CUYAHOGA COUNTY FINANCE & BUDGETING COMMITTEE MEETING MONDAY, JULY 15, 2013 CUYAHOGA COUNTY JUSTICE CENTER COUNCIL CHAMBERS – 1ST FLOOR 1:00 PM

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Miller called the meeting to order at 1:06 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Mr. Miller asked Assistant Deputy Clerk Carter to call the roll. Committee members Miller, Gallagher, Jones, Connally, Greenspan and Schron were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Committee member Brady entered the meeting shortly after the roll call was taken.

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Fiscal Officer/County Treasurer have recommended an award on RQ27791 to KeyBank Inc. for various banking and treasury services, including depository and lockbox services, travel card services, procurement card services and implementation of the County's College Savings Account Program, for the period 8/24/2013 – 8/23/2017; and,

WHEREAS, KeyBank Inc. has agreed to establish the College Savings Account Program in accordance with Section 804.02 of the Cuyahoga County Code; and,

WHEREAS, the expenses for all the aforementioned banking and treasury services depend on volume, but are reasonably anticipated to be approximately \$255,000.00 annually; and,

WHEREAS, the cost of providing a \$100.00 seed investment per eligible student for the College Savings Account Program depends on volume, but is anticipated not-to-exceed \$1,700,000.00 in the first year of the program; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby makes an award on RQ27791 to KeyBank Inc. for various banking and treasury services, including implementation of the County's College Savings Account Program, for the period 8/24/2013 – 8/23/2017.

SECTION 2. That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby authorizes the County Treasurer to deposit an amount not-to-exceed \$1,700,000.00 with KeyBank Inc. to make \$100.00 seed investments for each eligible student, as defined in Section 804.02

of the Cuyahoga County Code. This deposit shall fund the first year of the College Savings Account Program, and all subsequent deposits shall be authorized by Resolution of Council.

SECTION 2. It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
