WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities (CCBDD) has been engaged in collective bargaining negotiations with Service Employees International Union, District 1199, WV/KY/OH, the Healthcare and Social Services Union, representing approximately 305 employees in various classifications in Adult Services for the period 1/1/2018 - 12/31/2020; and,

WHEREAS, the current Collective Bargaining Agreement between the parties is due to expire on December 31, 2017; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to these negotiations, the parties have reached a tentative agreement setting forth a successor collective bargaining agreement; and,

WHEREAS, the Service Employees International Union, District 1199, Adult Services, ratified the tentative agreement on September 23, 2017 and the CCBDD approved the agreement at its regular meeting on October 26, 2017 and recommended approval by the Cuyahoga County Council; and,

WHEREAS, O.R.C. 4117.10 (B) requires that a public employer submit a request for funds necessary to implement an agreement, and for approval of any other matter requiring the approval of the appropriate legislative body to the legislative body within 14 days of the date on which the parties finalize the agreement, unless otherwise specified, but if the appropriate legislative body is not in session at the time, then within fourteen days after it convenes; and

WHEREAS, O.R.C. 4117.10(B) further states that the legislative body must approve or reject the submission as a whole, and the submission is deemed approved

if the legislative body fails to act within thirty days after the public employer submits the agreement; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become effective immediately to ensure the efficient operation of the Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities; and

WHEREAS, The MetroHealth System seeks to participate in one or more joint purchasing associations available to health care facilities in order to obtain the favorable volume pricing available to the member institutions, thereby reducing the Hospital's overall expense for supplies, equipment and services; and

WHEREAS, on October 25, 2017, The MetroHealth System Board of Trustees adopted Resolution 19136 approving annual joint purchasing policies and procedures for the year 2018.

WHEREAS, The MetroHealth System's current purchasing policy expires December 31, 2017, and in order that critical services provided by The MetroHealth System may continue uninterrupted, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective.

- Appropriation increases and transfers to support the posting of the "controlled" costs, which includes space maintenance (calculated by Public Works/Facilities), security (calculated by the Sheriff's Office), and indirect (calculated by the Fiscal Office) charges. The space and indirect charges were received late this year. Space and security charges are revenue to the Centralized Custodial Fund and the indirect charges are revenue to the General Fund. Though adjustments to the budgets are necessary to post some of the charges, overall Facilities cost decreased from the previous year and the indirect cost recovery increased from the previous year, both of which have a net positive impact on the General Fund budget.
- A decrease in appropriation to both the General Fund and the HHS Levy Fund totaling a combined \$1 million. This allocation was included in the 2016-2017 Biennial Budget originally adopted by Council in December 2015 to address compression in salaries. The Compression Plan was not implemented until Pay 22, reducing the 2017 impact to less than \$150,000. The pay adjustments have been absorbed in the departmental budgets without the need for adjustments. The 2018-2019 budget includes funding to support the annualized impact of the increases.
- An appropriation increase to support subsidy payments from the HHS Levy Fund to the re-entry child welfare, and fatherhood programs. The increase in subsidy over the budget reflects non-local revenue that supports these programs, not the result of over-spending. The higher subsidy amounts are reflected in the Fiscal/OBM projections and do not reflect an additional draw on reserves. The non-local revenue that supports these programs also supports many of the other HHS programs including benefits, child support, and early childhood. Overall, non-local revenue is up from what was originally anticipated in the budget the decrease in these two programs merely reflects how that revenue has been allocated.
- Appropriation increases and transfers to support cash transfers from the remaining inactive capital projects to active projects. This agenda represents the conclusion of Fiscal/OBM's cleanup of the capital projects accounts for DPW/Facilities and Information Technology, the result of which not only has cleaned up the County's financial records to be in accordance with all regulations and established policies and procedures to prevent a recurrence of un- and overfunded projects, but also has reduced the need for General Fund dollars to support current

projects. I would like to acknowledge the work of our staff on this project. In 2018, we will do the same for the Road and Bridge and Sanitary capital projects.

- Appropriation increases to establish two new capital project accounts: the RTA Harvard Garage Build-Out and the HVAC and Fire Alarm Upgrades in the Medical Examiner's Office. These projects are on the revised 2017 Capital Improvements Plan.
- To reduce appropriation to the Veterans' Services Fund to match the available cash.
- To increase appropriation to the Communications Department to support half of the costs associated with the Communications Specialist dedicated to the Medical Examiner's Office and to support a new contract for media training for County directors and select staff. The Communications Specialist had previously been an employee of the Medical Examiner's Office but was transferred to Communications, though the expectation in the 2017 Budget was that his salary would continue to be paid from the Medical Examiner's Office. Since the two agencies are supported by the same funding source (General Fund) and to support the Chief of Communications' plan to consolidate communications, and considering no other Communications' staff salaries are transferred to other departments, funding for this position has been transferred to the Communications budget in 2018.
- An appropriation request to support a General Fund subsidy to the DTAC/Hardest Hit Fund budget in the Prosecutor's Office. This subsidy was not anticipated in the 2017 Budget Update, but was reflected in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter projections. This subsidy supports the cost of the additional staff hired to work the Hardest Hit Fund foreclosure cases. The County does receive reimbursement for these cases from the federal Hardest Hit Fund by way of the Land Bank, but that revenue is on a delay due to the length of time it takes to see a site through to demolition.
- An appropriation transfer to support the transfer of personnel costs in the Department of Development from the Community Development Block Grants to the General Fund. Staff assigned to the CDBG program were called on to assist with the audit and in properly documenting the loan portfolio and these activities are not eligible for CDBG reimbursement.
- Appropriation transfers to cover assigned counsel expenses in Common Pleas Court and postage costs in the Clerk of Courts. The 2018-2019 Budgets assume expenses will remain at this higher amount, which has been reflected in the Fiscal/OBM projections.
- An appropriation transfer within the capital budget for the Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system budget to support salary and benefit expenses for the existing staff through 2019. If additional personnel are hired to support this project, an appropriation transfer will be needed to cover the cost.

Additionally included on this agenda are many cash transfers, including:

- Year-end subsidy transfers from both the General and HHS Levy Funds. Except for fixed subsidies, subsidies have been transferred incrementally throughout the year based on projections. These final transfers will cover 2017 expenses.
- A transfer from the Huntington Garage Fund to the General Fund to cover the debt service payment due on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January on the 2016 Sales Tax bonds issued to support the renovation of the garage.

- Transfers from the inactive capital projects to active capital projects. Following approval of this agenda, all negative cash balances in the old projects will have been eliminated and all surplus cash in the old projects will have been transferred out to current projects. Additionally, following this agenda, all appropriation in inactive projects will have been reduced and the projects will be properly closed. The cash being transferred on this agenda covers expenditures in active projects through November 2017. Cash is transferred into active projects monthly as costs are incurred.
- A repayment to the 0.25% Fund for payments made on the final draws of the Hotel construction project in 2015. There was cash in the project account but for reasons unknown that payment was made from the 0.25% Fund, drawing down on the cash reserves.
- Transfers from both inactive capital projects and the General Fund to support the acquisition of the RTA Harvard Garage. This \$3.8 million payment will be 90% reimbursed by the Sanitary Fund (70%) and the Road & BRdige Funds (20%). The details of that repayment are being discussed with the Department of Public Works.
- The transfer of cash to cover the renovation work being completed at the Cleveland Police Headquarters.
- The transfer of cash within the Sanitary subfunds to cover expenditures.

WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 9, Subsection 5 of the Cuyahoga County Charter gives County Council the power to adopt and amend the County's operating budget and capital improvements program and to make appropriations for the County; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Title 7, Chapter 701 of the Cuyahoga County Code, County Council established the procedure for a two-year budget, capital improvements and appropriations process with an annual update; and

WHEREAS, Title 7, Chapter 701.01, Subsection C of the Cuyahoga County Code states that not later than at the first County Council meeting in October of each oddnumbered year, the County Executive shall submit to Council a proposed operating budget and capital improvements program for the two fiscal years beginning January 1 of the year following the submission. The materials submitted shall include all information required by Article 2, Section 3, Subsections 9, 10, and 11 of the Cuyahoga County Charter; and

WHEREAS, Title 7, Chapter 701.01, Subsection E also states that County Council shall review, amend as needed, and adopt the biennial operating budget and capital improvements program and make all necessary appropriations not later than December 15<sup>th</sup> of each odd-numbered year.

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of County entities.

<u>SECTION 2. **SECTION 4.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County and the reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 5.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Attached for your review and approval is the revised 2018-2019 Biennial Operating Budget for Cuyahoga County. This Budget builds on the Executive's Recommended Budget for 2018-2019, submitted to Council in October and includes amendments recommended by the Fiscal Office (i.e. Technical Amendments) and the Cuyahoga County Council (Council Amendments). The Administration respectfully requests adoption of this budget during the December 12<sup>th</sup> Council Meeting and thanks County Council for its willingness to work so cooperatively to prepare this budget. As has been the case for the past several years, during this budget cycle Cuyahoga County was challenged to respond to the continued increase in the cost of operations and a decrease in revenue, specifically the loss of Medicaid MCO Sales Tax totaling approximately \$30 million each year. Preparing a budget under these circumstances is extremely difficult and is made more so by the need to react to factors that impact the County's systems, such as opiate addiction, and the desire to be proactive and innovate in our attempt to satisfy the County's mission.

The Technical Amendments proposed by the Fiscal Office (detailed on the attachment) adjust the budget for the Board of Developmental Disabilities to match what was approved by the Board in November 2017 (after submission of the Executive's Recommended Budget) and makes minor adjustments to various special revenue funds based on either updated information from the agencies/departments, an updated estimate based on the most recent data available, and/or to correct errors or omissions in the Executive's Recommended Budget. There is only one technical amendment that impacts the General Fund: a reduction totaling \$150,000 in the budget of the County Treasurer's Office, which was reviewed and approved by the County Treasurer and the County Fiscal Officer.

The County Amendments propose a number of changes to the Executive's Recommended Budget, including, but not limited to:

- Funding reductions in the General Fund budgets of the Departments of Development and Information Technology
- Additional funding to the Department of Health and Human Services to support programming in Family and Children First Council (Closing the Achievement Gap), Homeless Services, and Senior and Adult Services
- Restoration of the cuts applied in the Executive's Recommended Budget to the 2018 General and HHS Levy Fund budgets of Juvenile Court

Please note that a few of the Council amendments have been changed from what was reviewed and approved in the Committee of the Whole on December 27th:

The \$1.5 million increase in the loan repayments to the Economic Development Fund do not, in and of themselves, impact the General Fund. As loan repayments increase, the General Fund subsidy to the Economic Development Fund can decrease with no impact on development activity. In anticipation of loan repayments increasing by \$1.5 million, the 2019 subsidy to the Economic Development Fund was decreased from \$2 million to \$1 million. No subsidy was planned for 2018 in the Executive's Recommended Budget.

- Transfer \$3.5 million of the cash balance in the Development Revolving Loan Fund that originated with the Board of Commissioners' Blue Ribbon Program, to the General Fund in 2018 and transfer \$2 million in 2019. These transfers will offset the General Fund's contribution to the Department of Development and economic development activities. These transfers will nearly eliminate the cash balance in this fund by the end of 2019.
- Decrease the General Fund subsidy to the Economic Development Fund by \$1.5 million in 2019 and 2020.

The Council Amendments reviewed in Committee anticipated an overall decrease to the General Fund for Development totaling \$7 million in 2018 and 2019, but relied on cash that will not be available. The proposed adjustments also result in a combined General Fund decrease of \$7 million.

This budget was prepared based on the information available at the time of development. Since many of the County's expenses are based on service demands, many of which cannot be controlled (e.g. cases filed in the Courts, the number of children in County custody), the budget is monitored monthly by the Fiscal Office and any changes that arise that may have a financial impact are communicated to both the County Executive and the County Council.

At this time there are no known changes, although I do want to note that Open Enrollment, the process by which County employees select their healthcare plans for the coming year, takes place after the Executive's Recommended Budget is submitted to County Council for consideration. The Fiscal Office has not yet received final Open Enrollment data, though it's my understanding that the data vary from what was anticipated in the budget as it relates to employee participation and plan selection. This impacts the budgets of every agency and department and the revenue to the Self Insurance Fund, which needs to be sufficient to cover the expenditures and build up the mandated reserve, which did not happen in 2017 as was planned in the budget. The Fiscal Office will report the results of Open Enrollment and communicate the potential impact on the budget in January in its Monthly Update to Council.

WHEREAS, Section 202.12 of the Cuyahoga County Code sets forth the establishment and duties of the Department of Public Safety and Justice Services; and

WHEREAS, the amendment proposed is designed to clarify the divisions and sections of the Department of Public Safety and Justice Services; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of a County entity.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Section 202.12 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended to read as follows (additions are bolded and underlined, deletions are stricken):

- A. The Department of Public Safety and Justice Services is hereby officially established, and it shall be its own appointing authority pursuant to Section 9.04 of the Cuyahoga County Charter.
- B. The duties functions, and employees of the former Department of Justice Affairs, which has historically operated as its own department, are hereby incorporated into the herein established Department of Public Safety and Justice Services. The Department of Public Safety and Justice Services shall contain the following divisions and sections:
  - 1. Public Safety & Justices Services Administration,
  - 2. Public Safety Grants Criminal Justice Information Sharing (CJIS)
  - 3. Information Technology, containing the Cuyahoga Regional Information System section Cuyahoga Emergency Communications System (CECOMS)

- 4. Office of Emergency Management, containing the Cuyahoga Emergency Communications System section,
- 5. Witness/Victim, and Fiscal and Grant Services
- 6. Mediation. Fusion Center
- 7. <u>Witness Victim Services</u>
- C. The specific goals, duties, and activities of the Department of Public Safety and Justice Services and its divisions shall be further determined by the County Executive who shall employ and supervise a Director and such number of deputies, assistants, and employees as shall be reasonably necessary in carrying out the duties of the new Department of Public Safety and Justice Services. Nothing in Section 202.12 of the Cuyahoga County Code is intended to limit the ability of the County Executive and the Director of the Department of Public Safety and Justice Services to abolish positions for the purpose of enhancing the efficiency of operations or for any other reason permitted by general law.

**SECTION 2.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County and the reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
