

MINUTES CUYAHOGA COUNTY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, AUGUST 9, 2016 CUYAHOGA COUNTY ADMINISTRATIVE HEADQUARTERS C. ELLEN CONNALLY COUNCIL CHAMBERS – 4TH FLOOR 5:00 PM

1. CALL TO ORDER

Council President Brady called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

A motion was made by Mr. Gallagher, seconded by Mr. Germana and approved by unanimous vote to suspend Rules 9D and 12A and to place on final passage Resolution Nos. R2016-0138, R2016-0139 and R2016-0140.
