#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Gallagher called the meeting to order at 1:06 p.m.

#### 2. ROLL CALL

Mr. Gallagher asked Deputy Clerk Carter to call the roll. Committee members Gallagher, Conwell and Tuma were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Committee members Jones and Simon entered the meeting after the roll call was taken. Councilmembers Miller and Turner were also in attendance.

#### 3. PUBLIC COMMENT

Ms. Holly Fowler Martens addressed the Committee in support of Resolution No. R2022-0397, a Resolution awarding a total sum, not to exceed \$100,000, to The Bail Project, Inc.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE NOVEMBER 1, 2022 MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Tuma, seconded by Ms. Conwell and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes from the November 1, 2022 meeting.

#### 5. MATTERS REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

a) R2022-0391: A Resolution awarding a total sum, not to exceed \$89,642.27, to the Westshore Council of Governments for the purpose of purchasing new and replacement equipment for the Westshore Technical Response Team from the District 1 and District 2 ARPA

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Community Grant Funds; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Captain Tim Draves, Captain of the City of Fairview Park Fire Department, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2022-0391. Discussion ensued.

Committee members and Councilmembers asked questions of Captain Draves pertaining to the item, which he answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Simon with a second by Mr. Tuma, Resolution No. R2022-0391 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda for second reading.

b) R2022-0397: A Resolution awarding a total sum, not to exceed \$100,000, to The Bail Project, Inc. for the purpose of hiring an additional bail disruptor from the District 11 ARPA Community Grant Fund and the General Fund made available by the American Rescue Plan Act revenue placement provision; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Mr. James Boyle, Research and Policy Analyst; Mr. Jeremy Page, Operations Manager for the The Bail Project, Inc.; and Mr. Jeremy Cherson, Senior Policy Advisor for the The Bail Project, Inc., addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2022-0397. Discussion ensued.

Committee members and Councilmembers asked questions of Messrs. Boyle, Page and Cherson pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

Mr. Gallagher introduced a proposed substitute to Resolution No. R2022-0397. Discussion ensued.

A motion was then made by Ms. Simon, seconded by Ms. Conwell and approved by unanimous vote to accept the proposed substitute.

c) <u>R2022-0412:</u> A Resolution adopting the Cuyahoga County 2022-2027 All Hazards Mitigation Plan; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

Ms. Brandy Carney, Director of Public Safety & Justice Services, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2022-0412. Discussion ensued.

WHEREAS, on December 7, 2021, the Cuyahoga County Council adopted the Biennial Operating Budget and Capital Improvements Program for 2022/2023 (Resolution No. R2021-0238) establishing the 2022/2023 biennial budget for all County departments, offices and agencies; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to adjust the Biennial Operating Budget for 2022 to reflect budgetary funding increases, funding reductions, to transfer budget appropriations and to transfer cash between budgetary funds, to accommodate the operational needs of certain County departments, offices and agencies; and

WHEREAS, it is further necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue and to provide for the usual, daily operation of County departments, offices, and agencies.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

**SECTION 1.** That the 2022/2023 Biennial Operating Budget for 2022 be amended to provide for the following additional appropriation increases and decreases:

The Office of Budget and Management on behalf of the Public Defender's Office is requesting an appropriation increase of \$300,000. Appropriations are requested to cover higher than anticipated Security Chargebacks from the Sheriff's Department, which has depleted their other expenditures budget line. The Funding source is General Fund and is reimbursable by the Ohio Public Defender at the rate of 90%.

**SECTION 4.** It is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective for the usual daily operation of the County; the preservation of public peace, health, or safety in the County; and any additional reasons set forth in the preamble. Provided that this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least eight members of Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon the earliest occurrence of any of the following: (1) its approval by the County Executive through signature, (2) the expiration of the time during which it may be disapproved by the County Executive under Section 3.10(6) of the Cuyahoga County Charter, or (3) its passage by at least eight members of Council after disapproval pursuant to Section 3.10(7) of the Cuyahoga County Charter. Otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**SECTION 5**. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
