

the **<u>Board of Control</u>** Contracts and Purchasing Board, as presented or with any other changes or additional requirements deemed appropriate by the Board, if the County seeks to make contracts or purchases of \$25,000.00 or more other than by competitive bidding, and the contracting authority is able to identify more than one source through which the purchase could be made, the contracting agency shall:

- 1. Develop requests for proposals or qualifications, specifying the products or services to be purchased and the criteria that will be considered prior to making the purchase;
- 2. Receive responses from prospective vendors/contracting parties meeting the criteria specified in the request for proposals or qualifications by giving notice in a manner substantially similar to the procedures established for giving notice under section 307.87 of the Ohio Revised Code as modified by Section 501.01(D) of the County Code; and
- 3. The contracting authority negotiates with the prospective vendors/contracting parties to obtain a contract which best satisfies the criteria specified in the request for proposals or qualifications.
- E. Effective through December 31, 2012, if the County seeks to make contracts or purchases greater than \$1,000.00, but less than \$25,000.00, and the contracting authority is able to identify multiple sources through which the contract or purchase could be made, the contracting authority shall seek informal quotes or proposals from multiple vendors in accordance with the procedures established by the Office of Procurement and Diversity.
- **E.** Effective January 1, 2013, if **If** the County seeks to make contracts or purchases greater than \$1,000, but less than \$25,000, the County shall solicit bids for the contract/purchase for a period of no less than eight hours on the County's web site and through a vendor email notification system that is approved by the Office of Procurement and Diversity and the Law Department. The County shall make best efforts to ensure that the posting hours take place between 5:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. EST. If the online process does not result in at least three bids, the County shall exercise best efforts to obtain three bids through additional solicitation efforts.
- **F.** Effective through December 31, 2012, a contracting authority that is unable to identify more than one source through which the contract or purchase can be made pursuant to the requirements of Section 501.12(D) of the County Code shall make a request to the Contracts and Purchasing Board for approval to seek a contract with or purchase from the sole-source provider. The request for approval shall be made on a form established by the Office of Procurement and Diversity, and approved by the Law Department, and shall include a verified statement by the vendor, subject to the penalty of perjury, certifying the vendor's sole source status. If the sole source request is approved, the purchase or contract must still receive the requisite approval by the County Council, Board of Control, or Contracts and Purchasing Board pursuant to Section 501.04 of the County Code.

**F.** Effective January 1, 2013, if **If** the County seeks to make contracts or purchases of \$25,000 or more, and it is unable to identify more than one source and a vendor provides the County with a verified statement, subject to the penalty of perjury, certifying its sole source status, the County shall then solicit the availability of vendors for the contract/purchase. The solicitation shall be for a period of no less than 48 hours on the County's web site and through a vendor email notification system that is approved by the Office of Procurement and Diversity and the Law Department. If the posting fails to identify any additional vendor, the County may then proceed to submit the proposed purchase/contract to the appropriate approval authority as a sole source. If, however, the posting results in the identification of more than one possible vendor, the County shall only proceed with the procurement through the requisite competitive process under Chapter 501 of the Cuyahoga County Code unless the County receives an appropriate exemption in accordance with the requirements of the Code. The request for an exemption shall be made on a form established by the Office of Procurement and Diversity, and approved by the Law Department, and shall include a verified statement by the vendor, subject to the penalty of perjury, certifying the vendor's sole-source status. If the sole-source request is approved, the purchase or contract must still receive the requisite approval by the County Council, or Board of Control, or Contracts and Purchasing Board pursuant to Section 501.04 of the County Code.

**SECTION 4.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 5.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby makes an award on RQ33145 to Karvo Paving, Co. in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,811,511.18 for resurfacing Emery Road from Northfield Road to Merrygold Avenue in the City of Warrensville Heights and Village of North Randall.

**SECTION 2.** That the County Executive is authorized to execute the contract and all other documents consistent with this Resolution.

**SECTION 4.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County and the reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 5.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**WHEREAS**, Olmsted Township passed Resolution No. 047-2015 on April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2015 accepting K.Hovnanian's offer of \$25,000 for the payment-in-lieu for the construction of 600 lineal feet of sidewalk.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Cuyahoga County Planning Commission grants conditional approval of the Final Plat for Phase 1 of Schady Reserve PRD Subdivision dated March 12, 2015, based on the following conditions:

- 1. Amended Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plans are submitted for review and approval to the Cuyahoga County Soil and Water Conservation District.
- 2. Deficiencies in erosion and sediment controls noted by the Cuyahoga County Soil and Water Conservation District in their April 1, 2015 report are corrected by K. Hovnanian Schady Reserve LLC., and inspected, and approved by the County Engineer.
- 3. Language contained within the bonds for the maintenance guarantees is agreed upon by all parties and appropriate signatures are provided.
- 4. Language contained within the cash escrow account agreements for the performance guarantees is agreed upon by all parties and appropriate signatures are provided.
- 5. The Language contained within the Homeowner's' Association Documents is approved by the Cuyahoga County Law Department.

# SUMMARY OF REQUESTED ACTION:

The Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities (CCBDD) desires to amend its lease of space at its Green Road (GRD) and William Patrick Day (WPD) Services Center to the Educational Service Center of Cuyahoga County (ESC) on behalf of Help Me Grow of Cuyahoga County (HMG).

# I. Novus Agenda Summary of Requested Action – Form

**Title:** To amend two (2) Lease Agreements by and between the County of Cuyahoga, Ohio (County), on behalf of the CCBDD and the ESC, on behalf of HMG.

ESC is HMG's fiscal agent. The lease for WPD is for a total of 829.5 square feet while the GRD lease is for designated space in four different classrooms. The WPD Services Center is located at 2421 Community College Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio 44115. The GRD Services Center is located at 4329 Green Road, Highland Hills, Ohio 44128.

The terms of the current leases terminate on September 14, 2015. The amended leases would extend the term of both leases for an additional period of one year commencing on September 15, 2015 and ending on September 14, 2016. All other terms and conditions of the leases remain the same.

# A. Scope of Work Summary

The CCBDD is requesting the approval of these lease amendments with ESC because GRD and WPD are owned by the County. Both facilities have been operated/maintained/improved for the past thirty-three (33) years by the CCBDD exclusively with CCBDD funds. These leases will generate revenue of \$1.00 for the one year extension of the lease periods. The primary goal of these leases is for the CCBDD to assist HMG in providing service coordination to over one thousand (1000) families/children who reside in Cuyahoga County and receive Evidence Based Early Intervention (EBEI) services from the CCBDD. A total of thirty-two (32) HMG Service Coordinators will be housed between GRD and WPD. The CCBDD is HMG's public partner in providing EBEI services to eligible children/families. Consequently, charging HMG less than fair market value for rent results in more children and families in Cuyahoga County receiving service coordination.

### **B. Procurement**

The initial leases were not established pursuant to a RFP, RFQ, etc. because ESC is a political subdivision located within Cuyahoga County. HMG is an Ohio Department of Health program and the public partner of the CCBDD regarding the provision of EBEI services.

### **C. Contractor and Project Information**

Lessee ESC is a political subdivision whose offices are located at 6393 Oak Tree Boulevard, Independence, Ohio 44131. HMG is a program of the Ohio Department of Health with its offices located at 8111 Quincy Avenue, Suite 344, Cleveland, Ohio 44104.

## **D. Project Status and Planning**

The CCBDD approved the amendments to the leases at its February 26, 2015 meeting. The full County Council needs to approve these amendments as the rent for these leases is less than fair market value.

No County or CCBDD funds will be expended. ESC is registered with the Cuyahoga County Inspector General's Office as 12-1185 and HMG is registered as #12-1184.

WHEREAS, the County and the City are authorized under Chapter 755 of the Ohio Revised Code and other laws to jointly construct operate or maintain parks and recreational facilities and to contribute such lands, money other personal property or services to such a joint venture; and WHEREAS, the County and the City have determined to cooperate in financing a portion of the improvements to Public Square and to enter into a joint cooperative agreement (the "City Agreement") specifying its rights and obligations relating to the financing of the Project defined in Section 2 and to provide for certain other arrangements related to the ownership, operation and maintenance of the property; and

WHEREAS, the remaining portion of the financing and implementation of the improvements to Public Square shall be undertaken through the cooperation and support of other political subdivisions, civic organizations, foundations, nonprofit corporations and certain neighboring property owners and businesses; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the provisions of the City Agreement, the County shall enter into a cooperative agreement, or an amendment or supplement to a cooperative agreement, with the City and other parties currently in a cooperative agreement with the City relating to existing tax increment financing arrangements, in order to make available for the Project certain payments in lieu of taxes currently received by the City under those tax increment financing arrangements (the "Cooperative Agreement"); and;

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate its contributions to the cooperative venture with the City under the City Agreement and in support of the overall community efforts for the Public Square project, this Council has determined that it is necessary and in the best interest of the County for the County to issue sales tax revenue bonds for the for the purpose of paying or reimbursing the costs of constructing, reconstructing, refurbishing, renovating and improving permanent improvements to publicly owned park space known as Public Square, together with all necessary appurtenances and work incidental thereto, and for the purpose of paying any capitalized interest on the bonds and paying the costs of issuance in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, this Council has determined that sales tax revenue bonds shall be issued in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$13,000,000 for the purposes herein stated and that the County should secure such bonds by a trust indenture, as provided herein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to a resolution adopted July 6, 1987 (the "1987 County Sales Tax Resolution"), the Board of County Commissioners of the County (the "Board"), as the predecessor legislative authority to this Council, authorized the continuing levy and collection of sales and use taxes, authorized under Sections 5739.021 and 5741.021 of the Ohio Revised Code, at the rate of one percent (1%), and pursuant to a resolution adopted July 26, 2007 (the "2007 County Sales Tax Resolution" and, together with the 1987 County Sales Tax Resolution, the "County Sales Tax Resolutions"), the Board authorized an

increase in the sales and use taxes to a rate of one and one-quarter percent (1-1/4%) (the "County Sales Tax"), each for the purpose of providing additional general revenues for the County; and

WHEREAS, this Council has determined to issue sales tax revenue bonds supported by the County Sales Tax for the Project described in Section 2; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Officer has certified that the estimated life of the Project at least five (5) years, and that the estimated maximum maturity of the bonds described in Section 2 is at least nineteen (19) years; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Officer has further certified to this Council that the maximum aggregate amount of sales tax revenue bonds, including the Bonds, that will be outstanding at any time will not exceed an amount which requires or is estimated by him, as Fiscal Officer, to require payments from sales tax receipts of debt charges on the sales tax revenue bonds, including the Bonds, in any calendar year in an amount exceeding the average of the amount received by the County for 2013 and 2014; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that the usual daily operation of the County be continued and the public peace, health or safety of the County be preserved and for the further reason that funds be made available in a timely manner for the construction of the Project in accordance with the timetable established for the overall improvements to Public Square.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

1. <u>Definitions and Interpretation</u>. As used herein, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

"Act" means Chapter 133, Ohio Revised Code, as enacted and amended from time to time.

"Book entry form" or "book entry system" means a form or system under which (a) the ownership of book entry interests in Bonds and the principal of and interest on the Bonds may be transferred only through a book entry, and (b) physical Bond certificates in fully registered form are issued by the County only to a Depository or its nominee as registered owner, with the Bonds deposited with and retained in the custody of the Depository or its agent. The book entry maintained by others than the County is the record that identifies the owners of book entry interests in those Bonds and that principal and interest. "Certificate of Award" means the certificate authorized to be signed by the Fiscal Officer pursuant to Section 6, specifying and determining those terms or other matters pertaining to the Bonds and their issuance, sale and delivery as this Resolution requires or authorizes to be set forth or determined therein.

"Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, the Regulations (whether temporary or final) under that Code or the statutory predecessor of that Code, and any amendments of, or successor provisions to, the foregoing and any official rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and judicial determinations regarding any of the foregoing, all as and to the extent applicable. Unless otherwise indicated, reference to a Section of the Code includes any applicable successor section or provision and such applicable Regulations, rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and determinations pertinent to that Section.

"County Executive" means the County Executive of the County; provided, for purposes of the signing of documents, certificates and other instruments other than the Bonds and the Official Statement, County Executive includes the County Executive's Chief of Staff as the County Executive's designee pursuant to Executive Order No. 02011-0002 and any other person duly designated by the County Executive.

"County Sales Tax Bond Fund" means the County Sales Tax Bond Fund created by the Indenture.

"County Sales Tax Receipts" means the monies received by the County from the County Sales Tax.

"County Sales Tax Revenue Fund" means the County Sales Tax Revenue Fund created by the Indenture.

"Depository" means any securities depository that is a clearing agency under federal law operating and maintaining, with its Participants or otherwise, a book entry system to record ownership of book entry interests in Bonds or the principal of and interest on Bonds, and to effect transfers of Bonds, in book entry form, and includes and means initially The Depository Trust Company (a limited purpose trust company), New York, New York.

"Director of Law" means the Director of Law of the County, including an interim or acting Director of Law.

"Fiscal Officer" means the Fiscal Officer of the County, including an interim or acting Fiscal Officer.

"Indenture" means the Trust Indenture dated as of December 1, 2014 between the County and the Trustee, as amended or supplemented from time to time, including by Supplemental Indenture No. 2. "Interest Payment Dates" means June 1 and December 1 of each year during which the Bonds are outstanding, commencing June 1, 2015, or such other date not later than December 1, 2015, as may be determined by the Fiscal Officer and specified in the Certificate of Award.

"Original Purchaser" means, Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, Incorporated, together with any other purchasers identified in the Certificate of Award.

"Participant" means any participant contracting with a Depository under a book entry system and includes security brokers and dealers, banks and trust companies, and clearing corporations.

"Pledged Funds" means the County Sales Tax Bond Fund and any other funds established under the Indenture and pledged as security for the Bonds.

"Pledged Revenues" means, collectively, (a) the County Sales Tax Receipts and (b) all monies in the Pledged Funds and all income and profit from the investment of those monies.

"Principal Payment Dates" means, unless otherwise determined by the Fiscal Officer and specified in the Certificate of Award, December 1 in each of the years from and including 2015 to and including 2033.

"Supplemental Indenture No. 2" means Supplemental Trust Indenture No. 2, dated as of April 1, 2015, between the County and the Trustee and relating to the issuance of the Series 2015 Bonds, and any amendment or supplement thereto.

"Term Bonds" means those Bonds designated as such in the Certificate of Award, maturing on the date or dates set forth therein, bearing interest payable on each Interest Payment Date and subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption.

Any reference to this Council, the County or to its members or officers, or to other public officers, boards, commissions, departments, institutions, agencies, bodies or entities, shall include those which succeed to their functions, duties or responsibilities by operation of law and also those who at the time may legally act in their place.

The captions and headings in this Resolution are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof. Reference to a Section means a section of this Resolution unless otherwise indicated.

2. <u>Authorized Principal Amount of Bonds and Purpose</u>. It is necessary to issue sales tax revenue bonds of this County in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$13,000,000 (the "Bonds") for the purpose of paying or reimbursing the costs of constructing, reconstructing, refurbishing, renovating and improving

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permanent improvements to publicly owned park space known as Public Square, together with all necessary appurtenances and work incidental thereto, (the "Project") and for the purpose of paying any capitalized interest on the bonds and paying the costs of issuance in connection therewith.

3. Bond Terms. The Bonds shall be issued pursuant to the terms of the Indenture. The Bonds may be issued in one or more series, and shall be numbered in such manner as to distinguish each Bond from any other Bond of the same series. The Bonds shall be issued in denominations of \$5,000 or multiples of \$5,000 in excess thereof, but in no case as to a particular maturity date exceeding the principal amount maturing on that date. The Bonds shall be dated as determined by the Fiscal Officer, with the true interest cost on the Bonds not to exceed seven percent (7%) per year (computed on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months), provided that if the interest on the Bonds is not to be excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, the true interest cost on the Bonds shall not exceed 12% per year, payable on such semiannual dates or annual dates as determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award until the principal amount is paid, and shall mature on such semiannual dates or annual dates as determined by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award, provided that the final maturity shall not be later than December 1, 2033, in accordance with Section 133.21 of the Ohio Revised Code and as set forth in the Certificate of Award and the Indenture.

3. <u>Redemption Provisions</u>. The Bonds shall mature serially and annually on such dates and in such principal amounts as are fixed by the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award and the Indenture, provided that the Bonds stated to mature in any year may be issued as Term Bonds payable pursuant to Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption Requirements as hereinafter defined and further described below and as provided for in the Indenture. The Fiscal Officer shall determine in the Certificate of Award whether any of the Bonds shall be issued as Term Bonds and any dates (the "Mandatory Redemption Dates") on which the principal amount stated above shall be payable pursuant to Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption Requirements rather than at stated maturity (the "Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption Requirements").

The Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to stated maturity as follows:

(a) *Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption*. If any of the Bonds are issued as Term Bonds, the Term Bonds shall be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption and be redeemed pursuant to Mandatory Sinking Fund Redemption Requirements, at a redemption price of 100% of the principal amount redeemed, plus interest accrued to the redemption date, on the Mandatory Redemption Dates.

(b) *Optional Redemption*. The Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity by or at the option of the County, at par, in whole or in part on any date on the dates, in the years and for the prices specified in the Certificate of Award, provided, however, that the Fiscal Officer may determine in the Certificate of Award that it is in the best interest of the County that the Bonds not be subject to redemption prior to maturity. If the Bonds are subject to redemption, the maximum redemption price shall be no greater than 100% of the principal amount redeemed, plus accrued interest to the redemption date.

4. <u>Execution of Bonds</u>. The Bonds shall be designated "Cuyahoga County Sales Tax Revenue Bonds, Series 2015 (Public Square Project)" or such other name as may be designated in the Certificate of Award. The Bonds shall contain a summary statement of the purposes for which they are issued; shall state that they are issued pursuant to this Resolution; shall be executed by the County Executive and the Fiscal Officer, in the name and on behalf of the County and in their official capacities, provided that either or both of those signatures may be a facsimile; shall be issued only in fully registered form; and shall be registered as to both principal and interest at the corporate trust office of the Trustee. The Bonds shall be issued in the denominations and numbers as requested by the Original Purchaser and approved by the Fiscal Officer, and shall be numbered as determined by the Fiscal Officer.

The principal of the Bonds shall be payable at maturity of the Bonds upon presentation and surrender to the Trustee. Interest on any Bond shall be paid on each Interest Payment Date as defined in and as further provided in the Indenture. The principal and interest on the Bonds is payable in lawful money of the United States of America without deduction for the services of the Trustee.

No Bond shall be valid or become obligatory for any purpose unless and until an authentication certificate appearing on the Bond shall have been duly endorsed by the Trustee.

5. <u>Book-Entry System</u>. The entire principal amount may be represented by a single bond and may be issued as fully registered securities and in book entry or other uncertificated form in accordance with Section 9.96, Chapter 133 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the Indenture if it is determined by the Fiscal Officer that issuance of fully registered securities in that form will facilitate the sale and delivery of the Bonds. The Bonds shall not have coupons attached, shall be numbered as determined by the Fiscal Officer and shall express upon their faces the purpose, in summary terms, for which they are issued and that they are issued pursuant to this Resolution.

The Fiscal Officer is also hereby authorized and directed, to the extent necessary or required, to enter into any agreements determined necessary in

connection with the book entry system for the Bonds, after determining that the signing thereof will not endanger the funds or securities of the County

6. <u>Award and Sale of Bonds</u>. The Bonds shall be sold to the Original Purchaser at a purchase price and bearing interest at a rate or rates determined by the County Executive or the Fiscal Officer to be in the best interest of the County and as designated by the County Executive or the Fiscal Officer in the Certificate of Award in accordance with law, the provisions of this Resolution, and the Indenture. The Fiscal Officer shall sign the Certificate of Award evidencing that sale to the Original Purchaser, with the final purchase price, interest rate or rates, aggregate principal amount, and principal amounts payable at stated maturity being set forth in the Certificate of Award and the Indenture, at a purchase price not less than 97% of par plus any accrued interest to their date of delivery. The Fiscal Officer shall cause the Bonds to be prepared, and have the Bonds signed and delivered, together with a true transcript of proceedings with reference to the issuance of the Bonds if requested by the Original Purchaser, to the Original Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price. The Fiscal Officer, the County Executive, the Director of Law, the Clerk of this Council and other County officials, as appropriate, are each authorized and directed to sign any transcript certificates, financial statements and other documents and instruments and to take such actions as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Resolution.

If, in the judgment of the Fiscal Officer, the filing of an application for (i) a rating on the Bonds by one or more nationally-recognized rating agencies, or (ii) a policy of insurance or other credit enhancement facility from a company or companies to better assure the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds, or (iii) a surety bond or other credit enhancement facility from a company or other companies to satisfy the reserve requirement for the Bonds is in the best interest of and financially advantageous to the County, the Fiscal Officer is authorized to prepare and submit those applications, to provide to each such agency, company or other credit enhancement facility provider such information as may be required for the purpose. The cost of obtaining each such rating, policy, bond or credit enhancement facility, except to the extent paid by the Original Purchaser, shall be paid from the proceeds of the Bonds.

7. <u>Application of Bond Proceeds</u>. The proceeds of the sale of the Bonds shall be allocated and deposited as provided in the Indenture.

8. <u>Appointment of Bond Trustee</u>; <u>Indenture</u>. This Council hereby appoints The Huntington National Bank to act as the trustee (such trustee, or a successor trustee pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Indenture, the "Trustee") for the Bonds. The Fiscal Officer shall provide for the payment of the services rendered and for reimbursement of expenses incurred pursuant to the Indenture from the proceeds of the Bonds to the extent available and then from other moneys lawfully available and appropriated or to be appropriated for that purpose. In order to secure the Bonds, the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute and deliver, in the name and on behalf of the County, Supplemental Trust Indenture No. 2, in substantially the form as is now on file with the Clerk, except that the same may be dated as of such date other than April 1, 2015 as specified in the Certificate of Award, together with any changes or amendments that are not inconsistent with this Resolution and not substantially adverse to the County and that are approved by the County Executive and the Director of Law on behalf of the County, all of which shall be conclusively evidenced by the signing of Supplemental Trust Indenture No. 2 or amendments thereto.

9. <u>Bonds are Special Obligations and Provisions for Levy and</u> <u>Collection of County Sales Tax</u>. The Bonds are special obligations of the County, and the principal of and interest (and any premium) on the Bonds are payable solely from the Pledged Revenues and the Pledged Funds, together with other available funds of the County, and such payment is secured by a pledge of and a lien on the Pledged Revenues and the Pledged Funds as provided by the Act and this Resolution.

The County has heretofore levied and covenants that it shall continue to collect the County Sales Taxes for so long as the Bonds are outstanding. The County hereby covenants and agrees that, so long as the Bonds are outstanding, it shall not suffer the repeal, amendment or any other change in this Resolution or the County Sales Tax Resolutions that in any way materially and adversely affects or impairs (a) the sufficiency of the County Sales Tax Receipts levied and collected or otherwise available for the payment of the Bonds or (b) the pledge or the application of the County Sales Tax Receipts to the payment of the Bonds.

The Bonds do not constitute a general obligation debt, or a pledge of the full faith and credit, of the State, the County, or any other political subdivision of the State, and the holders or owners of the Bonds have no right to have taxes levied by the general assembly or property taxes levied by the taxing authority of any political subdivision of the State, including the taxing authority of the County, for the payment of principal of and interest (and any premium) on the Bonds. Nothing herein shall be construed as requiring the County to use or apply to the payment of principal of and interest (and any premium) on the Bonds any funds or revenues from any source other than County Sales Tax Receipts. Nothing herein, however, shall be deemed to prohibit the County, of its own volition, from using, to the extent that it is authorized by law to do so, any other resources for the fulfillment of any of the terms, conditions or obligations of this Resolution or of the Bonds.

10. <u>City Agreement and Cooperative Agreement</u>. This Council finds that the improvements to Public Square will foster the public purpose of making parks and open space available for the greater use and enjoyment of the public and will contribute to the health and welfare of the citizens of the County. This Council further finds that the County's cooperation with the City under the City Agreement and the County's cooperation with the parties to the Cooperative Agreement will facilitate the financing of the Project and will advance and support the improvements to Public Square. The County Executive and the Director of Law are authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the County, to execute and deliver the City Agreement and the Cooperative Agreement, each in substantially the form as is now on file with the Clerk, together with any changes or amendments that are not inconsistent with this Resolution and not substantially adverse to the County and that are approved by the County Executive and the Director of Law on behalf of the County, all of which shall be conclusively evidenced by the signing of such documents or amendments thereto.

11. <u>Federal Tax Considerations</u>. The County covenants that it will use, and will restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of the Bonds in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (a) the Bonds will not (i) constitute private activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Sections 141, 148 or 149 of the Code or (ii) be treated other than as bonds to which Section 103(a) of the Code applies, and (b) the interest on the Bonds will not be treated as an item of tax preference under Section 57 of the Code.

The County further covenants that (a) it will take or cause to be taken such actions that may be required of it for the interest on the Bonds to be and to remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, and (b) it will not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that exclusion, and (c) it, or persons acting for it, will, among other acts of compliance, (i) apply the proceeds of the Bonds to the governmental purpose of the borrowing, (ii) restrict the yield on investment property acquired with those proceeds, (iii) make timely and adequate payments to the federal government, (iv) maintain books and records and make calculations and reports, and (v) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds, and, as applicable, of property financed with such proceeds, all in such manner and to the extent necessary to assure such exclusion of that interest under the Code.

The County Executive, the Fiscal Officer, or any other officer of the County having responsibility for issuance of the Bonds is hereby authorized (a) to make or effect any election, selection, designation, choice, consent, approval, or waiver on behalf of the County with respect to the Bonds as the County is permitted to or required to make or give under the federal income tax laws, including, without limitation thereto, any of the elections provided for in Section 148(f)(4)(C) of the Code or available under Section 148 of the Code, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting favorable tax treatment or status of the Bonds or assisting compliance with requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing the rebate amount or payments or penalties, or making payments of special amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying, excess earnings as rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by that officer, which action shall be in writing and signed by the officer,

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(b) to take any and all other actions, make or obtain calculations, make payments, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the County, as may be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the intended tax status of the Bonds, and (c) to give one or more appropriate certificates of the County, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings for the Bonds, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the County regarding the amount and use of all the proceeds of the Bonds, the facts, circumstances and estimates on which they are based, and other facts and circumstances relevant to the tax treatment of the interest on and the tax status of the Bonds. Notwithstanding the foregoing or any other provisions of this Resolution to the contrary, if the Fiscal Officer determines prior to the execution and delivery of the County for the interest on the Bonds to be included in gross income for federal income tax purposes, the County shall not be bound by the covenants of this Section.

Primary Offering Disclosure; Official Statement. 12. The County Executive and the Fiscal Officer, in the name and on behalf of the County and in their official capacities, are authorized and directed to (i) prepare or cause to be prepared, and to make or authorize modifications, completions or changes of or supplements to, a disclosure document in the form of an official statement in connection with the original issuance of the Bonds, (ii) determine, and to certify or otherwise represent, when the official statement is to be "deemed final" (except for permitted omissions) by the County as of its date or is a final official statement for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 prescribed by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule"), (iii) use and distribute, or authorize the use and distribution of, the "deemed final" and final official statements and any supplements thereto in connection with the original issuance of the Bonds, and (iv) complete and sign the final official statement as so approved, together with such certificates, statements or other documents in connection with the finality, accuracy and completeness of the "deemed final" and final official statements as they deem necessary and appropriate.

13. <u>Continuing Disclosure</u>. For the benefit of the holders and beneficial owners from time to time of the Bonds, the County agrees to provide or cause to be provided such financial information and operating data, audited financial statements and notices of the occurrence of certain events, in such manner as may be required for purposes of the Rule. The County Executive and the Fiscal Officer are authorized and directed to sign and deliver a continuing disclosure agreement (the "Continuing Disclosure Agreement"), setting forth the County's undertaking to provide such information and notices dated the date of delivery of the Bonds and delivered to the Original Purchaser of the Bonds. The Continuing Disclosure Agreement is approved, in substantially the form as is now on file with the Clerk of Council, together with any changes or amendments that are not inconsistent with this Resolution and not substantially adverse to the County and that are approved by the

County Executive and the Fiscal Officer on behalf of the County, all of which shall be conclusively evidenced by the signing of the Continuing Disclosure Agreement.

14. <u>Certification and Delivery of Resolution</u>. The Clerk of this Council is directed to deliver or cause to be delivered a certified copy of this Resolution to the Fiscal Officer.

15. <u>Satisfaction of Conditions for Bond Issuance</u>. This Council determines that all acts and conditions necessary to be done or performed by the County or to have been met precedent to and in the issuing of the Bonds in order to make them legal, valid and binding general obligations of the County have been performed and have been met, or will at the time of delivery of the Bonds have been performed and have been met, in regular and due form as required by law

16. <u>Other Documents</u>. The County Executive, the Fiscal Officer, the Director of Law and the Clerk of Council are each hereby authorized and directed to take any and all other actions and to execute any and all other instruments, certificates and documents as may in their judgment be necessary, desirable, advisable or appropriate in connection with the issuance of the Bonds in order to give effect to the transactions contemplated to be performed on the part of the County under this Resolution.

17. <u>Compliance with Open Meetings</u>. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22.

18. Effective Date. It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (i) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (ii) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Charter, or (iii) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, the County's debarment law was enacted to strengthen the citizens' trust in the County's contracting processes and to also provide risk mitigation;

WHEREAS, in light of recent rulings by the Debarment Review Board, it is necessary to amend the debarment law to clarify the commencement date for the debarment period under the County law commences from the date of issuance of the debarment; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of the County departments.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Section 505.10 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended and replaced in its entirety to read as follows:

#### Section 505.10 Commencement of Debarment Period and Good Faith in Exercising Discretion

#### A. Debarment Period to Commence from Date of Issuance of Debarment.

The debarment period for any debarment issued under this Chapter shall commence from the date of the Inspector General's issuance of the debarment and posting of the debarment on the Inspector General's web site.

#### **B.** Good Faith in Exercising Discretion.

The Cuyahoga County Inspector General and Debarment Review Board shall exercise their discretion in good faith to ensure consistent application of this Chapter.

**SECTION 2.** Section 205.06 (B) of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended as follows (additions are bolded and underlined, deletions are stricken):

#### B. Jurisdiction

The Cuyahoga County Debarment Review Board shall review and determine – including the powers to affirm, reverse, modify, and <u>or</u> remand – any matters that are submitted for its consideration pursuant to the Cuyahoga County Code. <u>Notwithstanding Section 505.03 of this Code, the Board shall have</u> <u>the discretion to modify the expiration date of any individual debarment</u> <u>period as the Board deems appropriate; provided however that no single</u> <u>debarment period shall exceed five years.</u>

**SECTION 3.** Section 505.06(A)(2) of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended as follows (additions are bolded and underlined, deletions are stricken):

A. Debarment by the Inspector General

\*\*\*\*\*

- 2. Inspector General's Decision on Debarment
  - a. After expiration of the time period provided in the Notice of Potential Debarment in which the contractor may respond to the Notice of Potential Debarment, the Inspector General shall render a decision on the potential debarment within a reasonable time period under the circumstances.
  - b. If the Inspector General determines not to debar the contractor, the Inspector General shall issue a written notice of his/her determination to the contractor.
  - c. If the Inspector General determines to debar the contractor, the Inspector General shall do all of the following:
    - i. The Inspector General shall add the contractor on the listing of debarred contractors on its web site and shall issue a written "Notice of Debarment" to the Contractor.

- ii. The Notice of Debarment shall include all of the following:
  - i. A notice that the contractor has been debarred;
  - A notice that the debarred contractor may not submit any bids, proposals, statements of qualifications, or any other such offers to the County or otherwise enter into any contract or agreement with the County;
  - A notice that the debarred contractor may not do any work as a subcontractor on any county contract or agreement;
  - A notice that the County will automatically disqualify any bids, proposals, statements of qualifications, or any other contractual offers to the County from the debarred contractor;
  - v. A notice of the duration of the debarment, including the starting and expiration dates of the debarment;
  - vi. A notice that the debarred contractor may appeal the debarment to the Debarment Review Board within 30 days by filing the original copy of its Notice of Appeal with the Inspector General and a copy with the Clerk of the Debarment Review Board;
  - vii. A notice of the exact due date on which the 30<sup>th</sup> day falls and by which the Notice of Appeal must be received by the Inspector General and the Clerk of the Debarment Review Board;
  - viii. A notice that the Notice of Appeal must include, with sufficient detail and factual background the specific assignments of error upon which the debarred contractor seeks to rely in its appeal before the Debarment Review Board;
    - ix. A notice that the debarred contractor bears the burden of proof before the Debarment Review Board;
    - x. A notice that the debarred contractor has the right to introduce testimony and to cross-examine witnesses at the hearing before the Debarment Review Board;

- xi. A notice that if the debarred contractor intends to introduce evidence before the Debarment Review Board that was not submitted to the Inspector General, the debarred contractor must <u>submit, with</u> <u>sufficient detail and factual background, the</u> <u>specific assignments of error upon which the</u> <u>debarred contractor seeks to rely in its appeal</u> <u>before the Debarment Review Board, and must</u> identify all such evidence with specificity and include copies of any written evidence <u>within 30</u> <u>days of filing its Notice of Appeal.</u> in its Notice of <u>Appeal The evidence submission deadline may be</u> <u>extended only at the discretion of the Debarment</u> <u>Review Board</u>;
- xii. A notice that the debarred contractor may not introduce any evidence at the hearing before the Debarment Review Board that was not submitted to the Inspector General in response to the Notice of Potential Debarment or included <u>by the evidence</u> <u>submission deadline</u> with its Notice of Appeal as provided in section 505.06(A)(2)(c)(<u>ii)</u>(xi) herein; and
- xiii. A notice that the debarred contractor's failure to file its Notice of Appeal as provided in the Notice of Debarment is a jurisdictional failure that may not otherwise be remedied.
- xiv. <u>A notice that the Inspector General shall, upon</u> the request of the debarred contractor, produce copies of all written evidence the Inspector <u>General reviewed when making his or her</u> decision to debar, unless such production is otherwise prohibited by law.
