1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Gallagher called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Mr. Gallagher asked Ms. Culek to call the roll. Committee members Gallagher, Germana and Hairston were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Committee members Greenspan and Conwell entered the meeting shortly after the roll call was taken. Councilmembers Miller and Simon were also in attendance.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT RELATED TO THE AGENDA

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE JUNE 17, 2014 MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Germana, seconded by Mr. Hairston and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes of the June 17, 2014 meeting.

- 5. MATTERS REFERRED TO COMMITTEE
  - a) R2014-0073: A Resolution authorizing a revenue generating Underlying Agreement with City of Cleveland in the minimum amount of \$2,365,658.95 per annum for operation of jail services for City Prisoners,

effective 6/1/2014; authorizing a Lease in connection with said agreement in the amount not-to-exceed \$1.00 per annum for use of the City's Central Prison Unit located at 1300 Ontario Street, 6<sup>th</sup> Floor, Cleveland; authorizing the County Executive to execute the agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Sheriff Bova and Mr. Majeed Makhlouf, Law Director, addressed the Committee regarding Ordinance No. O2014-0019. Discussion ensued.

Committee members and Councilmembers asked questions of Sheriff Bova and Mr. Makhlouf pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

Mr. Greenspan introduced a proposed substitute to Ordinance No. 02014-0019. Discussion ensued.

On a motion by Mr. Greenspan with a second by Mr. Germana, Ordinance No. 02014-0019 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda for second reading, as substituted.

#### 6. DISCUSSION

a) O2013-0023: An Ordinance amending Chapter 701 of the Cuyahoga County Code by adding Section 701.05 to establish a policy for a more consistent approach to compensation including any pay rate adjustments, cost of living adjustments, and/or merit pay awards to all or a significant part of its non-bargaining employees as part of the biennial budget process or throughout the year.

Mr. John Russo, Administrative and Presiding Judge for the Common Pleas Court, and Mr. Makhlouf addressed the Committee regarding Ordinance No. O2013-0023. Discussion ensued.

Committee members and Councilmembers asked questions of Judge Russo and Mr. Makhlouf pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

b) Update regarding Fire Damper Inspection Program

Mr. Andrew Conti, Facilities Maintenance Administrator for the Department of Public Works, addressed the Committee regarding the Fire Damper Inspection Program. Discussion ensued.

WHEREAS, these agreements are for the purpose of providing a Community-based Treatment Center and Multi-Systemic Therapy/Problem Sexual Behavior (MST/PSB) Programs for adjudicated youth who would otherwise be committed to the Ohio Department of Youth Services. The MST/PSB Services provide community-based, in-home family therapy to help families become more self-sufficient; and

WHEREAS, intensive aftercare services are provided by the Court in conjunction with community-based services to aid in re-integration to the community; and

WHEREAS, the performance of each of the selected providers have been evaluated and each provider received satisfactory ratings based upon evaluation indicators; and

WHEREAS, funding for these amendments to contracts is provided through the State (RECLAIM Ohio) grant funds.
