Pursuant to Cuyahoga County Code Section 202.14, I am pleased to nominate **Mary Louise Madigan** to serve as the Director of Communications. Ms. Madigan is a long-time public servant for the County; she most recently served as a Social Program Administrator for the Department of Health & Human Services with a focus on crisis communications for the Division of Children and Family Services.

Ms. Madigan began working for Cuyahoga County January 15, 1995 as an administrative aide to Commissioner Tim Hagan. In late 1998, the end of Mr. Hagan's term, Madigan transitioned to Health & Human Services as a program officer for the county's Family & Children First Council, then under the leadership of Bette Myer. At FCFC, she began managing the county's Child Fatality Review, working with the Early Childhood Initiative, coordinating communication among systems and troubleshooting professional and constituent problems. In 2003, Mary Louise was recruited to the Office of Health & Human Services by Rick Werner, then interim director, to work on a coordinated approach to policy and long term planning among the systems. Her assignments included administration within and among the systems ranging from community TANF projects to program development to grants and contracts. Madigan worked as fact checker and policy advisor to five successful levy efforts and she will continue to use her relationships and institutional knowledge on future levies.
