## 1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Jones called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m.

# 2. ROLL CALL

Mr. Jones asked Assistant Deputy Clerk Johnson to call the roll. Committee members Jones, Gallagher and Brady were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Ms. Loh addressed the Committee regarding Ordinance No. O2019-0001, an Ordinance enacting Chapter 809 and amending Section 704.01 of the Cuyahoga County Code to establish the Cuyahoga County Housing Program.
