#### Resolution No. R2022-0222

**WHEREAS**, Cuyahoga County received \$239,898,257 from the Federal Government through the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA"); and

**WHEREAS**, Cuyahoga County calculated 100% of the ARPA dollars as loss revenue under the U.S. Department of the Treasury Final Rule; and

**WHEREAS**, since all the ARPA dollars have been calculated as loss revenue, the ARPA dollars have been deposited in the County's General Fund; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Executive and County Council have authorized \$86 million of the ARPA dollars for community grants to benefit the residents of Cuyahoga County (the "ARPA Community Grant Fund"); and

**WHEREAS**, of the \$86 million for community grants, \$66 million have been encumbered for equal distribution to each County Council District; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding from the District 1 ARPA Community Grant Fund in the amount of \$1,217,000 to the City of Rocky River for the purpose of constructing a firearms range for the Rocky River Police Department; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Rocky River estimates the total cost of the project is \$1,217,000; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Rocky River is estimating the start date of the project will begin immediately upon funding; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Rocky River requested \$1,217,000 from the District 1 ARPA Community Grant Fund to complete this project; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding in the amount of \$1,217,000 to the City of Rocky River to ensure this project is completed; and

WHEREAS, this Council by a vote of at least eight (8) members determines that it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue to provide for the usually, daily operations of the County.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** That the Cuyahoga County Council hereby awards a not-to-exceed amount of \$1,217,000 to the City of Rocky River from the General Fund made available by the American Rescue Plan Act revenue replacement provision for the purpose of constructing a firearms range for the Rocky River Police Department.

**SECTION 2.** If any specific appropriation is necessary to effectuate this agreement, the Director of the Office of Budget and Management is authorized to submit the requisite documentation to financial reporting to journalize the appropriation.

**SECTION 3.** That the County Council staff is authorized to prepare all documents to effectuate said award.

**SECTION 4.** That the County Executive is authorized to execute all necessary agreements and documents consistent with said award and this Resolution.

**SECTION 5.** If requested or necessary, the Agency of the Inspector General or Department of Internal Audit is authorized to investigate, audit, or review any part of this award.

**SECTION 6.** To the extent that any exemptions are necessary under the County Code and contracting procedures, they shall be deemed approved by the adoption of this Resolution.

**SECTION 7.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County desires to donate unneeded food items from the Cuyahoga County Commissary, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 307.12(B)(2), to eligible Ohio nonprofit organizations; and

WHEREAS, said food items have expired and have no value to the County; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Department recommends declaring said food items as surplus County-owned property, no longer needed for public use; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** Section 202.07 of the Cuyahoga County Code is hereby amended to add the following Section 202.07(E):

202.07(E): Authority to donate certain food items:

- 1. The County Sheriff is authorized to make on behalf of the County, a donation of unneeded food items from the Cuyahoga County Commissary to eligible Ohio nonprofit organizations on a continuing basis.
- 2. Once food items from the Cuyahoga County Commissary have expired and have no value to the County, they shall immediately be considered surplus County-owned property, no longer needed for public use, and able to be donated pursuant to this section.
- 3. The County Sheriff is authorized to execute all documents connected with the transfer of these food items.
- 4. Eligible Ohio nonprofit organizations that would like to receive a donation of unneeded food items shall contact the Sheriff's Office and provide the Sheriff with:

- a. evidence that the organization is a nonprofit located in Ohio,
- b. a description of the organization's primary purpose,
- c. a description of the types of food items the organization needs; and
- d. the name, address, and telephone number of a person designated by the organization's governing board to receive donated property and to serve as its agent.
- 5. The Sheriff will provide a list on its website of available items for donation and will provide donations on a first-come, first-served basis.

**SECTION 2.** It is necessary that this Ordinance become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 3.** It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
