1. CALL TO ORDER

Council President Brady called the meeting to order at 2:17 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Council President Brady asked Clerk Schmotzer to call the roll. Councilmembers Schron, Conwell, Jones, Brown, Stephens, Simon, Baker, Miller, Tuma, Gallagher and Brady were in attendance and a quorum was determined.

 - a) CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTIONS OF COUNCIL FOR FIRST READING ADOPTION UNDER SUSPENSION OF RULES

A motion was made by Mr. Gallagher, seconded by Ms. Brown and approved by unanimous vote to suspend Rules 9D and 12A and to place on final passage Resolution No. R2020-0214.

> <u>R2020-0214</u>: A Resolution providing for the appointment of Andria Richardson as Clerk of Council to serve the Council of Cuyahoga County, and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

On a motion by Mr. Brady with a second by Ms. Brown, Resolution No. R2020-0214 was considered and adopted by unanimous vote.

2) <u>R2020-0215</u>: A Resolution approving an amendment to a Collective Bargaining Agreement between Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities and Service Employees International Union, District 1199, WV/KY/OH, The Health Care and Social Services Union, representing approximately 225 employees in various classifications in Support Administration for the period 1/1/2018 - 12/31/2020 to extend the time period to 12/31/2021 and to modify Article 20B: Documentation Standard and Article 34: Wages; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

On a motion by Mr. Miller with a second by Mr. Schron, Resolution No. R2020-0217 was considered and adopted by unanimous vote.

levies and certifying them to the County Fiscal Officer; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Cuyahoga County, et al.</u>, United States District Court, Northern District of Ohio, Eastern Division, Case No. 1:19-CV-02873; authorizing the County Executive and/or his designee to execute the settlement agreement and any related documentation; authorizing the appropriation of funds for payment of settlement amounts set forth herein; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.
