#### CALL TO ORDER

Chairwoman Conwell called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m.

### 2. ROLL CALL

Ms. Conwell asked Assistant Deputy Clerk Johnson to call the roll. Committee members Conwell, Sweeney, Turner and Miller were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Committee member Stephens was absent from the meeting.

# 3. PUBLIC COMMENT

Loh addressed the Committee regarding Ordinance No. O2020-0002, an Ordinance amending Sections 406.01 and 406.02 of the Cuyahoga County Code to clarify contents of the Whistleblower provisions.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE FEBRUARY 16, 2022 MEETING

A motion was made by Ms. Conwell, seconded by Ms. Turner and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes from the February 16, 2022 meeting.

#### 5. MATTERS REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

a) R2022-0046: A Resolution authorizing Title IV-D Agreements with various providers in the total amount not-to-exceed \$11,335,121.69 for child support services for the period 1/1/2022 – 12/31/2022; authorizing the County Executive to execute Nos. 2214, 2215, 2217 & 2218 and all

other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective:

- 1) Agreement No. 2214 with Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas/Division of Domestic Relations in the amount not-to-exceed \$3,701,642.74.
- 2) Agreement No. 2215 with Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas/Division of Juvenile Court in the amount not-to-exceed \$3,656,314.84.
- 3) Agreement No. 2216 with Cuyahoga County Prosecuting Attorney's Office in the amount not-to-exceed \$3,876,036.68.
- 4) Agreement No. 2217 with Cuyahoga County Treasurer's Office in the amount not-to-exceed \$77,980.34.
- 5) Agreement No. 2218 with Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas/Division of Juvenile Court/Cashiers Department in the amount not-to-exceed \$23,147.09.

Mr. Paul Porter, Director of the Division of Contract Administration and Performance; Ms. Tiffany Dobbins-Brazelton, Director of the Office of Child Support Services; and Mr. Richard Weiler; Fiscal Officer for the Office of Child Support Services, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2022-0046. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Mr. Porter, Ms. Dobbins-Brazelton and Mr. Weiler pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Turner with a second by Mr. Miller, Resolution No. R2022-0046 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

b) R2022-0047: A Resolution authorizing an Agreement with Cuyahoga County Prosecutor's Office in the amount not-to-exceed \$8,322,252.00 for legal services for the period 1/1/2022 – 12/31/2023; authorizing the County Executive to execute Agreement No. 2199 and all other documents consistent with this Resolution; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Mr. Porter, Mr. James Ginley, Director of Finance & Operations with the Prosecutor's Office and Ms. Karen Anderson, Deputy Director with the Division of Children and Family Services, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2022-0047. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Mr. Porter, Mr. Ginley and Ms. Anderson pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Conwell with a second by Mr. Sweeney, Resolution No. R2022-0047 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda with a recommendation for passage under second reading suspension of the rules.

# 6. MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

Mr. Sweeney advised the Committee that an Executive Order was issued by County Executive Armond Budish to lift the Covid-19 mask mandate in all County buildings.
