Resolution making an award RQ36875 to Americab Transportation, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$8,000,000.00 for Medicaid non-emergency transportation services for the period 9/1/2016 8/31/2018; authorizing the County Executive to execute the contract and all other documents consistent with said award and this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Health and Human Services/Cuyahoga Job and Family Services has recommended an award on RQ36875 to Americab Transportation, Inc. in the amount not-to-exceed \$8,000,000.00 for Medicaid non-emergency transportation services for the period 9/1/2016 - 8/31/2018; and

WHEREAS, the primary goal of the project is to provide transportation services for Medicaid eligible, ambulatory clients to and from facilities within Cuyahoga County for various non-emergency medical treatments; and

WHEREAS, this project is funded 100% by Federal/Medicaid funds; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operations of a County entity.

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Health and Human Services/ Cuyahoga Job and Family Services has recommended an amendment to Contract No. CE1500128-01 with Catholic Charities Corporation for various services for Ohio Works First and Disability Financial Assistance recipients with barriers to employment for the period 7/1/2015 - 6/30/2016 to extend the time period to 6/30/2017 and for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$977,321.00; and

WHEREAS, the goals of this project are to design, implement, and manage the administration of a comprehensive pre-employment screening of participants so that they may be matched with the most appropriate employment and training programs and services available, with the goal of enhancing the ability to ultimately secure employment, thereby improving self-sufficiency outcomes; and
