1. CALL TO ORDER

3. PUBLIC COMMENT RELATED TO THE AGENDA

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE SEPTEMBER 21, 2016 MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Jones, seconded by Ms. Brown and approved by majority vote to approve the minutes of the September 21, 2016 meeting with Ms. Simon abstaining from the vote.

5. MATTERS REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

Ms. Alison Ball, Planner, provided the Committee with overview of the projects and applications requesting funding under the Clean Ohio Green Space Conservation Program.

a) R2016-0170: A Resolution supporting an application for funding under the Clean Ohio Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission on behalf of Natural Areas Land Conservancy for the conservation of ecologically significant areas known as Shelter Hill Ravines located in the Village of Hunting Valley, and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Mr. Keith McClintock, Vice President of Conservation for Western Reserve Land Conservancy, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2016-0170. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Mr. McClintock pertaining to the item, which he answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Simon with a second by Ms. Brown, Resolution No. R2016-0170 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

b) R2016-0171: A Resolution supporting an application for funding under the Clean Ohio Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission on behalf of Western Reserve Land Conservancy for the acquisition and conservation of ecologically significant areas known as Brecksville Upland Preserve located in the City of Brecksville, and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Mr. McClintock addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2016-0171. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Mr. McClintock pertaining to the item, which he answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Simon with a second by Ms. Brown, Resolution No. R2016-0171 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

c) R2016-0172: A Resolution supporting an application for funding under the Clean Ohio Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission on behalf of West Creek Conservancy for the acquisition and conservation of ecologically significant areas along the main stem of West Creek located in the City of Parma, and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Mr. Derek Schafer, Executive Director of West Creek Conservancy; and Ms. Ball, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2016-0172. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Mr. Schafer and Ms. Ball pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Simon with a second by Ms. Brown, Resolution No. R2016-0172 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

d) R2016-0173: A Resolution supporting an application for funding under the Clean Ohio Green Space Conservation Program available through the Ohio Public Works Commission on behalf of L.A.N.D. Studio, Inc. for the acquisition and conservation of ecologically significant areas on Irishtown Bend hillside along the Cuyahoga River located in the City of Cleveland, and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Ms. Tiffany Graham, Project Director for L.A.N.D. Studio, Inc., addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2016-0173. Discussion ensued.

WHEREAS, the County Executive/Department of Health and Human Services/Division of Community Initiatives/Office of Early Childhood has recommended an amendment to Agreement No. AG1400087-01 with Educational Service Center of Cuyahoga County for fiscal and administrative services for the Help Me Grow Bright Beginnings Home Visiting Program for the period 7/1/2014 - 6/30/2016 to extend the time period to 9/30/2016 and for additional funds in the amount not-to-exceed \$470,438.00; and

WHEREAS, the primary goals of this project are to: (a) implement and maintain a coordinated, community-based infrastructure that promotes family-centered services for expectant parents, newborns, infants, toddlers and their respective families and (b) support commitments to family and child well-being; and

WHEREAS, the project is funded 100% by Health and Human Services Levy funds; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

WHEREAS, the primary goals of this project are to: (a) provide out-of-school time services including afterschool and summer programming for children and teenager, transitional services, tutoring and professional development for youth serving workers; and

WHEREAS, this contract will be funded 100% by the Health and Human Services Levy fund; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue.
