- 4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE JUNE 3, 2015 MEETING

A motion was made by Ms. Brown, seconded by Mr. Jones and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes of the June 3, 2015 meeting.

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County has received a request from Old Brooklyn Community Development Corporation for a Resolution supporting an application for tenth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission for the conservation of ecologically significant areas for protection adjacent to the Henninger Road Landfill in Old Brooklyn in the City of Cleveland, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23; and

WHEREAS, West Creek Reservation project includes the acquisition of 2 parcels in the Old Brooklyn neighborhood of Cleveland located at 4100 Pearl Road adjacent to the Henninger Road Landfill. This project would capitalize on the efforts to create permanently public accessible green space that respects and restores the natural qualities adjacent to the waterways of Cuyahoga County; and

WHEREAS, the project is known as "Big Creek Watershed Preservation Project" and is located in County Council District No. 3; and

WHEREAS, Old Brooklyn Community Development Corporation is a non-profit organization whose mission is to develop and revitalize the community by uniting and empowering residents, business leaders and government around plans and initiatives and achieve social, economic and civic improvement; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost is \$200,000.00; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23 provides that "an entity seeking a grant for a project that is eligible for funding shall submit an application to the natural resources assistance council with geographical jurisdiction over the proposed project area;" and, Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23(B) further provides that "in

addition to the application, an applicant for a grant for a project shall include a copy of a resolution supporting the project from each county in which the proposed project is to be conducted;" and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission provides financial assistance to Natural Resources Assistance Councils for the purpose of preserving open spaces, sensitive ecological areas, and stream corridors; and

WHEREAS, the applications for the tenth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program are due on October 23, 2015 to the Cuyahoga County Natural Resources Assistance Council; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order to meet the application deadline required by the Cuyahoga County Natural Resources Assistance Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County has received a request from Western Reserve Land Conservancy for a Resolution supporting an application for tenth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission for the conservation of ecologically significant areas for protection located between Cedar Road and Fairmount Boulevard and to the west of Lander Road in the City of Pepper Pike, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23; and

WHEREAS, Western Reserve Land Conservancy project intends to purchase a perpetual conservation easement on approximately 13 acres of old growth forest and wetland property owned and maintained by the Ursuline Sisters of Cleveland. The property is located between Cedar Road and Fairmount Boulevard and to the west of Lander Road in the City of Pepper Pike; and

WHEREAS, the project is known as "Ursuline Sisters Conservation Easement" and is located in County Council District No. 9; and

WHEREAS, Western Reserve Land Conservancy is a non-profit organization whose mission is to provide natural places that nourish and support vibrant and prosperous communities by identifying, preserving, restoring and maintaining essential assets like clean water, working farms, wildlife areas and parks; and

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost is \$600,000.00; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23 provides that "an entity seeking a grant for a project that is eligible for funding shall submit an application to the natural resources assistance council with geographical jurisdiction over the proposed

project area;" and, Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23(B) further provides that "in addition to the application, an applicant for a grant for a project shall include a copy of a resolution supporting the project from each county in which the proposed project is to be conducted;" and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission provides financial assistance to Natural Resources Assistance Councils for the purpose of preserving open spaces, sensitive ecological areas, and stream corridors; and

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County has received a request from Western Reserve Land Conservancy for a Resolution of support of an application for tenth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission for the conservation of ecologically significant areas for protection in the Village of Hunting Valley, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23; and

WHEREAS, Western Reserve Land Conservatory project area will stretch from the banks of the Chagrin River westward toward SOM Center Road and include 630 linear feet of the State Scenic Chagrin River as well as substantial headwater stream footage. The project consists of the fee simple acquisition of approximately 147 acres of ecological, historical and cultural significance; and

WHEREAS, the project is known as "Chagrin Valley Greenway Connector" and is located in County Council District No. 6; and
