1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairwoman Simon called the meeting to order at 3:17 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Ms. Simon asked Assistant Deputy Clerk Georgakopoulos to call the roll. Committee members Simon, Stephens and Jones were in attendance and a quorum was determined. Committee member Schron was in attendance after the roll call was taken. Committee member Conwell was absent from the meeting.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT

There were no public comments given.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE MARCH 8, 2023 MEETING

A motion was made by Ms. Stephens, seconded by Mr. Jones and approved by unanimous vote to approve the minutes from the March 8, 2023 meeting.

 - a) <u>R2023-0067</u>: A Resolution awarding a total sum, not to exceed \$250,000, to the Village of Chagrin Falls for Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements – Phase 2, from the District 6 ARPA Community Grant Fund; and declaring the necessity that this Resolution become immediately effective.

The Honorable William A. Tomko, Mayor and Mr. Robert Jamieson, Chief Administrative Officer for the Village of Chagrin Falls; and Ms. Georgia Conway, Project Engineer for CT Consultants, addressed the Committee regarding Resolution No. R2023-0067. Discussion ensued.

Committee members asked questions of Mayor Tomko, Mr. Jamieson and Ms. Conway pertaining to the item, which they answered accordingly.

On a motion by Ms. Simon with a second by Mr. Schron, Resolution No. R2023-0067 was considered and approved by unanimous vote to be referred to the full Council agenda for second reading.

WHEREAS, since all the ARPA dollars have been calculated as loss revenue, the ARPA dollars have been deposited in the County's General Fund; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive and County Council have authorized \$86 million of the ARPA dollars for community grants to benefit the residents of Cuyahoga County (the "ARPA Community Grant Fund"); and

WHEREAS, of the \$86 million for community grants, \$66 million have been encumbered for equal distribution to each County Council District; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding from the District 9 ARPA Community Grant Fund in the amount of \$10,000 to The Literacy Cooperative for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library; and

WHEREAS, The Literacy Cooperative estimates approximately 50,000 people by 2025 will be served annually through this award; and

WHEREAS, The Literacy Cooperative estimates the total cost of the project is \$630,000; and

WHEREAS, The Literacy Cooperative indicates the other funding source(s) for this project includes:

- A. \$100,000 from the Bruening Foundation;
- B. \$65,000 from the Cleveland Foundation;
- C. \$5,000 from Sherwin Williams;

D. \$10,000 from Maple Heights City Schools; and

WHEREAS, The Literacy Cooperative requested \$10,000 from the District 9 ARPA Community Grant Fund to complete this project; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding in the amount of \$10,000 to The Literacy Cooperative to ensure this project is completed; and

WHEREAS, this Council by a vote of at least eight (8) members determines that it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue to provide for the usually, daily operations of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY, OHIO:

WHEREAS, Family First Childcare estimates approximately 300 foster care youth will be served annually through this award; and

WHEREAS, Family First Childcare estimates the total cost of the project is \$45,800; and

WHEREAS, Family First Childcare indicates the other funding source(s) for this project includes \$5,000 from Corporate/Partner donations and \$800 from Charitable Type III funding; and

WHEREAS, Family First Childcare is estimating the start date of the project will begin immediately and the project will be completed within 90 days from receipt of funding; and

WHEREAS, Family First Childcare requested \$40,000 from the District 9 ARPA Community Grant Fund to complete this project; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Council desires to provide funding in the amount of \$40,000 to Family First Childcare to ensure this project is completed; and

WHEREAS, this Council by a vote of at least eight (8) members determines that it is necessary that this Resolution become immediately effective in order that critical services provided by Cuyahoga County can continue to provide for the usually, daily operations of the County.
