WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County has received a request from Gates Mills Land Conservancy for a Resolution of support of an application for eighth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission for the conservation of ecologically significant areas for protection along the Chagrin River Watershed and North Chagrin Reservation, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23; and,

WHEREAS, the 51-acre Newell property, located at the corner of Sherman and County Line Roads in the Village of Gates Mills, will provide opportunities for passive outdoor recreation to Gates Mills residents. The property contains old field habitat as well as habitat for state-listed rare species and contributes to the water quality of the Chagrin River watershed. This property is located in close proximity to the North Chagrin Reservation and an additional 548 acres of land preserved by Gates Mills Land Conservancy. The project will increase the amount of interconnected green space in the Village of Gates Mills, in accordance with the Cuyahoga County Greenspace Plan; and,

WHEREAS, the project is known as "Newell Property" and is located in County Council District No. 6; and,

WHEREAS, Western Reserve Land Conservancy is partnering with Gates Mills Land Conservancy to apply for funding for the project. The total estimated project cost is \$400,000.00; and

WHEREAS, Gates Mills Land Conservancy will likely purchase and own the property long-term and Gates Mills Land Conservancy and Western Reserve Land Conservancy will co-hold a conservation easement on the property to protect the land and its natural resources for perpetuity; and, WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23 provides that "an entity seeking a grant for a project that is eligible for funding shall submit an application to the natural resources assistance council with geographical jurisdiction over the proposed project area;" and, Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23(B) further provides that "in addition to the application, an applicant for a grant for a project shall include a copy of a resolution supporting the project from each county in which the proposed project is to be conducted;" and,

WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission provides financial assistance to Natural Resource Assistance Councils for the purpose of preserving open spaces, sensitive ecological areas, and stream corridors; and,

WHEREAS, the applications for the eighth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program are due on January 10, 2014 to the Cuyahoga County Natural Resource Assistance Council; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order to meet the application deadline required by the Cuyahoga County Natural Resources Assistance Council.

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County has received a request from West Creek Conservancy for a Resolution of support of an application for eighth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission for the conservation of ecologically significant areas for protection along the Cuyahoga River pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23; and,

WHEREAS, West Creek Conservancy intends to acquire in fee simple approximately 22 acres along the Cuyahoga River, within the Village of Brooklyn Heights; and,

WHEREAS, the property to be acquired is a closed construction and debris landfill near the end of Valley Belt Road, immediately along the Cuyahoga River, directly across the river from Canalway Reservation and is located in County Council District No. 6; and,

WHEREAS, in partnership with the Village of Brooklyn Heights, West Creek Conservancy intends to acquire (from a private owner) and protect the property for conservation and recreational usage, all in a coordinated effort to reclaim the Cuyahoga Valley; and,

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County has received a request from Western Reserve Land Conservancy for a Resolution of support of an application for eighth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission for the conservation of ecologically significant areas for protection along the Chagrin River, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23; and,

WHEREAS, the 22-acre Chagrin-Bentleyville property is located in the Village of Moreland Hills and the Village of Chagrin Falls, south of Chagrin Boulevard and east of Bentleyville Road. The property slopes into a steep valley with streamside forests along the Chagrin River that offers opportunities for both green space and watershed protection. The Cuyahoga County Green Space Plan recognizes the Chagrin River as one of the three major river valleys in the county and the Chagrin River Watershed Action Plan supports limiting the negative effects of stream bank erosion on the Chagrin River that are exacerbated by steep slopes and poor soil quality; and,

WHEREAS, Western Reserve Land Conservancy intends to purchase the property and will hold a conservation easement on the property to protect the land and its natural resources in perpetuity; and,

WHEREAS, the project is known as "Chagrin-Bentleyville Restoration" and is located in County Council District No. 6; and,

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost is \$900,000.00; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23 provides that "an entity seeking a grant for a project that is eligible for funding shall submit an application to the natural resources assistance council with geographical jurisdiction over the proposed project area;" and, Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23(B) further provides that "in addition to the application, an applicant for a grant for a project shall include a copy of a resolution supporting the project from each county in which the proposed project is to be conducted;" and,

WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission provides financial assistance to Natural Resource Assistance Councils for the purpose of preserving open spaces, sensitive ecological areas, and stream corridors; and,

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County has received a request from LAND Studio, Inc. for a Resolution of support of an application for eighth-round funding under the Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission for the conservation of ecologically significant areas for protection along the Irishtown Overlook, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 164.23; and,

WHEREAS, LAND Studio, Inc. intends to acquire land at 1505 West 25<sup>th</sup> Street and restore the land and provide public access. This project would be the first step towards realizing both the neighborhood's and Cuyahoga County Planning Commission's vision of having a park along the ridge overlooking the Flats at the top of Irishtown Bend between Franklin Avenue and Detroit Avenue on the east side of West 25<sup>th</sup> Street. This project would create public greenspace that offers dramatic views of the Cuyahoga Valley and Downtown Cleveland as well as restore the land to a more natural state. This new greenspace would also feature a trailhead that would directly connect to the Lake Link Trail, Towpath Trail and the proposed Red Line Greenway, eventually allowing residents to have direct and uninterrupted pathways to the Cuyahoga National Park via the Towpath Trail. The project helps achieve the goals of the Cuyahoga County Greenspace Plan, which specifically states that this location is one of the major ridges and view-sheds that should be acquired and opened up for public access; and,

WHEREAS, the project is known as "Irishtown Overlook" and is located in County Council District No. 7; and,

WHEREAS, LAND Studio, Inc. is a non-profit whose mission includes improving Cleveland neighborhoods through creating vibrant parks and public spaces. Ohio City, Inc. (the area's community development corporation) and Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Authority (CMHA) are collaborating on the Clean Ohio application. As the current landowner, the potential acquisition is beneficial to CMHA as it would allow it to divest itself of an outdated property and give it the funds to provide improved housing options for the current residents. The removal of the 3-story CMHA structure would help reduce the pressure on the hillside in the meanwhile.
