

MINUTES CUYAHOGA COUNTY JUSTICE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE MEETING FRIDAY, MAY 25, 2012 CUYAHOGA COUNTY JUSTICE CENTER COUNCIL CHAMBERS – 1ST FLOOR 11:30 AM

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairwoman Simon called the meeting to order at 11:37 a.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Ms. Simon asked Assistant Deputy Clerk Thurman to call the roll. Committee members Simon, Connally and Jones were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Councilmembers Miller and Rogers were also in attendance.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT RELATED TO THE AGENDA

Mr. Rayshawn Wells, a student from Rhodes High School, addressed the Committee regarding issues of concern to him relating to Resolution No. R2012-0092, a Resolution making awards on RQ21516 to various providers for residential treatment services.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE APRIL 27, 2012 MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Jones, seconded by Ms. Simon and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes of the April 27, 2012 meeting.

 - a) <u>R2012-0091</u>: A Resolution making awards on RQ21514 to various providers for residential treatment services for the Youth and Family Community Partnership Program for the period 1/1/2012 - 12/31/2013; authorizing the County Executive to execute the contracts and all other documents consistent with

said awards and this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective:

- 5) The Cleveland Christian Home Incorporated in the amount not-toexceed \$400,000.00.
- 6) New Directions, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$250,000.00.
- 7) The Village Network in the amount not-to-exceed \$250,000.00.
- 8) Catholic Charities Services Corporation dba Parmadale in the amount not-to-exceed \$250,000.00.
- b) <u>R2012-0092</u>: A Resolution making awards on RQ21516 to various providers for residential treatment services for the period 2/1/2012 1/31/2014; authorizing the County Executive to execute the contracts and all other documents consistent with said awards and this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective:
 - 1) Applewood Centers, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$30,000.00.
 - 2) Beech Brook in the amount not-to-exceed \$30,000.00.
 - 3) Bellefaire Jewish Children's Bureau in the amount not-toexceed \$130,000.00.
 - 4) Berea Children's Home aka Guidestone in the amount not-to-exceed \$130,000.00.
 - 5) Carrington Youth Academy LLC in the amount not-to-exceed \$30,000.00.
 - 6) The Cleveland Christian Home Incorporated in the amount not-toexceed \$200,000.00.
 - 7) Cornell Abraxas Group, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$250,000.00.
 - 8) The Glen Mills Schools in the amount not-to-exceed \$720,000.00.
 - 9) The House of Emmanuel Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$100,000.00.
 - 10) Keystone Richland Center LLC dba Foundations for Living in the amount not-to-exceed \$125,000.00.
 - 11) New Directions, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$30,000.00.
 - 12) Safe House Ministries, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$75,000.00.
 - 13) The Village Network in the amount not-to-exceed \$300,000.00.
 - 14) Catholic Charities Services Corporation dba Parmadale in the amount not-to-exceed \$100,000.00.

Ms. Simon asked that Resolution Nos. R2012-0091 and R2012-0092 be considered simultaneously.

Mr. Tim McDevitt, Director of Probation Services for Juvenile Court; Ms. Karen Lippman, Deputy Director of Juvenile Court; and Ms. Lenora Lockett, Director of the Office of Procurement and Diversity, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution Nos. R2012-0091 and R2012-0092. Discussion ensued.

Committee members and Councilmembers asked questions of Mr. McDevitt, Ms. Lippman and Ms. Lockett pertaining to the items, which they answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Simon with a second by Mr. Jones, Resolution Nos. R2012-0091 and R2012-0092 were considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of rules.

There was no miscellaneous business.
