1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Jones called the meeting to order at 1:04 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Mr. Jones asked Assistant Deputy Clerk Culek to call the roll. Committee members Jones, Conwell and Miller were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Committee members Schron and Brown entered the meeting shortly after the roll call was taken.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT RELATED TO THE AGENDA

No public comments were given.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE MARCH 2, 2016 MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Miller, seconded by Ms. Conwell and approved by unanimous vote approve the minutes from the March 2, 2016 meeting.

  - a) R2016-0058: A Resolution authorizing an amendment to Agreement No. AG1400025-01 with Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities for Individual Options Waiver eligibility verification services for reimbursement of Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services for the period 1/1/2014 12/31/2015 to extend the time period to 12/31/2017 and for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed

\$1,338,444.41; authorizing the County Executive to execute the amendment and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Ms. Daphne Kelker, Contracts Administrator for the Cuyahoga County Division of Children & Family Services, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2016-0058. Discussion ensued.

  - 2) Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas/Division of Juvenile Court in the amount not-to-exceed \$3,930,853.72.
  - 3) Cuyahoga County Prosecuting Attorney's Office in the amount not-to-exceed \$3,751,344.00.

Ms. Deborah Watkins, Executive Director of the Office of Child Support Services, and Mr. Richard Weiler, Manager at Child Support Enforcement Agency, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2016-0059. Discussion ensued.

WHEREAS, this program is funded by two sources: Title IV-E Administration and Training and Health and Human Services Levy; and

WHEREAS, the services, service providers and amounts are as follows:

Resolution authorizing revenue Cooperative generating Partnership Agreement with Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,350,000.00 for eligibility evaluation and supportive services for the period 1/1/2016 - 12/31/2018; authorizing the County Executive to execute agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Health and Human Services/ Division of Children and Family Services recommends approval of a revenue generating Cooperative Partnership Agreement with Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,350,000.00 for eligibility evaluation and supportive services for the period 1/1/2016 - 12/31/2018; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 5153.16 of the Ohio Revised Code, the County, through its Division of Children and Family Services, is vested with the responsibility to provide services to children with developmental disabilities up to 21 years of age who are abused, neglected or dependent, unruly or delinquent who have been identified to have a protected service need or are otherwise in its custody; and

WHEREAS, the goal of this agreement is to provide evaluation and supportive services (the "Supportive Services") to children with developmental disabilities up to 21 years of age who are abused, neglected or dependent, unruly or delinquent who have been identified to have a protected service need or are otherwise in the custody of the County; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the agreement, the CCBDD will provide reimbursement to the County for the Services in the amount of \$450,000.00 per year, for a total of three years; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:
