The Office of Budget & Management requests that the members of County Council consider the attached fiscal resolution for approval on first reading at the meeting on **February 27, 2018**. The requested fiscal items, including additional appropriations, appropriation transfers, and cash transfers, are necessary to cover expenses.

This agenda includes the following requests:

- Several requests necessary to effectuate the proper closure of expired grants. Having devoted the second half of last year to properly budgeting, managing, and closing capital projects, OBM is now focused on assisting agencies and departments with properly budgeting, managing, and closing grants. It is critically important, for many reasons, not the least of which are the requirements dictated by ORC Section x as it relates to the Certificate of Resources, that appropriation levels do not exceed available resources and that when grants expire the authority to spend is removed. This prevents unnecessary and unanticipated subsidies from the General and/or Health and Human Services Levy Funds. In some instances, cash is being returned to the General Fund and the Health and Human Services Levy Funds, which means that the agency/department received the grant dollars to cover expenses, but either the expenses did not properly post to the grant or the revenue was improperly posted to the wrong account. These adjustments properly revenue and expenditures.
- An appropriation decrease to the Self Insurance Fund, which captures the activity of the Benefits Program for County employees. The 2018 budget for Benefits included an allocation of \$400,000 for the \$200 incentive payouts to employees who receive County benefits and achieved at least 200 "wellness points" in 2017. The payouts posted in Pay Period 3 of 2018 and totaled \$199,400. Since the payouts posted with payroll in agency/departmental budgets, the appropriation is not needed in Benefits.
- A request to appropriate \$264,000 to the Enterprise Resource Planning project to support the contract for third-party assurance on behalf of County Council and \$190,967.48 to support mobility (Public Works) and consulting for the data architecture strategy. Effective 2018, the ERP is supported by the County's General Fund. Through January 2018, \$6.9 million of the \$25 million budget has been appropriated (a third of which has been in personnel) and \$4.3 million has been spent.
- A request to appropriate a total of \$2.7 million to the Department of Health and Human Services to spend the additional funding transferred to the Department from the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services in January 2018. This additional funding is being allocated to Job and Family Services, Senior and Adult Services, Children and Family Services, and the Office of Re-Entry, the latter of which will maintain job training and placement services at the Euclid Jail.

- A request to increase appropriation to the Fiscal Office to encumber a contract with KeyBank for the travel procurement contract. Though this requires additional appropriation, no expenses will post to the Fiscal Office, except for Fiscal Office travel. All expenses will post to the agencies/departments requesting to travel and will come out of their respective Other Operating budgets. As such, this appropriation request will have no net impact on the General Fund, but it will improve the ease and efficiency in travel procurement and tracking.
- Request to increase appropriation to the HHS Administration budget to support the expenses associated with three employees that were originally budgeted in the Department of Human Resources' General Fund budget. The Department has determined that these employees are dedicated full-time to HHS agencies and therefore should post to the HHS budget.
- Request to appropriate \$1.1 million to the Department of Information Technology's Internal Service Fund (Telecommunications) to partially repay a cash advance made from the General Fund in 2017 to eliminate the negative cash balance in the Fund. This Fund generates revenue from chargebacks to user agencies, but the Department is behind on charging; as a result, there was a negative cash balance in the Fund and the advance was made to prevent an audit finding. The balance of the advance will be repaid when the Department completes billing. If the chargebacks fail to recover funding for all the expenses that posted, a cash transfer from the Department's 2018 General Fund budget will be requested.
- An increase in appropriation and cash transfer request in and from the Sanitary Sewer and Road/Bridge Funds to partially repay an advance made from the General Fund to the RTA Harvard Garage project. This project, which seeks to consolidate locations, is estimated to cost \$21 million including acquisition and renovation. Funding comes from the Sanitary Sewer Funds (70%), the Road and Bridge Funds (20%), and the General Fund. The General Fund is making advances to the project to cover expenditures because, according to the Department, the special revenue funds cannot support annual payments beyond the original estimate of \$1.3 million/year. It is expected that as the other properties are sold, proceeds from the sale will reimburse the General Fund for contributions made beyond 10%.
- A request to transfer appropriation from HHS Children and Family Services to HHS Administration to support the payroll costs associated with two new employees in Communications that will be solely dedicated to health and human services. The Department of Health and Human Services is eliminating vacant Program Officer positions to offset this cost. Also included is a request to transfer appropriation within the Department of Communications to support a new position. The Department was allocated \$19,000 in its 2018 budget for a contract for social media consulting that is no longer needed; this request seeks to transfer the appropriation to personnel to cover half of the cost of the new position. The balance will be paid by the Department of Health and Human Services (Administration).

City of East Cleveland, et al.*, United States District Court, Ohio Northern District, Eastern Division Case No. 1:17-CV-0377, and Eugene Johnson filed the action captioned *Eugene Johnson v. City of East Cleveland, et al.*, United States District Court, Ohio Northern District, Eastern Division Case No. 1:17-CV-0611, which actions included claims against Cuyahoga County and former Assistant Prosecuting Attorneys Carmen Marino and Deborah Naiman alleging federal civil rights violations and state law claims ("Matter"); and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have reached an agreement that, if consummated, will fully settle and resolve the Matter; and

WHEREAS, Council, having been briefed about the facts and the history of the case, approves of the proposed settlement.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** The County Council hereby approves a settlement agreement with the Plaintiffs in the amount of Four Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,500,000.00), inclusive of all costs and attorneys' fees to be paid by means of three separate warrants, each in the amount of One Million Five Hundred Thousand

Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) to be paid to each of the following individuals: Derrick Wheatt, Laurese Glover, and Eugene Johnson.

**SECTION 2.** The County Executive (or his authorized designee) is hereby authorized to execute a settlement agreement and any other documents to effectuate the settlement in accordance with this Resolution.

**SECTION 3.** If any specific appropriation is necessary to effectuate this settlement, the Director of the Office of Budget and Management is hereby directed to submit the requisite resolution for County Council's first meeting in March 2018 to appropriate any necessary funds to effectuate this settlement. Such appropriation is hereby approved.

**SECTION 4.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that the proceedings in the case may cease and to continue the usual and daily operations of the County Departments affected by this matter. #### **Juvenile Court Division**

Both Carrington Youth Academy and Cleveland Christian Home will be providing standard staff secure shelter care services. However, Beech Brook will be providing a new component of respite and therapeutic foster homes. Those youth residing in the homes will be able to receive a small amount of services to assist in getting these youths linked up with mental health services prior to adjudication. This will provide another alternative to secure detention for a limited number of youth who meet the criteria for shelter care services.

The addition of another vendor will provide extra beds for the Court to utilize for these youth, which will assist in keeping youth out of the Detention Center. The Court has historically always had a need for additional alternatives to detention. This provides safe places for youth to reside yet remains an arm of the Detention Center. An RFP was issued for this project and four (4) vendors responded, the Court chose to contract with three (3) of those vendors. This will be utilized with Juvenile Court youth.

WHEREAS, the County of Cuyahoga, Ohio (the "County") has heretofore issued its \$137,980,000 Various Purpose Sales Tax Revenue Bonds (the "Series 2014 Bonds"), of which, pursuant to Resolution R2014-0255 (the "County Facilities Bond Resolution"), \$122,000,000 was issued for the purpose of paying or reimbursing the costs of constructing, maintaining, expanding, refurbishing, renovating, upgrading, improving, furnishing, and equipping certain County Facilities (as such term is defined in the County Facilities Bond Resolution), as well as for the purpose of paying capitalized interest on the Series 2014 Bonds and paying the costs of issuance in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined not to proceed at this time with the construction of the Emergency Operations Center project (the "Original County Emergency Operations Center Project") or the Medical Examiner's Building for the County Data Center project (the "Original County Data Center Project", together with the Original County Emergency Operations Center Project, the "Original Projects") both of which were included as part of the County Facilities to be financed with the Series 2014 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the revised projects will be less costly than the Original Projects; and

WHEREAS, this Council has determined that a portion of the proceeds of the Series 2014 Bonds that would have been allocable to the Original Projects in the principal amount not to exceed \$24,000,000 (\$10 million from the Original County Emergency Operations Center Project and \$14 million from the Original County Data Center Project) should be used for the purpose of paying the costs of demolition

of blighted and nuisance properties and making grants to municipalities and community improvement corporations therefor, as described in Section 1 herein and in Cuyahoga County Code Chapter 807 (the "Demolition Project"); and

The Series 2014 Bonds are special obligations of the County, and the principal of and interest (and any premium) on the Series 2014 Bonds are payable solely from the Pledged Revenues and the Pledged Funds (as such terms are defined in the County Facilities Bond Resolution), together with other available funds of the County, and such payment is secured by a pledge of and a lien on the Pledged Revenues and the Pledged Funds as provided by the Chapter 133 of the Revised Code, the County Facilities Bond Resolution and this Resolution.

As used herein, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

"*Act*" means Chapter 133, Ohio Revised Code, as enacted and amended from time to time.

"Continuing County Sales Tax" means the one percent (1%) County Sales Tax adopted July 6, 1987, by the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board"), as the predecessor legislative authority to the Council, authorizing the levy and County collection of sales and use taxes for the purpose of providing additional general revenues for the County on a continuous basis.

*"County Executive"* means the County Executive of the County; provided, for purposes of the signing of documents, certificates and other instruments other than the Bonds and the Official Statement, County Executive includes the County Executive's Chief of Staff as the County Executive's designee pursuant to Executive Order No. EO2015-0001 and any other person duly designated by the County Executive.

*"County Sales Tax"* means the one and one-quarter percent (1.25%) County Sales Tax authorized under Sections 5739.021 and 5741.021 of the Ohio Revised Code pursuant to the County Sales Tax Resolutions.

"*County Sales Tax Resolutions*" means (i) the resolution authorizing the Continuing County Sales Tax, (ii) the resolution adopted by the Board on July 26, 2007, authorizing an increase in the County sales and use taxes to a rate of one and onequarter percent (1.25%); and (iii) any renewals or extensions thereof, for the purpose of providing additional general revenues for the County.

"County Sales Tax Bond Fund" means the County Sales Tax Bond Fund created by the Indenture.

"County Sales Tax Receipts" means the monies received by the County from the County Sales Tax.

"County Sales Tax Revenue Fund" means the County Sales Tax Revenue Fund created by the Indenture.

*"Fiscal Officer"* means the Fiscal Officer of the County, including an interim or acting Fiscal Officer.

The County has heretofore levied and covenants that it shall continue to collect the

County Sales Tax for so long as the Series 2014 Bonds are outstanding. The County hereby covenants and agrees that, so long as the Series 2014 Bonds are outstanding, it shall not suffer the repeal, amendment or any other change in this Resolution or the County Sales Tax Resolutions that in any way materially and adversely affects or impairs (a) the sufficiency of the County Sales Tax Receipts levied and collected or otherwise available for the payment of the Series 2014 Bonds or (b) the pledge or the application of the County Sales Tax Receipts to the payment of the Series 2014 Bonds.

The Series 2014 Bonds do not constitute a general obligation debt, or a pledge of the full faith and credit, of the State, the County, or any other political subdivision of the State, and the holders or owners of the Series 2014 Bonds have no right to have taxes levied by the general assembly or property taxes levied by the taxing authority of any political subdivision of the State, including the taxing authority of the County, for the payment of principal of and interest (and any premium) on the Series 2014 Bonds. Nothing herein shall be construed as requiring the County to use or apply to the payment of principal of and interest (and any premium) on the Series 2014 Bonds any funds or revenues from any source other than County Sales Tax Receipts. Nothing herein, however, shall be deemed to prohibit the County, of its own volition, from using, to the extent that it is authorized by law to do so, any other resources for the fulfillment of any of the terms, conditions or obligations of this Resolution or of the Series 2014 Bonds.

**SECTION 5.** Federal Tax Considerations. The County has covenanted and hereby covenants that it will use, and will restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of the Series 2014 Bonds, including the proceeds of the Series 2014 Bonds used for the Demolition Projects, in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (a) the Series 2014 Bonds will not (i) constitute private activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Sections 141, 148 or 149 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") or (ii) be treated other than as bonds to which Section 103(a) of the Code applies, and (b) the interest on the Series 2014 Bonds will not be treated as an item of tax preference under Section 57 of the Code.

The County further has covenanted and hereby covenants that (a) it will take or cause to be taken such actions that may be required of it for the interest on the Series 2014 Bonds to be and remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, (b) it will not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that exclusion, and (c) it, or persons acting for it, will, among other acts of compliance, (i) apply the proceeds of the Series 2014 Bonds to the governmental purpose of the borrowing, (ii) restrict the yield on investment property, (iii) make timely and adequate payments to the federal government, (iv) maintain books and records and make calculations and reports and (v) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds, and, as applicable of property financed with such proceeds, all in such manner and to the extent necessary to assure such exclusion of that interest under the Code.

The County Executive, the Fiscal Officer or any other officer of the County having responsibility for issuance of the Series 2014 Bonds and the use of the proceeds of such Series 2014 Bonds for the purposes therein provided, is hereby authorized (a) to make or effect any election, selection, designation, choice, consent, approval, or waiver on behalf of the County with respect to the Series 2014 Bonds as the County is permitted to or required to make or give under the federal income tax laws, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting favorable tax treatment or status of the Series 2014 Bonds or interest thereon or assisting compliance with requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing the rebate amount or payments or penalties, or making payments of special amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying, excess earnings as rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by that officer, which action shall be in writing and signed by the officer, and (b) to take any and all other actions, make or obtain calculations, make payments, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the County, as may be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the intended tax status of the Series 2014 Bonds.

**SECTION 6.** <u>Certification and Delivery of Resolution</u>. The Clerk of this Council is directed to deliver or cause to be delivered a certified copy of this Resolution to the Fiscal Officer.

**SECTION 7.** <u>Captions and Headings</u>. The captions and headings in this Resolution are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof. Reference to a Section means a section of this Resolution unless otherwise indicated.

**SECTION 8.** Effective Date. It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety of the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receive the affirmative vote of at least eight members of the Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest to occur of any of the following: (a) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (b) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, and (c) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 9.** <u>Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements</u>. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were held, in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
