1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairwoman Simon called the meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Ms. Simon asked Assistant Deputy Clerk Carter to call the roll. Committee members Simon and Connally were in attendance and a quorum was not determined. Committee members Germana and Schron were absent from the meeting. Councilmember Miller was also in attendance.

Pursuant to Rule 12F of the Council Rules, Council President Connally appointed Councilmember Miller as a Member Pro Tem of the Education, Environment & Sustainability Committee, and a quorum was then determined.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT RELATED TO THE AGENDA

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE JANUARY 22, 2014 MEETING

A motion was made by Ms. Connally, seconded by Ms. Simon and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes of the January 22, 2014 meeting.

- MATTERS REFERRED TO COMMITTEE
  - a) R2014-0044: A Resolution authorizing an agreement with City of Cleveland/Department of Public Health in the amount not-to-exceed \$682,276.00 for the MomsFirst Program for the Invest in Children

Program for the period 1/1/2014 - 12/31/2015; authorizing the County Executive to execute the agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Dr. Rebekah Dorman, Director of the Office of Early Childhood Invest in Children, and Ms. Lisa Matthews, Director of the MomsFirst Program, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2014-0044. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Dr. Dorman and Ms. Matthews pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

On a motion by Mr. Miller with a second by Ms. Simon, Resolution No. R2014-0044 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

b) R2014-0045: A Resolution authorizing an agreement with Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services Board of Cuyahoga County in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,339,104.00 for the Early Childhood Mental Health Program for the Invest in Children Program for the period 1/1/2014 - 12/31/2015; authorizing the County Executive to execute the agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Dr. Dorman addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2014-0045. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Dr. Dorman pertaining to the item, which she answered accordingly.

On a motion by Mr. Miller with a second by Ms. Connally, Resolution No. R2014-0045 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

c) R2014-0046: A Resolution authorizing an agreement with Cuyahoga County District Board of Health in the amount not-to-exceed \$906,000.00 for the Newborn Home Visiting Program for the Invest in Children Program for the period 1/1/2014 - 12/31/2015; authorizing the County Executive to execute the agreement and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Dr. Dorman and Mr. Marcos Cortes, Program Manager, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2014-0046. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Dr. Dorman and Mr. Cortes pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Simon with a second by Ms. Connally, Resolution No. R2014-0046 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.
