WHEREAS, the County Executive on behalf of the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department has authorized a revenue generating underlying agreement with The City of Cleveland in the minimum amount of \$2,365,658.95 per annum for operation of jail services for City of Cleveland prisoners; authorizing a Lease in connection with said agreement in the amount not-to-exceed \$1.00 per annum for use of the City's Central Prison Unit located at 1300 Ontario Street, 6th Floor, Cleveland; and

WHEREAS, the primary goals of this project are for the City of Cleveland to turn operation of its prisoners over to the County Sheriff and for the County Sheriff to provide the City of Cleveland with prisoner booking, housing, and other related jail services; and

WHEREAS, the funding for the agreement is 100% from the revenue generating agreement with the City of Cleveland; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by the County can continue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. The Cuyahoga County Council authorizes a revenue generating underlying agreement with The City of Cleveland in the minimum amount of \$2,365,658.95 per annum for operation of jail services for City of Cleveland prisoners; authorizing a Lease in connection with said agreement in the amount not-to-exceed

\$1.00 per annum for use of the City's Central Prison Unit located at 1300 Ontario Street, 6th Floor, Cleveland.

SECTION 2. That the County Executive is authorized to execute the agreement and all documents consistent with this Resolution.

SECTION 3. It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Department performs background check services for the general public upon request.

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Criminal Investigation ("BCI") and the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") assess fees for performing background check services to the Sheriff's Department.

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Department expends personnel hours and uses County equipment and material to perform background check services.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. Chapter 716 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

Chapter 716: Background Check Service Fees (General Public)

Section 716.01: Establishment of Fees for Fingerprints and Web Checks

The Sheriff's Department shall collect and deposit fees for concealed handgun licenses in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code. For all other fingerprint and background check services, the Sheriff's Department shall establish the fees as follows:

(A) The fees shall take into account the costs assessed to the Sheriff's Department by the Bureau of Criminal Investigation and the Federal Bureau of Investigation to perform the checks; and

(B) The fees shall also take into account the costs incurred by the Sheriff's Department in performing these services, including personnel and technology costs.

Section 716.02 Posting of Fees on Web Site

The Sheriff's Department shall post the most up-to-date fees to conduct background check services on its web site.

SECTION 2. It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety of the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 2.03(9) requires the County Executive to submit to the County Council prior to the beginning of each biennium, a proposed operating budget for the upcoming biennium; and

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 2.03(9)(B) requires the County Executive to submit as part of the biennium budget a statement of proposed expenditures, shown by department, office, agency, authority, board and commission, and by activity, character and object; and

WHEREAS, Article III, Section 3.09 (5) empowers the County Council to adopt and amend the biennial operating budget and to make appropriations for the County; and

WHEREAS, on a biennial basis all departments, offices, agencies, authorities, and boards and commissions come before the County Council to present their upcoming biennial budget and have the opportunity to request any additional appropriation for any unbudgeted expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the County Council desires to receive notification prior to the expenditure of funds for any unbudgeted items to ensure County funds are not used for any unintended purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1: The Cuyahoga County Council hereby amends Chapter 701 of the Cuyahoga County Code by adding Section 701.05 to establish a policy for a more consistent approach to compensation including any pay rate adjustments, cost of

living adjustments, and/or merit pay awards to all or a significant part of its non-bargaining employees as part of the biennial budget process or throughout the year to read as follows:

SECTION 701.05: Advance Notice of Proposed Compensation Changes

A. In order to provide for a more consistent approach to compensation and benefits for County employees, the County's policy shall be to request any Cuyahoga County department, office, agency, court, board, commission or other authority to which biennial budget appropriations are made provide thirty (30) days prior written notice to the Clerk of Council of any planned pay rate adjustments, cost of living adjustments, and/or merit pay awards applicable to all or a significant part of its non-bargaining employees. This provision shall not apply to any such adjustments and/or awards that have been specifically provided for in the biennial budget then in effect.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
